Good afternoon, Woods fans,

Last week in my programme notes I mentioned how the fixture marked a special day for the club, celebrating "Peter Barry Day". I would like to say how delighted I was to ensure the day was topped off with a win in front of our increasingly vocal home support! I hope we did and continue to do, our chairman and his family proud; it was great to see so many of them at the game last week.

After a difficult working week with travels to Basingstoke and Walton in the cup, a win was something we wanted to ensure going into our full training week. The squad as you know has had its knocks and injury difficulties so for the big push last week to get another three points over the line it shows exactly where we are at. I always enjoy hearing compliments about how well we are doing, especially when it comes from opposition managers. The pre-match and post-match comments from the Thatcham manager, who many of you know, were very nice to hear and gave me a great sense of pride. WOODS OUTLOOK

Welcome to the Chips

For the second Saturday in succession, it's a warm welcome back to the Skyline Roofing Stadium this afternoon to you all including everyone connected with Chipstead Football Club who arrive here at Northwood in mid-table with ten points from their opening ten games but having been beaten at home by lowly Guernsey last weekend.

Our visitors started the season slowly, going out of the FA Cup at home to Tunbridge Wells and then losing their first three league matches but turned things around when following a 0-0 draw at Bedfont Sports with a 1-0 success over Westfield. They then notched an excellent FA Trophy win, 4-2 over Waltham Abbey but lost 2-1 at Heybridge Swifts in the following round. They lost away games at Marlow and Basingstoke Town, both 3-0 but earned a 2-1 victory over 10-man Uxbridge and then picked up their first away win of the season coming back from being 2-0 down to win by the odd goal in five at Leatherhead.

Last season, the Woods picked up four points from the two games played between the two sides. Away at Chipstead was our first game under the new management structure and saw an early goal from Sydney Ibie earn us a 1-0 win despite playing the final half an hour with ten men following two yellow cards for Tommy Boxer inside ninety seconds. The return match was played in mid-March, with any relegation fears firmly out of the way and ended in a 1-1 draw. Keagan Cole had put the Woods in front from the penalty-spot after Ibie had been upended but Andy Kabuikusomo levelled before the break.

Six of the best....

Last Saturday's solid 2-0 victory over Thatcham Town kept the Woods clear at the top of the table and also took our winning home run in league matches to six games. This equals a run of form shown back in 2008/09 when playing in the Isthmian North Division. The surprising fact of that sequence was the six matches were played under three different managers! Colin Payne was in charge for the first game – a 3-1 defeat of Tilbury but he was shown the door after a defeat away at Witham Town a few days later. Caretaker boss Mark Barnham then took charge for the next two games which saw the Woods defeat Brentwood Town 3-2 and Ilford 3-0 before Dave Anderson was appointed as the new Manager in December. We then

won the first three at home under his charge, beating Potters Bar Town 2-1, Waltham Forest 1-0 and Ware 2-1. The run ended with a 1-1 draw against Wingate & Finchley. Today we look to extend the run to seven matches and, if we get there, I'll let you know what that run equals!

Other Cup News

Our narrow 1-0 defeat at Walton & Hersham the previous midweek means that we end our interest in the Velocity Trophy (Isthmian League Cup) for another year. It was a tight game throughout but the home side's substitutions made a difference while their fitness levels mean that they are tough opposition throughout the full ninety minutes. That's twice we've been beaten at Walton this season and they continue to be unbeaten in the league as they start to play the games they have in hand.

That just leaves us with the Middlesex Cup competitions to play this season and we now know that we will play away to Hanworth Villa in the Second Round of the Senior Cup with the tie scheduled to take place on Tuesday week, 8th November 2022. It's a really strange quirk of fate that this season after the Hanworth game, we will now have played seven cup games this season and all of them will have been against teams from our own division.

Perhaps the draw for the Middlesex Charity Cup will give us someone different to play against? The Second Round, to which we received a "bye" has not been drawn yet.

Player News

A foot injury suffered by Sam Jenkins in training meant that we had to recruit cover before last Saturday's home game against Thatcham Town and we are delighted to welcome Brazilian-born former QPR Academy defender Alison Junio Ferreira De Paiva to the club. The youngster, known as Junior Paiva, has joined the Woods on dual-registration from Chesham United and certainly impressed on debut. He has also played for Hilltop and briefly for Hayes & Yeading United.

There's little change with our other injury issues as Romario Jonas, Keagan Cole and Teddy Stacey remain side-lined while James Gurteen misses out today after totting up five yellow cards this season.

