

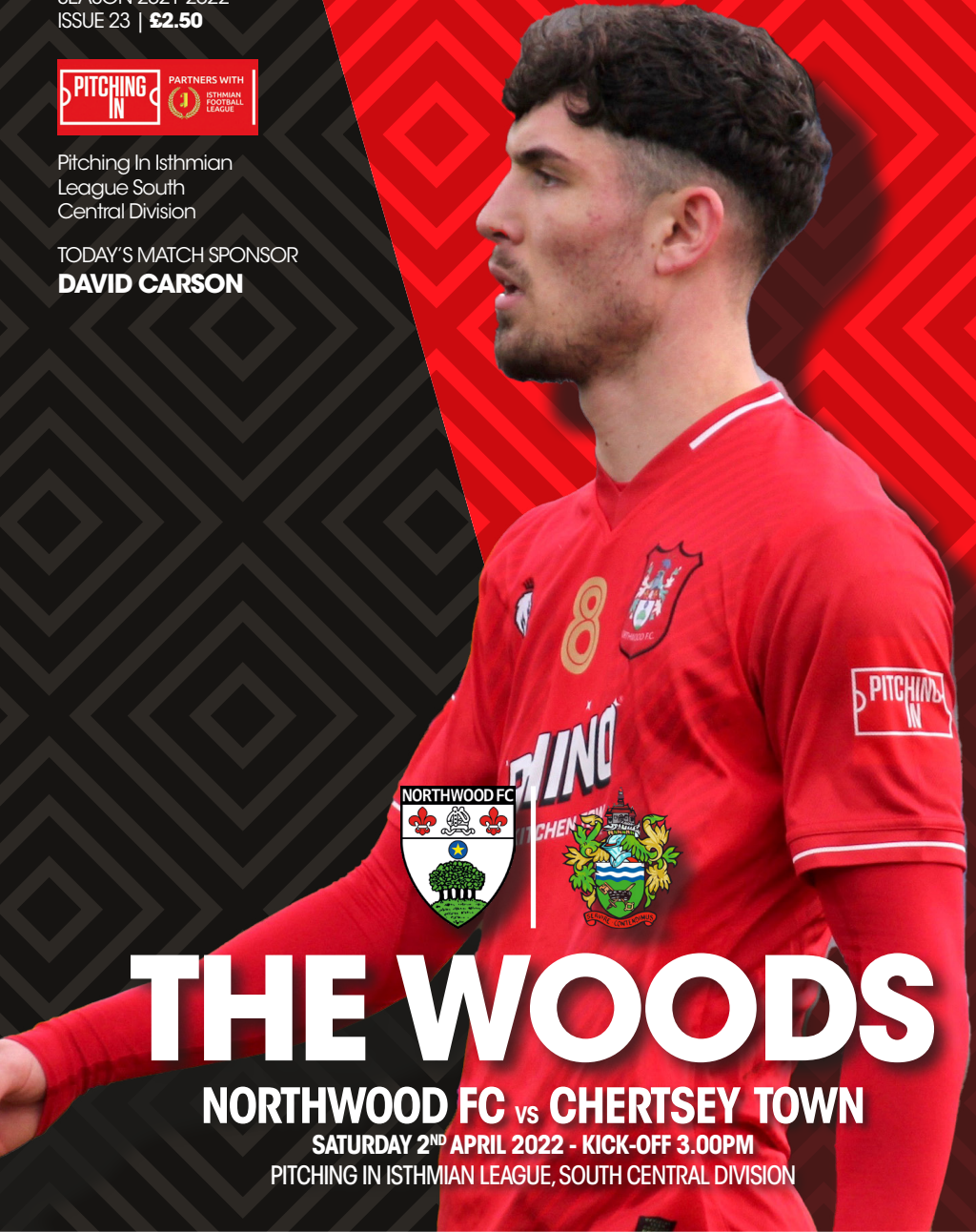

Welcome to the Curfews

A warm welcome back to the Fenton Civil Engineering Stadium for today's Pitching In Isthmian League game against Chertsey Town FC and we hope they enjoy their stay with us this afternoon.

We also welcome our Match Sponsor David Carson and his guests plus his sons Sam and James who are Mascots for the day!

