WELCOME TO THE COMRADES AND THE ROBINS

It's another of those double-header programmes that some people hate this week as we again play two home games inside just a few days and what a big challenge those two games are for the Woods.

Firstly, we extend a warm welcome to everyone connected with Berkhamsted FC for a Buildbase FA Trophy third qualifying round fixture. Our visitors will be looking to win two successive matches in the competition for the firstever time today while the Woods haven't achieved that feat since the 2014/15 season when we notched back-toback home wins over Waltham Abbey and then Guernsey (on penalties). To reach this stage, the Woods had another penalty shoot-out success, this time 4-3 over Isthmian South East leaders Haywards Heath Town, following a 0-0 draw on 90 minutes. Berkhamsted meanwhile were comfortable 2-0 winners away at Barton Royers. The Comrades form this season has been nothing short of superb and they are currently clear at the top of the Southern Central Division table. Former Woods goalkeeper Xavi Comas Leon, and his defence, have not conceded more than one goal in any of their fourteen games so far this season and we will need to be back to our best here at the Fenton Civil Engineering Stadium to progress today. The game, as usual nowadays, has to be played to a finish and there is no extra-time scheduled so straight to penalties should the scores be level after 90 minutes.

On Tuesday night, it's back to the Pitching In Isthmian League and the visit of much-touted title favourites Bracknell Town, who would be top of the table if their 3-0 win at Chertsey Town last Tuesday night wasn't abandoned in the closing stages. The Robins have suffered just one defeat so far this season; at home to big rivals Marlow with Burgess Hill Town the only side to beat them on their travels when they lost 2-0 in the FA Cup. We didn't meet during last season's curtailed campaign but the previous season we played both games before it was cut short. The home fixture ended in a 2-2 draw after Nathan Minhas and Dan Carr scored for the Robins to recover from two early goals from Charlie Hayford and Kweku Lucan

that had seen the Woods lead 2-0 after fifteen minutes. In the return. Bracknell notched a 2-0 victory thanks to two goals from corners, headed home by Joy Mukena and Robb Sheridan

We hope both sides enjoy their short stay with us.

Also, coming into the squad this afternoon, providing the paperwork clears in time, is young midfielder Tecane Shrowder who arrives on loan from National League Wealdstone. The 18-year-old has come through the Academy at the club and is well thought of. He had a previous loan spell at Kings Langley at Step 3 this season.

LEAGUE AND CUP NEWS

Last Saturday the club made the long trip to play in Guernsey; our first-ever overseas trip and, despite the 2-0 defeat, it was a very pleasant and well-organised day out for everyone. The home club make excellent arrangements for everything that is in their control and even though it was a very early start to catch the 8.35am plane from Gatwick, the leisurely breakfast at a nice Hotel when we got there provided excellent preparation. Sadly, the defeat meant Guernsey rose above us in the table and with Staines Town picking up a point against Marlow, the Woods did sink to the bottom of the table; something that we need to put right urgently.

On Tuesday night we took on our divisional leaders Uxbridge in the first round of the Middlesex Senior Cup, just a month after the heavy defeat we suffered against them in the League. Though it was a much-changed Uxbridge line-up, the game was a good test for both sides and thanks to a last-minute equaliser, we forced a penalty shoot-out and progressed by a 3-2 margin when CJ Fearn rolled in the final kick of the ten taken. Daniel Purdue had







earlier saved two of Uxbridge's kicks to swing it Northwood's way. We now take on Combined Counties League side Wembley in the Second Round on Tuesday 9th November so it's coming up very soon. Wembley beat CB Hounslow 5-0 in the First Bound

Northwood's first overseas match proved to be a fruitless one on the pitch as they returned home from Guernsey empty handed on another disappointing afternoon for Ben Murray and his charges.

Woods made the flight to the Channel Islands without the services of injured duo Matt Ayres and Ismael Ehui; Matteo Esposito and debutant striker Melos Ajvazi their replacements, while there was a return to the midfield for Declan Nche in place of CJ Fearn.

The hosts went straight at Northwood from the start as they found plenty of space down both flanks with keeper Daniel Purdue doing well to deflect Kieran Mahon's shot onto the upright after the dangerous Matt Loaring had created the opening.

