WOODS OUTLOOK

Welcome to Basingstoke

A warm welcome back to the Skyline Roofing Stadium for this afternoon's Pitching In Isthmian League game against current divisional leaders Basingstoke Town who arrive in tremendous form and will provide a serious test for the Woods today. We hope everyone connected with Basingstoke who has made the journey today will enjoy their stay with us and we wish you all a safe trip back home this evening. Today's match is kindly sponsored by Dennis Goulding and we hope he enjoys his afternoon in the boardroom alongside his fellow club supporters.

Having finished the previous campaign in fifth place, qualifying for the play-offs before being well beaten by Chertsey Town in the first knockout game, our visitors were certainly amongst the favourites for another crack at promotion this season. But they had a pretty slow start to the term, held to a 0-0 draw by Bedfont Sports on the opening day before being beaten 4-0 at Westfield a few days later. They also lost at home to Binfield before starting to find their feet (and their goalscoring form) with a 5-0 beating of Ashford Town and then a 3-0 success at Chertsey Town. They remained a little inconsistent, our own 1-0 win at Winklebury was followed soon after with a 5-2 loss at Marlow at the end of October. But since then, 'Stoke have been on fire. They won their next five, scoring 20 goals and after the setback of a 0-1 home loss to rivals Walton & Hershaw, they have since secured a further 13 wins from 13 games – an incredibly consistent run of success; scoring 36 goals and conceding only 8.

However, the title is still up for grabs as they are currently just four points ahead of second-placed Walton & Hershaw – who have won their last ten to keep pace – with both sides having eight matches to play.

Our 1-0 victory at Basingstoke Town back in mid-October was settled by Sydney Ibie who both won and scored a penalty five minutes into the second-half which proved enough to earn all three points thanks to Andrew McCorkell's clean sheet. At that stage, the Woods were top of the table and ten points ahead of Basingstoke Town who were down

in eighth place while Walton & Hershaw were only one point better off in seventh. The improvement in results from both clubs is there to be admired.

Last season we also notched a victory away at Basingstoke in January 2022, winning 3-1 thanks to goals from Josh Helmore, Teddy Stacey and Sydney Ibie but we had already been narrowly beaten here at Northwood with 'Stoke securing a 1-0 victory thanks to a Conor Lynch goal early in the second-half. Our own side that day only included James Gurteen that is still with us now.

Ten Man Woods notch valuable point

Having secured a superb 1-0 win at Chertsey Town last Saturday thanks to a Shane Cojocarel strike and a solid defensive performance, the Woods looked to make it four wins on the bounce on Tuesday night. Things were looking good for that until a 26th minute red card for Brandon Kalu as he appeared to go in slightly high for a tackle and caught his Binfield counterpart. It meant over an hour with ten men so really up against it. However, it was another stoic performance all over the pitch which limited the visitors to just a handful of half-chances in front of goal. Andrew McCorkell kept out a couple of the efforts that were on target for his third successive clean sheet and for

once the 0-0 draw was something of an achievement. It was only our second drawn league match of the season – the other also a 0-0 against Chipstead back in October – but it did allow two of the chasing pack, Marlow and Hanworth Villa, to reduce the gap in the race to the play-off places with still lots of work to do.

Cup News

We entertained a young Wealdstone side in the Middlesex Charity Cup Second Round a few weeks ago and managed to overturn the fact that we were 0-2 down and reduced to ten men early in the second-half to forced a penalty shoot-out with a 2-2 draw and then win 7-6 on penalties. We moved into the quarter-finals where we will now meet Spartan South Midlands League side St. Panteleimon for the first-ever time and this takes place here at the Skyline Roofing Stadium this Tuesday night, 14th March 2023. It's a competition that we've still never won after 32 previous attempts (four times beaten finalists) so it would be good to keep an interest in the tournament and your support on Tuesday night would be much appreciated as we look for a place in the last four.