The Curfews are enjoying a superb campaign and while long-time leaders Bracknell Town have already been crowned Champions, it is Chertsey Town who are currently in pole position for home advantages in the end of season play-offs. Having said that, it remains very tight in those top positions and our visitors will not want to slip up this afternoon.

Our opponents remain unbeaten away from home having won eleven and drawn four of their fifteen league matches played so far this season. In fact, their only loss on their travels at any stage this season came in the fourth and final qualifying round of the FA Cup when they went down 4-1 at National League Southend United. Actually, their brilliant run of away form in the League stretches all the way back to 4th January 2020 when they were last beaten – a 2-0 loss at Ware – now well over two years!

It is surprisingly only at home that Chertsey have struggled a little bit and their five home defeats have mainly come since the Woods notched three points at Alwyns Lane back in early December when we recorded a 4-2 win which earned the club a "Performance of the Month" award. On that occasion, goals from Micah Jackson and Ryan Young put us 2-0 up before the home side hit back with Manolis Gogonas and Jake Baxter levelling things up on 66 minutes. At that stage it looked like the Curfews might snatch victory but two excellent strikes from Sydney Ibie secure all three points for the Woods. That was the second in a sequence of seven successive away league wins notched up by Northwood and since the turn of the year, we have added to that by being unbeaten in the League here at the Fenton Civil Engineering Stadium; though admittedly with a few too many drawn games. It all sets us up for an interesting fixture this afternoon.

Our visitors have done really well to manage a forced change in management midway through this season too following the resignation and departure of Kevin MacLaren and the arrival of new boss Ian Selley who had previously been involved in a coaching role at the club.

Chertsey's last visit here to Northwood Park was back in October 2020, a couple of weeks before the season was curtailed, and saw

the Curfews notch a comfortable 3-1 victory. Siju Odelusi had put the Woods in front but Jake Baxter levelled before the break and then goals from Magnus Abisogun and Casey MacLaren secured the three points.

League and Cup News

Our last two games have seen the Woods unbeaten following a 1-1 draw against in-form Chipstead with a 2-1 success at Ashford Town (Middlesex) last weekend.

Keagan Cole put us in front against the Chips from the penalty-spot but we failed to take other early chances and then gifted our opponents an equaliser before half-time. The second-half was scrappier and by the end a draw was a fair result on the day.

At Ashford, on a lovely sunny afternoon, we started very much on the front foot and a Sydney Ibie strike put us ahead in just the fourth minute. We continued to dominate and this time took full advantage when Josh Helmore got on the end of an Ibie cross to notch his first goal in five weeks, a mini-drought after the prolific start to his Woods career. The second-half saw the home side press forward more and they pulled a goal back after 57 minutes that made it a more nervous final half an hour for the Woods support but the side stayed solid and held on fairly comfortably.

After today's game, we have just one more home league game to play and that is next Saturday when we entertain struggling Westfield under former Woods manager Simon Lane. We then finish with Saturday away games against the bottom two – firstly at Chalfont St Peter and then at Staines Town. It would be great to see many of you at these last two matches before the summer break.

We do still have our Middlesex Charity Cup semi-final fixture to play but, at the time of writing, the draw still hasn't been made. Uxbridge have made it to the semi-finals as well and the tie between North Greenford United and Hanwell was due to be played on Tuesday night. On Wednesday evening Southall were playing Hampton & Richmond Borough in the Second Round (a day after playing a League game) and the winners of that still need to travel to Bedford & Feltham in the semis. Hopefully we will have news of our semi-final fixture before next Saturday's programme.

Player News

Two new faces have joined the Woods squad recently and both made their debuts in the away game at Ashford Town (Middx) last weekend. Jesse Boateng is a young defender who played for Uxbridge

earlier this season but spent his youth career at Crystal Palace and Aldershot Town. Riccardo Alexander-Greenaway has signed on a dual-registration basis from Southern Premier side Hendon and generally plays in the central midfield role. He was at Hendon as an Under-23 and then spent two seasons with Chalfont St Peter, winning their Player of the Year award in 2020, before returning to Hendon for the current campaign. He also had a short spell with Barking earlier in the season and we welcome both players to the club.