The players are holding a fundraiser after today's match, probably kicking-off at about 6pm, to help raise funds towards an overnight stay prior to our game on Guernsey next month. But we are getting more regulars arriving all the time and we've only played six League games prior to this Saturday game so there is still plenty of advantage (13 more to come) in getting a Season Ticket now and receive it in time for our next home game. There is an on-line link to pay from the website or, by all means pay cash to me this afternoon! The Season Ticket also gets you access to all the Under-18s home games in the Isthmian Youth League. They don't count however, for any Cup fixtures!

The side is back in action here at the Skyline Roofing Stadium this Wednesday night with a league game at home to Beaconsfield Town. Do try to get along and show them some support in what is likely to be a tough contest.

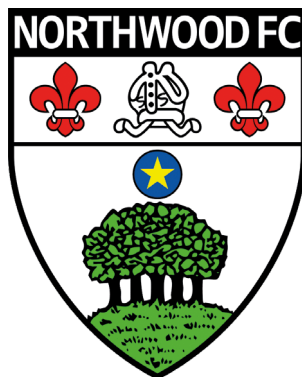

A 2-0 win and another clean sheet did exactly that. Again, on another day we may have walked away with another two or three goals.

The squad enjoyed a team bonding/recovery session at Oakleigh Park swimming pool Tuesday evening which was full of banter and smiles.

We look forward to seeing everyone this afternoon and hope to continue our great start to the season.

Finally, we hope to see plenty of faces after this afternoon's game in the bar for a quiz evening which will raise funds for our overnight stay in Guernsey next month as we look to continue with detailed preparation for our matches.

In the club's history, dating back to 1926, there have been 15 games on this date; the results and details of these are shown below, and I take a look at three matches in more depth.

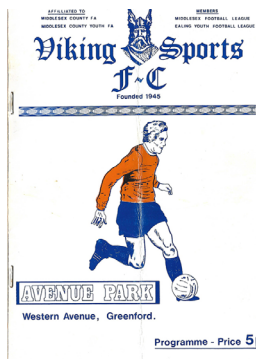

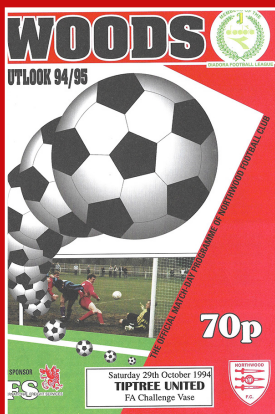

Northwood surrendered an early lead but then battled back from a goal behind to earn a replay in this open and entertaining Buildbase FA Trophy tie. The home side started well, but on 11 minutes the Woods took the lead, Luke Heneghan picking the ball up in space some 35 yards from goal and with little back-lift, rifled home into the top corner to give the stranded keeper Welch no chance.

Royston were soon back on the offensive, though, with Montel Joseph saving well, but the Crows were level after 22 minutes with a well-worked free-kick. Ingreys shaped to take it but then ran full-speed into the box and was not picked up quickly enough as he then got his head to Scott Bridges' lofted ball forward and it sailed into the top corner.

A good spell from the Woods followed with Louis Bircham going close with a 25-yard strike that flew just wide of the post and then a low strike which forced Welch into a



full-length dive to push the ball wide of the other upright. The Crows remained a threat from set-pieces and when Gus Scott-Morriss knocked in a deep free-kick to the far post Stuart Bridges dived to get in a header but it Joseph gathered safely.

Northwood came out for the second half full of running and just a couple of minutes in, Alex Nolan was played into the box by Louis Stead but his shot was inches wide of the post. However on the hour, substitute Josh Castaglione ran at Alex

Nolan who backed off a little and it allowed the new man the chance to squeeze a shot inside Joseph's near post to give Royston the lead.

That didn't last too long, though, as Bircham dispossessed Danny May on the left and squared a ball across to Frankie Jones, and the young midfielder stroked in his first goal for the club to level things up at 2-2.

Heneghan had an effort comfortably saved by Welch soon after this and then Stead intercepted a quick free-kick to feed Bircham but he was crowded out and his shot was blocked.

The Crows went close next from another free-kick pumped into the box by Luke Warner-Eley and Castiglione had to stretch to reach it at the far post and his strike went well over the bar. Then Towner found space for a shot from distance but it was always going over the top.

League leaders Northwood made it six wins out of six at the Skyline Roofing Stadium as they overcame their Berkshire visitors to maintain the seven-point gap at the top of the table.