Player News

Injuries picked up at Chertsey Town ruled out both James Gurteen and Sam Jenkins for Tuesday night's game against Binfield and they remain doubtful for today. We are hopeful that Osaretin Otote will be available for selection this week while Juwon Akin-tunde is also eyeing a return to action following his knee problem. Following his red card, Brandon Kalu will now miss five successive matches from Tuesday night onwards.

A late goal from Roger Livingstone kept Northwood in amongst the Middlesex League leaders and it proved an invaluable effort, with local rivals Hillingdon dropping a home point.

Northwood opened down the slope (there really was one back then!) and were soon on the attack, with Ian Harvey prominent in several of the build-ups, but Mill End, still smarting from the 8-0 hiding the Woods handed out on their own ground a few weeks before, were in no mood to concede an inch and they fought for every ball.

The visitors withdrew into a shell

where they contained the Woods in midfield with tenacious tackling and launched counter attacks from deep positions. While these often looked threatening, Russell in the Woods goal was not troubled with any direct shots.

It was positive action from the Woods full-backs Gould and Heslop that began to pull Mill End's defence out of position as they provided additional width with some surging runs. The match was still in the balance with ten minutes remaining as Northwood still pushed forward but Mill End looked for the quick breaks.

With just seven minutes left

Heslop embarked on yet another surging run, and this time he went past three Mill End players before planting the ball at the feet of Martin Ellis. The Woods' leading scorer beat one player and hammered the ball at goal, only for man of the match Craft to beat the chance out. But Roger Livingstone was quick to follow up and, much to the delight and relief of his colleagues, he cracked the ball home for the winner.

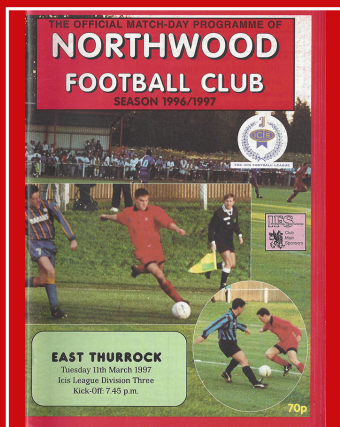
1997 Woods 0 East Thurrock 0

After 35 minutes 30-goal striker Paul Halbert broke away and looked to have been caught by the keeper



but the cries for a penalty went unheeded.

Early in the second half, Halbert's cross fell to Butler, who had a golden chance to give the home side the lead, but he hit the post from close range.

Carroll was called into action to save a good strike by Lee at the foot of the post before Chris Gell was forced off with an ankle injury 15 minutes from time.

Northwood had chances after the penalty incident, but could not find the target.

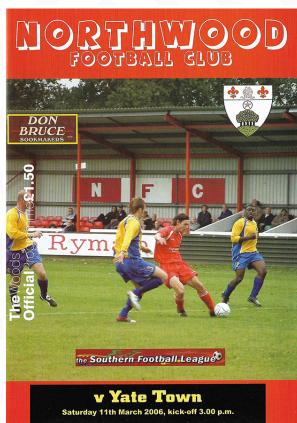

Northwood returned to winning ways with a crucial victory over play-off chasing Yate Town, and they were indebted to a stunning 30-yard Rob Courtnage volley as they recovered from a goal behind to take the spoils. But Woods fell behind as early as the 5th minute. Jason O'Connor was second best in a block challenge with Jason Wood who lifted the ball through for Darren Edwards to put the ball beyond Rob Bullivant.

Woods gradually began to find their feet and they were rewarded with an equaliser on 35 minutes. Jason O'Connor played the ball into Dean Clark, who flicked on to Peter Dean, his low cross finding Alistair Heselton, who swept the ball home from close range. The home side then enjoyed the perfect start to the second half. Bullivant's long drop kick caught the Yate rearguard

napping, and Peter Dean got beyond Lee Vickerman to coolly slot the ball beyond visiting keeper Tony Court.



Yate proceeded to put the Northwood defence under intense pressure. Bullivant was called into action as he pulled off a point blank

Ten-man Northwood produced a defensive masterclass following the early sending off of Brandon Kalu to resist play-off hopefuls Binfield on a cold night at the Skyline Roofing Stadium.