Montel Joseph, who hasn't figured for the first-team for quite some time was transferred to play-off seeking Bedfont Sports on deadline day, though they also signed one-time Woods keeper Andrew McCorkell from Chalfont St Peter on the same day and it was he who played for them last Saturday in their crucial win at Basingstoke Town.

The main reason for recruiting two new players last week was due to injuries which will possibly rule out both Sam Jenkins (hamstring) and Teddy Stacey (sprained ankle) for the rest of the season. Add to that we had to say farewell to Alex More after our game against Chipstead after he was posted overseas by the RAF where he was stationed at Northolt. Alex made a great impact both on the pitch and in the dressing-room while he was with us and we hope he may return some time in the future but we wish him well in his new country! Tommy Boxer has also missed the last couple of games with a suspected hernia; he was due for a consultation this week and we await the results of that.

Ex-Woods Annual Reunion

We are hoping there will be plenty of old faces around the bar and in the ground this afternoon as we've invited a whole host of former Northwood players down to the game for a social get-together and to watch the match against Chertsey. Please come into the club after the game and enjoy a chat and some reminiscing of the "good old days" with some good people.

County Cup Finals

The Club is honoured to be staging two Middlesex Cup Finals in April. Firstly, tomorrow, on Sunday 3rd April 2022 we host the Sunday Junior Cup Final between Ivy Leaf Reserves and Enfield United while the following week on Sunday 10th April, it's the Sunday Intermediate Cup Final which sees Ashford Town (Middx) Sunday play Highgate Albion Reserves. Both games kick-off at 11am should you be interested in popping along.

Player of the Year voting

As it's possibly our final home game of the season next Saturday against Westfield, we plan to have the voting forms for the Supporters' Player of the Year inside the programmes (or from me) so that you can

cast your vote and make it count. The ballot box will be on the end of the bar throughout the afternoon so please make sure you make your choice. It's not quite finalised as yet but we are aiming to have the Annual Presentation Evening on Sunday 1st May here at the clubhouse. Prior to this there is likely to be a five-a-side tournament in the stadium involving players from the squad and raising funds for a charity but we will have more details on that in next week's programme.

Youth News

The full story is covered on their own page elsewhere in today's programme but surprisingly we have been reinstated into the Middlesex Senior Youth Cup and will take on Pro-Football UK Development AFC Hayes this coming Thursday night, 7th April in the semi-final. Kick-Off is at 7.45pm and I'm sure the lads would appreciate your support. Any final would be in May. The side then have just one more League game to play and that is scheduled for the following Thursday, 14th April 2022 when they take on Ashford Town (Middx).

In our younger age groups, we have two Middlesex County Cup Finals to watch in May after success for our Under-15s Elite and Under-13s Black sides. The older group defeated Ruislip Rangers to reach their final where they meet Isleworthians Youth on Sunday 22nd May 2022 at the County's Headquarters Rectory Park at 10.30am. Meanwhile the younger group beat FC Starz 3-1 and will now play Total Futbol, also at Rectory Park two weeks earlier on Sunday 8th May 2022 at 12 Noon. Well done to both sides and the very best of luck in the Finals. Do try to get along to these Cup Finals to show your support for our up-and-coming stars.

Northwood returned to winning ways as they dug deep to overcome Ashford Town in the glorious spring sunshine at the Robert Parker Stadium.

The Woods gave a debut to midweek signing Riccardo Alexander-Greenaway who replaced Matt Surmon in midfield while Kristian Belousas made way for Kyal Williams in the right sided attacking role. There was also a return to the defence for James Gurteen with Teddy Stacey missing out due to the ankle injury he suffered against Chipstead.

On a dry bumpy surface, Northwood were quickly into their stride forcing an early corner. Although the Tangerines were able to clear the early danger, the opening goal wasn't long in coming as Sydney Ibie capitalised on a lapse in the home defence to fire in a shot from the edge of the box which took a slight deflection off Ben Geraghty before nestling inside the far upright, giving Woods the lead with four minutes on the clock.

Ashford looked to respond with Kain Adom seeing his shot on the turn gathered by Daniel Purdue before Wayne Ridgley tried his luck from distance with an effort which failed to trouble the Northwood keeper.