Woods gave a debut to Chesham loanee Junior Paiva in the absence of Brandon Kalu and regular right-back Sam Jenkins who faces a spell on the sidelines after suffering a broken metatarsal in training. Injury also ruled out Ricardo Alexander-Greenaway with Ergys Pepaj continuing in the midfield alongside Carl Stewart.

Woods were quickly into their stride as Luke Tingey released Sydney Ibie who outstripped the Kingfishers' defence but was unable to apply the finish as he dragged his shot wide with only goalkeeper Morgan Campbell to beat.

Northwood maintained their strong start with a Luke Tingey throw into the box not quite falling right for Josh Helmore before Pavia strode forward but failed to seriously trouble Campbell with the ensuing shot.

In Conversation with

SAM JENKINS

I sat down for a chat with Sam for a little chat on the day of the Thatcham game after he had notched up his 50th league appearance for the Woods in the previous week's win over Basingstoke.

Firstly, congratulations on making your 50th league appearance for the club last week, but before we discuss that, what are you doing on crutches?

Thank you and yes, unfortunately I had a little accident in training this week and I have broken a metatarsal.

How did you do that?

I don't really know! There was no one else involved and no contact. I took a shot at goal and as I landed, I felt something in my foot and was in a bit of discomfort. Took myself up to hospital and an x-ray showed the little break.

That's a real shame and must be frustrating especially as you have suffered a few injuries in recent times.

I have. Last year I struggled with a hamstring problem, but I finished the season strongly and after a good pre-season was feeling good, so this is a bit of a blow. But



hopefully I won't be out for too long.

Good luck with your recovery. And while we look forward to your return to fitness, can we go back to the beginning of your career. Where did it all start for you?

I grew up in Southampton playing junior football from under-11s up to under 18s then I went off to Uni at Oxford Brookes playing for the university which included the annual Varsity match against Oxford University which was always played at the Iffley Road Stadium made famous by Roger Bannister and his sub-4- minute mile. I have fond memories of those games which we won in each of my three years.

And being a qualified Physiotherapist, I guess that was your subject of study at university?

It was. I guess you can call me a failed doctor!

And straight into senior non-league football after Uni?

Through a family friend, I actually played half a season for Milton United in the Hellenic League while I was at Oxford after all the college teams were banned from

playing for a few months due to an incident with one of the teams - nothing to do with me I hasten to add! Then I moved to the St Albans area after finishing university and I linked up with Harpenden Town.

How was your time at Harpenden?

Really enjoyed my time there. Playing with a great bunch of lads, it was very much like the atmosphere we now have at the Woods – great dressing room and under a top manager in Danny Plumb. We had a successful season where we won promotion from Spartan South Midlands Div one and won a cup. We then followed that up with a third placed finish in the Spartan Prem.

And then Woods came calling

They did. Dean Barker contacted me and I made the move along with my Harpenden team-mate James Ewington as I was keen to test myself at the higher level.

What are your memories of that season?

We had a good team and started the season OK with James banging in the goals. Dean tended to play me more forward as the right-sided midfielder rather than at right back. But after Dean left, Scott Dash preferred me at right-back.

Which position do you prefer?

I enjoy both. I do enjoy the wing-back role when we play with the 3 at the back but now with the switch to a back four the right-back role means I have to be more disciplined- but there are still opportunities to get forward.

And on a personal note – the season ended on a high as you won the Manager's Player of the Year award.

Yes, I was delighted to be awarded that by Scott Dash who was a good guy.

And then you moved onto Chesham along with Carl Pearce.

Yes. I wasn't looking to move. I had enjoyed it under Scott but when James Duncan and Michael Murray contacted me, I didn't feel I could turn the opportunity down of testing myself at step 3. But being part of a bigger squad and not playing regularly took some adjustment and the little injuries didn't help. I came back to Woods on a dual-registration basis to get some minutes and played a couple of games under Rob Ursell and then Covid hit.

A career so far which has seen you play under a number of managers as you have mentioned – do you have



a particular favourite?

That's a tricky one. All the managers have their particular strengths and I have enjoyed playing under them all, including Steve & Ben!

And what a time to return to the Woods last season under Messrs. Ringrose and Bukowski?

Certainly was. Again, it was on a dual-registration to get some much-needed minutes but it was great to be back as we went on that superb run - from my first game back where we won at Chertsey and with memorable wins at Basingstoke and Uxbridge along the way. I was delighted to make the move permanent in the summer.

And hopeful of building on that this season?