Woods were forced to make a couple of changes to their starting line-up with injury ruling out Sam Jenkins and James Gurteen, Brandon Kalu and Harry Gallagher their replacements, while the returning Micah Jackson was preferred to Junior Pavia at right wing-back.

Northwood made a positive start on the slick surface with Jackson trying his luck with a half-volley bicycle kick from the edge of the box which cleared the crossbar after Binfield struggled to clear a Luke Tingey throw into their box.

Woods continued to ask early questions of the Moles defence as Dan Williams fed Shane Cojocarel whose low cross into the box was intercepted with Gareth Chendlik ready to pounce. And Cojocarel was involved again minutes later as he fired a snapshot narrowly wide after Tingey's shot rebounded into his path.

And having resisted the Northwood pressure, Binfield had a glorious chance to take the lead through Brad Pagliaroli but he took an extra touch at the far post with the goal at his mercy allowing Jackson to get in a vital block.

But the whole nature of the contest was changed on 26 minutes as Kalu received his marching orders for a rash challenge on Kai Hobbs - the third red card in six games for the unfortunate defender.

The Moles sensed blood and immediately set about trying to make the most of their numerical advantage with



McCorkell being called upon to tip over an effort from Pagliaroli while Conor Lynch might have done better as he directed a free header wide of the target.

However, Woods threatened on the counter attack as Cojocarel played in Chendlik but his shot hit the post as the offside flag was raised with Carl Stewart looking to despatch the rebound.

Northwood had some more defending to do before the break with Tingey executing a well-timed block on a Connor Holland shot before McCorkell showed a safe pair of hands as he gathered Lynch's cross-shot.

McCorkell was immediately called into action upon the resumption as he kept out a low shot from Lynch with the loose ball being put away by Pagliaroli who to Woods' relief had strayed into an offside position.

Northwood continued to show great defensive resolve and organisation with Keagan Cole once again outstand-



ing in the heart of the backline and this created a platform to remind the Moles of Woods' attacking threat as Stewart was denied by a flying save from Harvey Rackley-Hayes as he kept out a sweet strike from the edge of the box.

Northwood made their first substitution on 65 minutes as Cojocarel made way for Pavia and for all their possession, Binfield were struggling to make any real impact on the hosts as each player stuck manfully to their task with Teddy Stacey and Stewart doing a sterling job in the middle of the park as they protected the backline.

Riccardo Alexander-Greenaway was added to the fray on 75 minutes as he replaced Chendlik and Woods continued to look comfortable as the Moles seemed to be running out of ideas as to how to break the home resistance with their substitutions making little impact – although Massimo Giammettei wasn't far away with an audacious overhead-kick attempt.

Binfield were rapidly running out of time with their last chance of the evening falling to Hobbs who headed wide from a corner. There was time for Josh Helmore to make an appearance against his old club in place of Williams and the substitute used all his experience as he got on

the ball to help take the sting out of the contest in the final stages.

Woods successfully negotiated the remaining minutes to secure a crucial point, which felt like three given the circumstances, the draw consolidating Northwood's position in third place and maintaining the ten-point gap to their opponents who sit outside the play-off positions in seventh.

Northwood were soon on the attack once again, and their increasing confidence was characterised by man of the match Orphanou as he tried his luck with an audacious overhead kick. Woods were looking the more likely as they threatened again, with Eugene Ofori going close with a header from another Burrell free-kick.

And the decisive goal duly arrived in somewhat unusual circumstances as Kitteridge attempted to clear Figueiredo's hanging cross, but the unfortunate 'keeper only succeeded in punching the ball into his own net to give Northwood a precious lead with ten minutes left on the clock.

Ofori sent a rasping shot over the Basingstoke crossbar as Woods looked to put the icing on the cake but there was to be no further drama as Northwood safely saw out the remainder of the match to put themselves in the hat for the first round proper.