The Woods weren't far away from extending their lead as Gurteen's ball from the back found Williams whose curling shot flew narrowly wide of the far post. And Northwood continued to threaten as Alexander-Greenaway saw his hooked shot deflect for a corner before Keagan Cole's near post flick from an Andy Lomas corner caused a scramble in the Tangerines defence with

Josh Helmore having his shot charged down.

Ashford offered a threat on the break through the lively Ethan Hellyer but he was denied by a timely interception from the covering Carl Stewart before the hosts had a handball appeal against Gurteen turned down as the Woods defender looked to clear a hanging cross into the box.

Having survived the penalty shout, Northwood extended their lead as Josh Helmore broke his mini goal drought - Luke Tingey's throw into the box finding its way back to him before sending a cross to the farpost which was put back into the danger by Ibie; Helmore gleefully lashing the ball home on 25 minutes.

Woods looked to put the game beyond Ashford before the half-time break and they went close as Helmore sent Ibie on his way, breaking clear before dragging his shot across the face of goal.

However, the first period ended with Northwood successfully negotiating a couple of Ashford corners, their first of the afternoon arriving after 38 minutes, a weak Daniel Brown header from a subsequent attack failing to trouble Purdue.

Playing into the fresh breeze in the second-half, Northwood might have anticipated more of a test after the break. But Woods contributed to their own downfall when they let the hosts back into the game on 57 minutes as they failed to clear their lines with Brown's shot being parried by Purdue and into the path of Hellyer who swept the ball home.

Encouraged by the goal, Ashford appeared to move up a couple of gears as Hellyer threatened again with his shot being touched onto the post by Purdue before being scrambled clear.

The Tangerines maintained their improved second-half showing with Woods struggling to win any quality possession, Alex Duffy not far away with a free-kick for the hosts.

Northwood continued to stand firm and looked to counter when they could, Ibie creating an opportunity with a surging run down the left channel which ended with a snapshot from an acute angle which was parried by Ashford keeper Alfie McNally.

Woods made a couple of substitutions, Gurteen feeling his

recent neck injury and making way for debutant Jesse Boateng before former Tangerine Matt Surmon was introduced for Ibie as Northwood looked to shore up the middle of the park.

With the contest moving into the final ten minutes, Ashford appeared to be running out of ideas on how to break down the resolute Northwood rearguard and it was the visitors who went close to increasing their lead as a short corner routine ended with Cole firing wide.

With the clock ticking down, Will Robinson replaced Williams

in attack and the young striker made an immediate impression as he was cynically scythed down by Dale Burnham who would have been relieved to only receive a yellow card.

But Northwood had done enough as the referee called time on proceedings allowing them to celebrate their first league win in five games and setting them up nicely for the visit of Chertsey Town and the opportunity to achieve the double over the play-off hopefuls.

Ronnie Dodd hit an upright before Dave Horsford (pictured) put

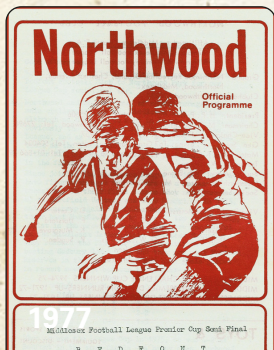
Northwood into the lead. Horsford's fine left foot drive made it two and Peter Millward followed up with the third.

Pat Roche came on as substitute and scored with his third touch of the ball, before Barry Gould completed the rout with his tenth penalty of the season.

1977

Middlesex League Cup semi-final

Northwood 3 Bedfont 1



The Woods reached the final of the Middlesex League Cup when they overcame a powerful Bedfont outfit. Their visitors arrived as Middlesex Intermediate Cup finalists and with the side having dropped the fewest league points in the season to that time. And after just 20 minutes of

Northwood at their best they had been reduced to also-rans!

In front of a large crowd, Northwood attacked from the start, and the visitors were unable to settle. Their back four were never allowed an inch of room as the Woods' foraging forwards tore into them.

After 15 minutes wearing down the visitors Northwood struck in style. A promising attack, stimulated by Ian Harvey, broke down and a defender tried a back pass that in normal circumstances would have been successful. But Martin Ellis was alive to the situation, and before anyone had time to think he had collected the ball and crashed it home from the acutest of angles.