Definitely. We have had a great start, but I see no reason why we can't be up there come the end of the season. We have a great blend of experience and youth and a great dressing room where we enjoy each other's company and that is so important. There is a real buzz about the place and a real feeling that the club is moving in the right direction and I'm delighted to be part of that.

Away from football, how do you fill your time?

My day job is the physiotherapy, working for a General Practice in Barnet. It is a lot of non-sport work involving MRI & injections - my official title being a '1st contact practitioner'. As far as hobbies go, I'm not really into music like a lot of the boys are but enjoy listening to life-story podcasts and the like. However, a lot of my time is currently being spent on arranging my wedding next May and trying to organize a stag weekend which will avoid any potential play-off dates!

Congratulations and best wishes with that! And back to football - no doubt you follow your hometown club?

Although I have a soft spot for the Saints, Chelsea is my team due to my mum being born in Chelsea & Westminster and the Boxing Day family treat would often involve a trip to Stamford Bridge. On the other side of the family, I have a connection to Man City through my dad but the Chelsea is the one.

Well thank you for your time, Sam. Wishing you all the best for a swift return to fitness and look forward to seeing back in the red shirt.

Northwood secured their second successive away league win for the first time since March 2016 with a hard earned win at Chipstead, on their first-ever visit to the Surrey club after they had been moved from the Isthmian's South Division.

Woods were quickly into their stride with Dan Pett surging forward and seeing his shot blocked before Worrell almost capped a swift counter-attack involving Sam Tring and Andrew Ofosu. And Worrell returned the favour to Ofosu minutes later as the latter rolled his shot narrowly beyond the far post.

The hosts had to do most of the defending in the early stages but they threatened through Izzy Bademosi with Kieran Asumadu-Sakyi making a timely interception before Sam Page was off target with free-header from a corner.

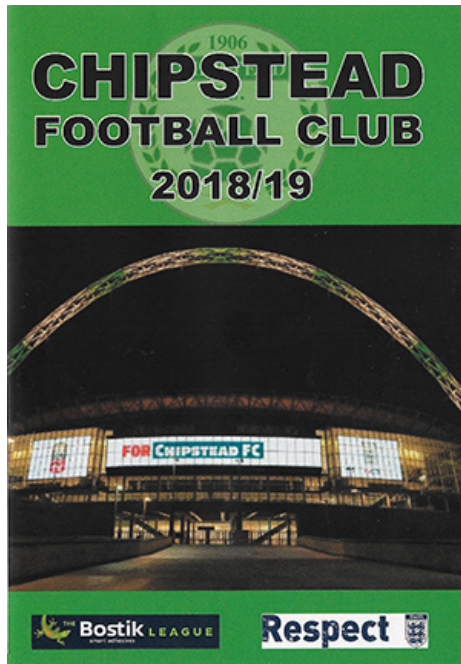
Woods maintained their positive start, and they were rewarded with the opening goal on 14 minutes as Worrell capitalised on misunderstanding between keeper Callum Hodgson and Sam Page to coolly convert from a narrow angle for his first senior league goal.

And things got better for Northwood four minutes later as another back-pass from Page went through Hodgson

allowing Ofosu to roll the ball into the unguarded net for his second goal in two games.

Ofosu continued to cause problems for the home defence as he went close with a header from a Matt Cooper free-kick before another storming run ended with his shot being charged down.

Worrell was testing the hosts with his pace and trickery with full-back Joe Clemo crudely halting another foray to



earn a caution while the Northwood winger saw his shot saved by Hodgson following a jinking run into the box.

Chipstead had offered very little in a one-sided opening half but Northwood gave the hosts some encouragement as they conceded a soft goal on the stroke of half-time, the unmarked Sam Bell flicking the ball home from a corner.

Woods were soon on the offensive following the restart as the hard working Leigh Stevens fired a volley over the crossbar. And the midfielder was instrumental in Northwood restoring their two goal cushion on 49 minutes as he broke forward before squaring the ball to Worrell, who stroked the ball home for his second goal of the afternoon.

Northwood went close to extending their lead but Hodgson managed to claw away Pattie's deflected shot. But the Woods had some defending to do as keeper Luke Sheldrick gathered a Luke Elliott header.

However, the Chips weren't to be denied, as Northwood failed to deal with a cross from Clemo with Dan Moody converting on 82 minutes to ensure a nervous finish to the game for the visitors.

The visitors had a great chance to ease their nerves as Gosling created an opening for Lucan but his shot was blocked. And Gosling was creator once again as he played in Worrell but the latter dragged his shot narrowly wide.