Having been on the backfoot up to then, Woods managed to force a corner and a short routine gave Leo Decabo a great opportunity, but his weak shot was comfortably gathered by Josh Addison in the Guernsey goal.

The Green Lions were soon back on the attack with Northwood looking decidedly off the pace, Purdue keeping out a cross-shot



from Frank Tobin before Woods' stopper pulled of a smart reaction save to tip Loaring's firmly struck effort over the crossbar

Northwood did manage to break the shackles with a swift move from the back. Giovanni Palmer feeding Nche whose low shot cleared the far post. And after Guernsev had gone

close with Ross Allen's snapshot narrowly clearing the crossbar, Woods threatened again as a well constructed move ended with Shakeel Morris teeing up Nche, but his near post shot was well kept out by Addison.

However, Guernsey went close to taking the lead as Tom Strawbridge's close-range header fell into the grateful arms of Purdue. But the Green Lions kept the foot on the gas and they were finally rewarded in the 37th minute as Charlton Gauvain sent a looping shot over Purdue from 25 yards after latching onto a delightful through-ball from Loaring.

Northwood began the second half with a revised formation. switching to a more adventurous 4-3-3 with Morris and Palmer either side of Ajvazi and Cash moving to the right back slot while Pablo Velasco switched to left back. However, the Woods were almost caught napping from the kick-off as Allen got the better of Cash before squaring to Mahon who skied his shot from 15 yards.

Having breathed a sigh of relief, Woods began to play with more attacking purpose and good work from Palmer down their right flank saw the latter find Morris but he shot wide when off balance. And Morris was to the fore once again as he found space on the edge of the box, but his shot was blocked by the home defence.

But just as Northwood were beginning to build some momentum, they were stopped in their stride as they conceded a second goal on 61 minutes in controversial circumstances - the referee waving away appeals for what looked a clear push on defender Ryan Avery as he looked to shepherd the ball to safety, affording Gauvain the freedom of the Bailiwick to square the ball to the unmarked Allen who swept the ball home.

Having expressed their frustrations to the match officials with Avery and manager Murray being cautioned for their troubles, Woods needed a swift response if they were to get anything out of the match. And Northwood had an opportunity as Esposito swung in a free kick which found the head of Nche. but his effort lacked direction.

Northwood substitutes Joakim Ehui and Mo Sahnoun were both introduced for their first action for several weeks with Palmer and Decabo making way as the visitors continued in search of the elusive goal. And Woods went close on a couple of occasions in the last few minutes, Morris forcing a corner after being picked out by Velasco's far post cross while Ajvazi sent a back header into the arms of Addison following Cash's long throw into the box.

Northwood were unable to find a way through and were grateful to Purdue who saved with his legs from Robbie Legg to deny the Green Lions a third goal, but a sixth consecutive league defeat meant Northwood replaced the hosts at the foot of the table


The home team were missing several key players, but still put on a five-star performance. Good runs down the flanks by Dave Nolan and Gavin Hart put pressure on the visitors in the opening stages, and Nicky Webb in goal did well to cut out another cross from Lawrence Yaku.

The visitors also played some attractive football, but they found the home defence in great form. An excellent ball from Yaku to Gell saw the Northwood skipper race 30 yards and cross to the far post, but Scott Fitzgerald could not find a finish the move deserved.


Hart, who had a solid game, then robbed a defender, but his pass to Yaku was intercepted by Paul Lowe. The hosts looked the more likely to score; Scott Fitzgerald, who ran his socks off all game, rounded a defender, but his finishing again did not match the quality of the move.

It was Fitzgerald who had the best chance of the half just before the break when he beat the offside trap, but the keeper forced him wide and his shot was cleared off the line by defender Andy Mullins.



WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS...

BERKHAMSTED FC

The club was formed in 2009 and appointed experienced manager Micky Vipond who had been successful with Leverstock Green, Tring Athletic and Hemel Hempstead Town (where he had a long playing career).

The club won the Molten Spartan South Midlands League Division 2 title in its first season, losing only once each at home and away. Winning division 2 by 9 points led to promotion to division 1.

The team were again champions in 2010-11, this time by 15 points and were unbeaten at home in the league.