Then within a minute Northwood were two goals in front. Roger Livingstone received the ball on the wing and sent his defender one way and then the other before hitting over a low cross. Garry Cooper came racing in and met the ball with a firm volley that hit the net before the Bedfont keeper could move.

The Woods were now right in the mood and Bedfont were reeling. Goals in the 15th and 16th minutes had created havoc with the visitors, and three minutes later the game was virtually over.

Robin Tidd, who had been working well in midfield, found space for himself on the wing. He beat two players in a fine run, reached the goal line and went past another defender before sending over an inch-perfect cross that Livingstone met with an accurate header that flew into the net. By half-time Northwood could easily have been five or six in front, and yet it was Bedfont who had scored. Keeper Les Currell punched out a deep cross to beyond the box, but before he could recover Stone had buried the ball in the net with a superb cross shot.

Bedfont were awarded a penalty with 10 minutes to go, but Currell made a spectacular save to send the visitors away empty-handed, and the Woods into a final that their team work deserved and the five minute goals flurry made certain of.

From then on, it was an uphill struggle for Woods, but Martin Randall (pictured) raised hopes for a second half revival when he scored a fine solo goal just before the interval.

It was not to be, however, as Hornchurch sat back on their lead and Woods lacked ideas on how to get through, being restricted to long range efforts.

It was a frenzied opening, with both sides playing neat passing football on a sunny afternoon at Chestnut Avenue; it was 21st v 17th, with Soham also by no means safe. And it was Soham's dangerous Rob Foster who opened the scoring on 17 minutes, when he was able to tap into an empty net.

With the relegation battle hotting up, the next goal would be pivotal. And it was Northwood who looked most likely to score it, Rob Ursell, returning to Northwood after a previous spell was dangerous all afternoon, and he was involved in the equaliser. The ball was bobbling around by the goalmouth and Soham failed to clear, and Scott Orphanou was on hand to steer the ball into corner of the goal past Dan Bircham to level up at 1-1 on 35 minutes.

Substitute Aaron Lansiquot looked lively, his pace unquestionably a major asset for Northwood, and when Rob Ursell flicked a ball over the top, Lansiquot squeezed the ball in between the post and through the goalkeeper to turn the game around: 2-1 to Northwood, but there was still a whole 26 minutes to play.

Northwood should have extended their lead when first Orphanou – who again cut across his shot – was unable to convert, and then Lansiquot shot straight at Bircham after being put through one on one. The final whistle was a relief for Northwood, who had won only one of the previous 13 games, but the three points were just what Meakin (pictured) wanted!

A BRIEF HISTORY OF TODAY'S OPPONENTS

Organised football was evident in Chertsey well into the Victorian era, but county affiliation did not take place immediately.

The official founding of the club took place in 1890 when matches were played in the West Surrey League.

The first success came in 1897 when the Surrey Junior Cup was secured.

A one year gap took place before football resumed in the same competition which eventually became the East and West Surrey League.

A further halt in football took place during the Great War but soon after, in 1919, the club joined the Surrey Intermediate League where it stayed, uneventfully, until 1939 and a further break.

An invitation to become founder members of the Surrey Senior League was not taken up in 1923 but membership was later assumed, on attaining senior status in 1946.

The club has played at various locations within the parish (Willow Walk, Free Prae Road Staines Lane and Chilsey Green) before settling down at the present home in 1926.

The suffix 'Town' was added to its title some 24 years later.

The ground was donated by Sir Edward Stern as a football ground to the 'premier club in the parish'.

Next door, a similar trust provides facilities for Chertsey Cricket Club.

The main stand was constructed in the mid fifties; the original clubhouse added in 1960 and the first covered enclosure was built some three years later. Cover behind each goal was added in 1994 and 2010 respectively.

Although Chertsey gained membership of the Surrey Senior League immediately after the second world war, it was not until the 1959/60 season that success came with the league championship.

This was repeated twice in the next three years, a halcyon period when the League Cup was also won on three occasions. Due to the static nature of amateur football in those days, the club could not progress to the preferred Corinthian League so, in 1963, it was controversially decided to turn professional and enter the Metropolitan League.