Northwood's second visit of the season to the Xcel Sports Hub ended in disappointment once again as they slipped to a narrow defeat in the Isthmian League Cup.

Both sides made a number of changes to the teams which lined up for their respective league games at the weekend. Woods began with a new look attack with Juwon Akintunde the central striker, behind him a three of Rahim Jude-Boyd, Ronan Hutchins and Jake Tabor. Ergys Pepaj replaced the ever-present Riccardo Alexander-Greenaway in central midfield while Brandon Kalu came in for Sam Jenkins at right-back.

The Swans were quickly into their stride launching a series of swift, incisive moves with both Joshua Millo and Arsen Ujkaj going close. But Woods repelled the early danger and began to make an impression themselves – Jude-Boyd exchanging passes with Akintunde but unable to apply the finish in the six-yard box with the ball slightly behind him before the two combined again with Akintunde's shot deflecting off the upright.

Northwood continued to take the game to the Swans with the overlapping Kalu sending over a deep cross which found Tabor at the far post, but the latter was unable to gather to fashion a strike on goal.

And another swift counter from Woods produced a free-kick on the edge of the home box, Andy Lomas seeing his effort deflect onto the crossbar before Pepaj's half-volley attempt flew narrowly wide.

There were further openings created at both ends before the break as the play flowed from end to end in an open first half – Millo shooting wide for Swans before Kalu did well to block Jordan Adeyemi's shot when well placed, at the other end, keeper Liam Allen dealt with a long-range effort from

Hutchins before Lomas closed the half with a clean strike which flew narrowly wide.

Northwood made a change at the break as Sandro Costa Dias Fernandes came on for his debut in place of Tabor in the left-sided attacking role. And Woods quickly worked a good position with Jude-Boyd's firm shot being dealt with by Allen while visiting keeper Andrew McCorkell was on hand to deny substitute Max Blackmore as the Swans quickly countered.

Woods kept up the momentum and forced the hosts into defending a series of Luke Tingey throws into their box with James Gurteen's header which flew narrowly over the back post, the closest the visitors came to breaking the deadlock.

The Swans utilised four of the allotted five substitutions available to them as the contest passed the hour mark while Hutchins made way for Josh Helmore as Woods looked to freshen up the attack, the latter slotting in behind Akintunde.

Northwood were the next to threaten as Akintunde latched onto Carl Stewart's defence-splitting pass, but Allen was quickly out to deny the Wood's number 9.

However, it was the hosts who finally broke the deadlock on 81 minutes, Woods carelessly squandering possession in the Swans half, allowing Walton to break quickly with Adeyemi firing a low shot through the legs of Gurteen which nestled in the far corner of the Northwood net.

And the Swans went close to adding a second moments later, but Kalu executed a perfectly timed last-ditch tackle to deny Millo.

The Woods made a couple more substitutions as Joe Reade and Jenkins replaced Akintunde and Pepaj. But time was running out for the visitors whose level had dropped off during the latter stages, McCorkell having to scramble back to prevent Kalu's misdirected back-pass from gifting the hosts another goal.

Northwood had one last chance to force a penalty shoot-out as they won a corner deep into added time and with everyone up including McCorkell, the ball found its way to Costa whose snatched shot flew well wide of the target as the referee called an end to proceedings.



THE VISITORS

CHIPSTEAD FC

CLUB HISTORY

Chipstead Football Club was formed in 1906, when the Netherne hospital was being built, and the building workers and the lads in Chipstead challenged each other to a match. The oldest club records dated 1911 show a far from healthy position, survival relying mainly on the proceeds of whist drives. The club's health began to improve and, in 1920, it even had its own transport for away games, an open topped lorry owned by a local builder. Up until the 1962/63 season, Chipstead played junior football, but, having finished runners-up in the County Junior Cup the previous year, they then moved into the Surrey Intermediate League

The club played at this standard until 1982, when they became founder members of the Surrey Premier League. The next four years saw the club have great success finishing runners-up three times and also winning the League Cup on three occasions. During this period, they were also beaten finalists in the County Premier Cup. The reserves also met with success being runners-up once and also winning the League Cup. After a long battle, the club were awarded senior status in 1986 and were promoted to the Combined Counties League, where once again success followed; a League Championship was gained in 1989/90 and a runners-up spot was gained on two occasions, with six League Cup Final appearances, with Chipstead being victorious in four

Season 1987/88 saw the club make its debut in the F.A. Vase and the following year in the F.A. Cup. Over recent years the club has continued to grow and strengthen its youth policy with some 200 players between the ages of six and eighteen involved every week. Two former Chipstead youth players - Leon McKenzie and Steven Sidwell moved on to professional clubs, &, more recently, Saidou Khan played for our 1st team, & is now with Maidstone Utd.