This earned a second successive promotion and movement up to the Premier division, where the club stayed for 6 years.

The total of 107 points was the highest in the season for any club in the non-league pyramid, prompting the Herts. FA to award the club the prestigious Sir Stanley Rous Memorial Trophy.

It is named after a former local referee and administrator who rose all the way from West Herts, football to the top job at FIFA.

The team won promotion to the Southern League under Steve Bateman by finishing as Premier division runners up in 2018.

The club were leading the division when it was abandoned due to a pandemic and the next season was curtailed much earlier.

Being deprived of conventional promotion, the joint management team of Steve Bateman and Lee Bircham chose to move up two divisions by taking over the hot seat at Hemel Hempstead Town and took a couple of players with them.

The club made its FA Cup debut in 2011 with an away win over Crawley Green, followed by a trip to Clarence Park, but the game with St Albans City was goalless, then exiting at Broadwater in the replay.

In 2012 they played 5 FA Cup matches but went out to Metropolitan Police in the 2nd qualifying round of the FA Cup, having knocked out Hoddesdon Town (after a replay), Hadley and Uxbridge.

2013 brought home wins over AFC Dunstable and Harefield United, but defeat at Daventry Town.

In 2014 Ashford Town eliminated the club in the first match and in 2015 the Comrades won against Hanworth Villa but went out to Barton Rovers.

In 2016 Berko went out to Cogenhoe United before the league season had started.

In 2017 they overcame Crawley Green but went out 4-1 at home to Slough Town in front of 366 fans-the best yet at home.

2018 saw wins at Tring Athletic and Thame United but defeat to Coggeshall Town in a home replay-we meet them again in this season's competition.

2019 produced a win at Wembley (Vale Farm!) followed by a narrow controversial defeat at step 3 St Ives Town.

Last season we lost at Cribbs, near Bristol. This season we got revenge over Coggeshall Town but again went down to a step 5 side Walthamstow.

The 2018 debut in the FA Trophy brought a 5-1 win over South Park but defeat at Chipstead. 2019 produced a 5-0 win at home to Herne Bay but defeat at step 3 side Hornchurch 3-1.

Last season we knocked out Chertsey Town but went out to Marlow in what proved to be our final game before the season was abandoned due to the pandemic.

In 2016 Berkhamsted reached the last 16 of the FA Vase, going out 2-1 at home to the eventual winners Morpeth Town. They got there with six wins, earning the club the Houghton Regis Trophy.

In 2019 the club reached the quarter final of the Southern League Cup going out 1-0 after a long midweek trip to Lowestoft Town.

Berko have reached cup finals in each of the last eight seasons. Last season's Herts. Charity Cup final with Hemel Hempstead was not played due to the virus, with the sides being declared joint winners.

The previous season Berko won the St Marys Cup with a 1-0 win over Oxhey Jets but lost the Herts. Charity Shield final 1-0 to Colney Heath.

The previous year they lost the St Marys Cup final to Leverstock Green. In 2016 they beat Tring Athletic 3-2 in the Herts. Charity Shield final.

They won their first cup in 2013 by also beating Tring Athletic at home in the St Marys Cup final.

In 2015 they landed the Premier Division Cup, beating Colney Heath after a penalty shoot-out in the final.

The sides met in a Diadora League Division Three fixture on 2nd January 1993. It was the Woods' first season in the Isthmian League, and Bracknell's first game at Northwood.

Two-goal Tim Vincent was the Northwood hero in this seven-goal Diadora League clash that kept the fans entertained.

But Woods manager Alan Merison was far from happy that his side, which lead 2-0 and 3-1, allowed Bracknell to battle back to level at 3-3.

Even before the fight-back, however, Woods goalkeeper Ken Lavender had to come to his side's rescue a couple of times, and Rob Holland cleared off the line.

Frank Omere tested visiting goalkeeper Mark Hyde early on before Woods opened the scoring in the 20th minute

when Danny Buckley and Omere created a chance for Paul Rogan to crash the ball home from 25 yards.

Then David Nolan started and finished the move that saw Woods go 2-0 up after 33 minutes. Nolan ran at the defence, crossed and when Buckley the ball evaded a challenge and put the ball back into the middle, Nolan was on the spot to head home a great goal.