Although an entertaining three years were then enjoyed, the cost was too much to bear and a return to the lower levels of the Greater London League for one season occurred before a further shift to the Spartan League was made in 1967.

Indifferent results then dogged the club for almost two decades.

This situation was briefly relieved in 1974/75 when the club

were league and league cup runners up to an up an coming Farnborough Town.

Meanwhile, the fabric of the club was being built up behind the scenes and despite lack of prominence on the park, movement was made via the London Spartan (1975/76) and Athenian leagues through to the Isthmian family with a place in Division Two South in 1984.

Instant relegation to the Combined Counties League was suffered but a rejuvenated side won promotion back to Isthmian ranks within the year whilst winning the League Cup on the way.

The club was rewarded with good league positions but further promotion denied at first.

The worst season after returning to the Isthmians came when the two Division Twos were split in 1991 and a place in the new Division Three had to suffice.

This position was quickly rectified with a runner's up slot the next season.

The club also reached the quarter finals of the F.A. Vase, emulating a similar performance in 1987/88.

One year later, 102 points and a runner's up promotion place to Division One was nailed.

The League Cup was also secured together with the Carlsberg Trophy in the same campaign along with the League Charity Shield and the Isthmian 'Team of the Season' trophy.

Only one campaign was required in Division One before further promotion, to the Premier Division.

The first season at that level was one of consolidation but the second was more difficult. A late rally was experienced, but was insufficient to avoid the drop to Division One.

Two subsequent Division One campaigns were comfortable but the third proved too difficult after a very poor first half of the season.

Relatively respectable positions were attained for the next two seasons and then a return to Division One, taking a place in the revised south section in the Isthmian re-organisation.

The side was not able to compete at this level and relegation to Division Two was suffered in 2003.

With the dissolution of the division, the club was allocated to Combined Counties League in 2006. Promotionally hopeful situations were created regularly over the five terms in that competition.

Finishing as runners up in 2011 was enough to secure promotion to Division One Central of the Southern League. Unspectacular, but safe, performances were achieved for two seasons but relegation

was suffered in 2014, and with it a return to the Combined Counties League where four modest seasons prevailed.

A massive change occurred in the 2018/19 season that resulted in the league championship being secured with 13 points to spare.

This led to promotion back to the Isthmian ranks and a place in the South Central Division.

However, more memorable, was winning the FA Vase after turning over the score in the final to beat Cray Valley 3-1. The combination of these two feats has made the 2018/19 the most successful season ever for the club.

Dave Anderson was the team manager who masterminded

this success but stood down at the end of the campaign.

Team captain Kevin Maclaren then took charge but now Ian Selley is team boss.

The chairman's role is held Mark Turner.

The club, a Charter Standard member, also has a comprehensive junior section of boys at all ages.

Chertsey Town's nickname, the 'Curfews' is derived from a locally famous bell that hangs in the nearby St. Peters Church.

The bell has rung out the evening curfew, now ceremoniously of course, for over five hundred years.

Andy Crossley (28)

A wide attacker who rejoined at the start of the 2018/19 season after a short spell at Westfield. Made his Chertsey Town first team debut in August 2009 as a 16 year old. Re-signed in November 2014 after playing at Farnborough, Egham Town and Godalming Town. Has now made well over 300 appearances for the club.

Scott Day (33)

Signed in the 2019 close season for the defence. Although one year was spent at Farnborough, the previous seven seasons had been with Whyteleafe

Ethan Etukudo (19)

A real find from the 2020/21 season's Under 18 side, but then began to break into the first team towards the end of that season. Plays in an attacking role.

Lewis Gallifent (22)

A goalkeeper who joined in March 2018 and was previously with Hampton & Richmond Borough's youth team. Firmly established in the squad but education constraints stop games on a regular basis.

Jay Gasson (36)

Signed in September 2021 to strengthen the squad in central defence. Has had long spells at Basingstoke Town, Woking, and more recently Walton Casuals. Other appearances have been made in his substantial career at other Step 2 and 3 clubs.