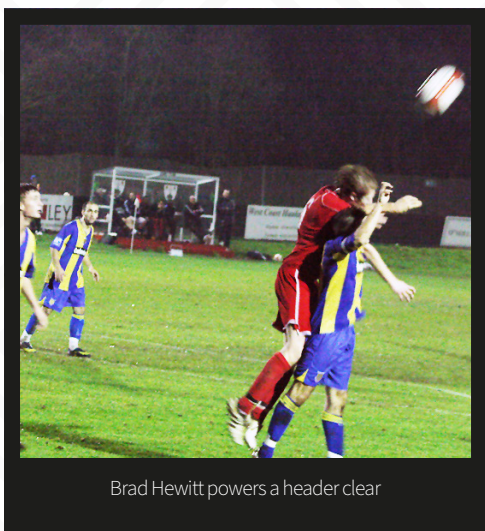

CLUB HISTORY

Basingstoke Town FC were formed in 1896 following a merger of Aldworth United and Basingstoke Albion. They joined the Hampshire League North in 1903 and were champions in both the 1911–12 and 1919–20 seasons.

Following the end of the Second World War, Basingstoke Town moved in to its historical home at The Camrose.

After league reorganisation, Basingstoke were placed in Hampshire League Division One where the team finished as runners-up in 1965–66 and 1966–67, before eventually winning the league in 1967–68. After finishing as runners-up again in 1968–69, Basingstoke Town won back-to-back titles in 1969–70 and 1970–71, remaining unbeaten in the latter season.

In what was a successful few years for the club, Basingstoke moved up to Division One South of the Southern League. Their first season in the Southern League saw 'Stoke reach the first round of the FA Cup for the first time, eventually losing 5–1 to Northampton Town

The club remained in Southern League Division One South until 1979, when league restructuring saw them placed in the Southern Division. Basingstoke won the division in 1984–85, earning promotion to the Premier Division. Two seasons later Basingstoke Town were transferred to the Premier Division of the Isthmian League. Although they were relegated to Division One at the end of the 1987–88 season, they made an immediate return to the Premier Division after ending the following season as runners-up.

The 1989–90 season saw the club reach the first round of the FA Cup again, eventually losing out 3–2 in the Second Round Proper to Torquay United with an attendance of 4091 at The Camrose.

In 1993–94 Basingstoke were relegated to Division One, returning to the Isthmian Premier Division in 1996–97 after finishing as Division One runners-up.

1997 was a monumental year for Basingstoke Town – conquering league opposition for the first time, beating Wycombe Wanderers 5–4 on penalties after a 2–2 draw in a replay; the attendance of 5,085 was a new record for the club. The FA Cup Second Round saw Basingstoke take Northampton Town to a replay, before eventually narrowly losing out, 4–3 on penalties.

Basingstoke again reached the FA Cup First Round in 1998, losing 2–1 to AFC Bournemouth.

As part of league restructuring, Basingstoke Town formed part of the newly-formed Conference South in 2004–05.

In 2006, whilst bottom of the Conference South,

Basingstoke Town defeated League One Chesterfield Town at Saltergate 1–0 in the FA Cup First Round, before losing to local neighbours Aldershot Town in a Second Round Replay. 'Stoke lost 1–0 to Brentford at Griffin Park in the FA Cup First Round in 2011 before reaching the Conference South play-offs later that season. Basingstoke again reached the Conference South play-offs again in 2014/15, losing in the semi-finals on each occasion.

Basingstoke most recently reached the FA Cup First Round in the 2015/16 season, losing away 1–0 to Cambridge United.

In a troubled period for the club, it was relegated to Southern League for the 2016/17 season and again relegated to Southern League Division One South in 2019 after being evicted from its Camrose ground.

The club went through a transition period, making it a community owned football club, and was forced in to a ground-share at Winchester City FC in 2019 before returning to the town in 2020 at Hampshire FA's Winklebury Football Complex.

The club was moved sideways to the Isthmian South Central Division for the 2021/22 season, finishing fourth and eventually losing out in the play-offs in the club's inaugural season in this league.