Shortly after half time Justin Day pulled a goal back after Northwood had given the ball away in attack, and the Woods then suffered another setback when striker Vic Schwartz had to go off with an injury.

But Schwartz's replacement, Peter Augustine, was soon in the thick of things as he played a superb ball to Buckley, whose low cross was cracked home by Vincent.

What should have been a winning margin disappeared, however, after the Woods defence gifted Steve Nebbett two goals on 71 and 72 minutes to make it 3-3.

But Omere put in a fine run and cross and Vincent dived full length to head home the winner. Even then, though,






WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS... **BRACKNELL TOWN FC**

Bracknell Town Football Club was formed in 1896 as Old Bracknell Wanderers and changed its name to Bracknell FC in 1949.

The club played in the local leagues until joining the Great Western league. After four seasons in this league and renaming the club Bracknell Town in 1962 the club was elected to the Surrey Senior League. which they won in the 1969/70 season.

The club also won the league cup in 1968/69 and 1969/70. After this success, the club entered the Spartan League (later re-named the London Spartan League) and finished runners up on goal average in 1975/76, in which they also reach the fifth round of the FA Vase

After winning the league in 1982/83, they were promoted in 1984 to the Isthmian League Division Two South.

They were promoted to Division One as runners-up in 1985/86, finishing third in their highest ever league placing.

However, in 1988/89, Bracknell Town were relegated and following a re-organisation of the Isthmian League were placed in Division Three in 19991/92.

They returned to Division Two after winning the league in 1993/94, but after five seasons were relegated back down to Division Three.

Further league re-organisation in 2002/03 the club was moved into the Isthmian League Division Two South. but moved to the Southern Football League Division One West after two season. Bracknell were reprieved from relegation in 2008/09 but were relegated the following season to the Hellenic League Premier Division.

The downward trend continued and after just two seasons Hellenic League Premier Division they were relegated to Hellenic League Division One East.

The Club returned to the Premier Division after just one season in Division One and although flirting with relegation recovered to finish just below halfway.

At the start of the 2016/17 season under the guidance of new chairman Kayne Steinborn-Busse the club embarked on a major re-development of the ground with the installation of a state-of-the-art 3G pitch, changing facilities and club house and in keeping with this total modernisation re-branded the clubs logo.

The reaped major benefits from this work with all teams down to the youngest age group now able to play and train at Larges Lane.

For the senior club, the reserve team returned to the Suburban League whilst the first team had their most successful season for a very long time.

Under the management of Mark Tallentire, we were involved in the Hellenic Premier Division title and promotion back to the Southern League, which went down to the final day. Unfortunately we lost on the day and finished runners-up, however the disappointment was tempered by winning three cups, the Berks and Bucks Senior Trophy, the Hellenic League Challenge Cup and the Reading Senior Cup where the final was played at Reading FC's Madejeski stadium.

In 2017/2018 season we had a titanic battle with Thatcham Town for the top slot, both teams accumulating 98 points for the season with Thatcham Town's superior goal difference of 104 goals securing the title by a mere 2 goals.

However, due to a restructure of the leagues our efforts were rewarded with promotion to Step 4 in to the Bostik South Central League.

We also managed to get our own back by beating Thatcham in the final of the Bluefin Sport Challenge Cup to add another trophy to our collection.

The 2018/19 season was our first venture into Step 4

for many years and once again we came close, finishing second behind Hayes & Yeading and missing out on promotion by losing the play-off final to Cheshunt. We reached the semi-final of the Velocity Trophy with impressive victories against sides higher up the footballing pyramid.

We started the 2019/2020 season with a new stronger ambition and a number of new faces in the squad. It took slightly longer than planned to get things to gel and we needed to make a few changes to the set up.

We are grateful to Mark Tallentire who stepped in as manager until we found an ideal replacement.

In December 2019 we had the pleasure to announce the hugely experienced Bobby Wilkinson as permanent manager.

Bobby wasted no time in building a very strong back room team and together they will hopefully rebuild on the platform that we started in 2016/17 and push the club forward to greater things in the coming seasons.