Mano Gogonas (25)

First club in England was Windsor & Eton, having played to a high standard in Greece. Subsequently played for Kingstonian and last season with Walton Casuals. Plays primarily in defence. Signed in the 2021 close season.

Tony Halsey (25)

A striker who joined in the past close season from Horley Town. Has also been with Lewes and Farnborough.

Darryl Harrison (24)

Central defender who was signed in the 2021 close season from Ashford Town. Has also played for Barton Rovers.

Sam Hurrell (33)

A midfield signing in October 2019 from Cobham. Started with the Chelsea youth set up where he won the first 'Football Icon' on television but then moved on in 2007 to a number of clubs including St Albans City and Welling United. Was also joint manager at Hillingdon Borough for a spell.

Lewis Jackson (28)

A 2018 close season signing from Cobham. Plays centrally in the midfield or more usually at fullback. Has since been a full regular and will break a century of appearance with the club this term.

Nick Jupp (31)

A goalkeeper signed at the start of the 2019/20 season after what had turned into a temporary retirement having played regularly for Harrow Borough. Has also been with Shepsted Dynamo, Aldershot Town, Barnet and St Albans City. Is the current club's committee as their player of the year.

Joined to appear in the midfield in January 2020 from Staines Town where previously he had won the Player

Of The Season award on four occasions. Between times he had played for Egham Town, Ashford Town and Hayes & Yeading.

Sam Murphy (32)

Played 184 times for Hendon from where he came in the 2018 close season. Played previously at Edgware Town and Aldershot Town. Was part of Cambridge United's Academy for many years. Plays in the midfield.

Quincy Rowe (33)

The Woods extended their unbeaten home record in the league in 2022 as they shared the points with Chipstead in this mid-table clash at the Fenton Civil Engineering Stadium.

There were a number of changes to the Northwood line up as they looked to bounce back from the disappointing performance at South Park.

Goalkeeper Daniel Purdue made a return between the sticks in place of the injured Dan Hosier while injuries to central defenders Tommy Boxer and James Gurteen meant a return to the starting eleven for skipper Keagan Cole with Teddy Stacey dropping back into the three-man defence.

Sam Jenkins returned at right wing-back following his recovery from his recent hamstring problem, Matt Surmon moving into central midfield, while there was a first league start for attacker Kristian Belousas in place of Kyal Williams.

Woods made a positive start with Josh Helmore not far away with a cleanly hit effort from twenty five yards before the same player almost latched onto an enticing Andy Lomas cross after the latter was superbly picked out by Stacey's ball from deep.

And Northwood were rewarded for their early efforts as they took the lead on thirteen minutes from the penalty spot after Sydney Ibie was impeded by Callum McAllister as the Woods attacker cut in following a flick-on from Helmore, Cole sending keeper Matt Kerbey the wrong way for his fifth strike of the season.

Woods would have been confident of building on the perfect start, but it was the visitors who began to look the more dangerous as Purdue was quickly off his line to deny Jack Beadle after being played in by Tom Smith.

And the Northwood keeper breathed a huge sigh of relief moments later as a mishandle presented Andy Kabuikusomo with an open goal, but with time and space to convert, the Chipstead number 9's shot rebounded off the far upright and was scrambled clear.

Northwood suffered a blow on thirty three minutes as Jenkins pulled up with what appeared to be a recurrence of his hamstring problem, Ryan Young his replacement.

And while the hosts were looking to regroup, Chipstead continued to grow into the contest with Smith shooting wide from a good position following a cross from Warren Colman.

But having earlier failed to take a golden opportunity to get his name on the scoresheet, Kabuikusomo was presented with another chance as Purdue's mishit goal-kick fell straight to his feet, this time making no mistake to restore parity with thirty seven minutes on the clock.

Woods were rocked by the goal and offered very little for the remainder of the half with Chipstead continuing to threaten, Purdue gathering a shot from Kabuikusomo before an effort from Colman was deflected for a corner.

After conceding possession and almost gifting Chipstead another opportunity soon after the restart, Smith almost through to punish Northwood, the hosts gradually began to regain their attacking rhythm and ask questions of the Chipstead rearguard – Belousas finding the net from Young's low cross following a sweeping move but he was denied by an offside flag.