The Combined Counties Championship winning squad contained no fewer than 12 players, who had represented the club at youth level

In 1998 Chipstead was able to purchase the freehold of the ground from the Local Authority. Thanks to a grant from the F.A. in 2001, the club was able to purchase additional land, which was developed into mini-soccer pitches to further enhance its youth policy.

More recently in November 2004 a 100-seater stand was installed, which was increased to 150 in March 2007. In May 2006 a covered standing area for 150 people was also erected

2006-07 was the club's 'Centenary' season, and the hope was that it would be a memorable one. On the opening day of the season, the team won their first game and went top of the table; come February, and still top, the decision was made to do the necessary work to achieve the ground upgrading. The next six weeks saw the ground transformed thanks to the incredible hard work of the committee and supporters. The team remained top and promotion to the Ryman League was achieved for the first time in 100 years

In the 2007-08 season Chipstead established themselves in the Ryman League finishing a creditable 15th. They also went on to win the Southern Combination Cup beating Ryman Premier side Ashford Town (Middlesex) in the final

In 2008-09 Chipstead struggled in the league, but, in the FA Cup, reached the 4th qualifying round for the first time in their history, eventually losing at Torquay United.

2010-11 saw Chipstead finished 10th being their highest position ever

2012-13 was a poor season for the club with no fewer

than 4 managers - Mark Tompkins left the club after just one game; assistant Mick Read stepped in as temporary manager for a month, before the club appointed John Hamsher. Things seemed fine until January, when results took a dip. John decided to step down in early April, with vice-chairman Mick Ford taking over the reins for the final 3 matches

In 2013-14 Chipstead started the season with a new management team - Kevin Rayner, with Roly Martin as his assistant, and Mark Elgar as technical assistant. From August until the end of October 7 games out of 21 were won in all competitions, including losing both F.A. Trophy & F.A. Cup matches within eight days. Geoff Corner stepped aside as Chairman, with Mick Ford taking up the position. Mick's first task was to appoint a new manager in Steve Baker. A mid-table finish of 13th was a great turnaround for the club. Steve left the club in 2014-15, and was replaced by Simon Colbran

Following a poor start to the 2015/16 season, Simon resigned, and was replaced by Lyndon Buckwell. Unable to turn things around, Lyndon was himself replaced by Craig Tanner, well known to Tooting & Mitcham folk, who, with Adam Moriarty, ultimately managed to save the club from relegation with a few games to spare. Craig & Adam then left the club during the summer

2016-17 saw the return of ex-Chipstead player Antony Williams to manage the 1st team along with his assistants, two of whom had played for the club in the past. Having former club players in management gave everyone at the

club a lift, and they quickly got to work, and comfortably avoided relegation. They laid the foundations for the 2017-18 season, & remain at the same level to this day, although the powers that be put the club in the Bostik League South Central Division for 2018/19

This provided many new clubs in opposition, yet Chipstead held their own in the division, although Antony decided to step aside, as the season drew to a close – his two coaches, Rob Kember & Rob Smith stepped forward to take up the mantle & lead the club into the 2019/20 season in the newly-named BetVictor Isthmian League South Central Division – the club was doing well, although their last game on 10th March ended up in a 2-0 defeat to Ashford Town, but there was still a chance of reaching the playoffs, but then COVID struck . . .

In 2020/21 the club only got to play 8 league matches, & was 13th in the table, when things ground to a halt again, although Chipstead had won 3 FA Cup ties, with keeper Oliver Pain saving a penalty in each, before the road to Wembley ended at Hayes & Yeading after another penalty shootout

Last season, 2021/22, Chipstead finished 10th in the league, but went on a fine unbeaten run at the end, remaining undefeated after losing to champions Bracknell on 12th February

What will 2022/23 hold in store? – hopefully another safe & uninterrupted campaign for us all

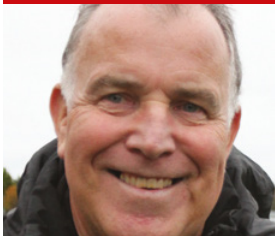

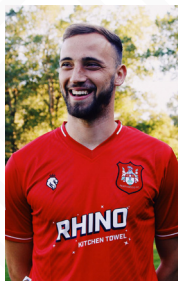