Northwood had to re-organise again on fifty six minutes as they lost Stacey to an ankle injury following a questionable challenge which surprisingly wasn't deemed

worthy of a yellow card, substitute Alex More slotting into the left wing-back berth with Lomas dropping into the back three.

The Woods maintained their attacking momentum with Young sending a ball across the face of goal after being released by Helmore before another Belousas effort found the roof of the net.

Northwood utilised their third substitution as Belousas made way for Williams on sixty five minutes. But it was Chipstead who went close as Purdue produced a full length save to keep out a Kieran Lavery free-kick.

However, the contest became an increasingly scrappy,

stop-start affair with a flurry of yellow cards, mostly for dissent from the visitors, with neither side making much of an attacking impression for the remainder of the contest.

Northwood held the territorial advantage in the closing stages with the Chipstead defence dealing too comfortably with a series of Luke Tingey throws into the box, Williams having a shot charged down and Ibie almost latching onto a Lomas corner.

But Woods were unable to fashion a winning strike with the draw a fair outcome on the balance of play on a frustrating afternoon for the boys in red.

In this column we look back at a previous meeting with today's visitors Chertsey Town. Our featured game comes from an Evo-Stik Southern League Division One Central in 2011...

Saturday 25th February 2011

Northwood 4 Chertsey Town 0

The home side made the better of the two starts to the game, with Oliver Hawkins and Romaine Walker combining well, but it was the Curfews who brought the first save.

Ex Northwood winger Lucas Williams crossed for John Pomroy who controlled and got a shot away but Mitch Swain clambered down well to tip it onto the post and back into his grasp.

Northwood then made strides forward themselves as John Christian whipped a neat looking cross into the box which was cleared by Callum Eagles. The corner from Wayne O'Sullivan was delivered with pin point accuracy and only just evaded the arriving Hawkins and James McCluskey. The ball was half dealt with, only making its way to Reece Yorke on the edge of the box, and he slammed home his first Northwood goal via the underside of the crossbar. 1-0 to the home side.

A short time later and Chertsey were almost on level terms. Dayo Oshitola saw his effort blocked by a covering Liam Fowler and then Steve Duff was thwarted by the quick reflexes of Mitch Swain who did well to parry to safety. That in turn set up Northwood on the counter attack as James McCluskey's vision released the rampant Walker, and the tricky wideman showboated inside of a bemused Tom McGarry before driving across the face of goal, and only marginally wide of the target.

Chertsey then appeared to snuff out the danger following another Northwood attack. However, a determined Oliver Hawkins chased down a back pass, in the process forcing Jamie Norris in the visitors' goal into a poor clearance. The ball fell to O'Sullivan who picked out Walker, and the talented winger dribbled effortlessly inside before shimmying past a helpless defender and into the penalty area. His mazy run forced a mistimed tackle from Callum Eagles with the referee Guy Poynter showing

no hesitation by pointing to the spot. A penalty to Northwood, and O'Sullivan duly stepped up to slot home from 12 yards out, making it 2-0 to his side.

The Woods started the second period as they had ended the first – on the front foot – as Hawkins sprinted away down the left flank playing an enticing ball into the danger zone, however there was no one on the other end of it to convert. The visiting team were struggling to gain a foothold in the second half and found themselves further adrift as O'Sullivan found Hawkins with an excellent through ball and the rest was a formality, as the tall striker showed his composure and notched up his 15th goal of the season, slotting comfortably into the bottom corner.

David Johnson's side were not prepared to lie down, though, and a dangerous ball was played over the top intended for Pomroy, yet Fowler was alert to get back and steer it back to Swain. Chertsey's afternoon was summed up a matter of minutes later when Duff's in swinging corner found its way onto the head of an advancing attacker and despite being well placed, he could only direct it into the group of Town supporters behind the goal. The Curfews did have the ball in the net soon after but to Northwood's relief the linesman had raised his flag before it was turned home.

Then Northwood turned on the style with an exquisite interchange of passes between Stephenson, Christian, Scott Raper and McCluskey which ended with the former Hanwell midfielder driving wide of the target.

Northwood still had time to add a fourth in stoppage time, as Adamson Ajayi cut in from the left hand side and found the corner of the net. The result moved them up to sixth place in the table.
