WOODS OUTLOOK

Welcome to the Kingfishers

A warm welcome back to the Skyline Roofing Stadium this afternoon to you all including everyone connected with Thatcham Town Football Club. We are also delighted to designate today as "Pete Barry Day" in memory of Chairman Ian's dad who passed away six years ago yesterday having been a great help to Ian and the club when he took over the role some fifteen or so years ago and is much missed by us all here at Northwood FC.

The history of games against our visitors dates back to our first season of Hellenic League Division One fixtures back in 1978/79. Thatcham won their home game 3-1 but the Woods triumphed 5-0 here at Northwood Park on the way to promotion to the Premier. Games between the two clubs have been rare since though and last season the Kingfishers got the better of the Woods. It was a 1-1 draw on the opening day over at the Stacatruc Stadium but they notched a narrow 1-0 victory here with a late goal from Josh Edwards back in December 2021.

One-time Woods Assistant Manager Yashwa Romeo is in charge at Thatcham this season and the Berkshire side have made a slow start to the campaign. They went out of the FA Cup in the extra preliminary round, losing 2-3 at home to Wessex League side Horndean and then started the League campaign with home draws against Guernsey and Marlow before losing narrowly at home to Leatherhead and at Uxbridge. A good FA Trophy win at Cinderford finally got them off the mark but defeats at Hanford Villa and at Binfield left them in the bottom three. AFC Dunstable knocked them out of the FA Trophy but the arrival of young striker David Nyarko on work experience from Reading has lifted their form. A hat-trick on debut earned the Kingfishers a 5-1 defeat of Bedfont Sports to open their league account of wins and that was followed by two more in a creditable 2-2 draw at Southall. He scored again last Saturday but it was not enough as they lost 1-2 at home to Sutton Common Rovers and they currently sit in fifteenth place in the league table.

Back to winning ways

Having played a friendly against Step 2 side Hampton & Richmond Borough following our poor performance at Ashford Town (Middx), losing 4-3 with goals from Jake Tabor, Micah Jackson and Rahim Jude-Boyd, we went

into our home league match against Merstham with confidence restored but it was tighter than we would have liked as we had to come from behind to win 3-2.

But the side went on to make it three wins in eight days as we followed that with a Middlesex Senior Cup victory over Ashford Town (Middlesex) on the Tuesday night and then a superb win at Basingstoke Town back in the league last weekend. Both were only 1-0 but it was good to keep back-to-back clean sheets for the first time this season and the latter maintained our cushion at the top of the table, though some of the chasing pack do have plenty of games in hand.

This includes the impressive promoted side Walton & Hersham who, now they are out of the FA competitions following long runs in both, can concentrate on their unbeaten league record. We were of course due to be at Walton & Hersham again on Tuesday night in the Velocity Trophy (League Cup) but these notes had to be prepared before the result of that rematch was known.

Other Cup News

Should we have been successful at Walton on Tuesday night, the third round draw will have granted us a home tie against Southall to be played on Tuesday 8th November.

Our victory in the Middlesex Senior Cup puts us into the Second Round where we will be one of only seven teams from outside of Step 3. The nine sides that received a bye to round two are all Step 3 and upwards (though this includes Brentford B who don't officially have a level!). The draw has not been made at the time of writing.

Player News

There was another new recruit just prior to our last home match against Merstham and we welcome striker Juwon Akintunde to our squad as we look to bolster our attacking options. Juwon has joined us from rivals Uxbridge and he came straight into the side and then scored the winning goal in the midweek win over Ashford Town (Middlesex). We hope he enjoys a long and successful stay here with the Woods.

Since then, we have added two further players to the first-team squad. Under-18s skipper Joe Reade was registered and, still a couple of months short of his 17th birthday, he made his first-team debut against Ashford Town (Middx) in the Senior Cup and will continue to stay

involved in training. Finally, Sandro Costa Dias Fernandes, who was with the Woods in pre-season training, returned to the club after making a few appearances for Southall. He has dual-registered at Broadfields United to get some minutes in the tank but should be involved soon.

Congratulations to Sam Jenkins who made his 50th Isthmian League appearance for the Woods at Basingstoke Town last Saturday, though he did have to limp off with an injury! We have a few other players approaching milestones too, which has been a rare occurrence in the last few years.

Season Tickets – Get yours now!

Most of you have already kindly renewed your Season Tickets for the season and taken advantage of the huge discount available, able to gain entrance to every home Isthmian League game for the price of just £49.00. But we are getting more regulars arriving all the time and we've only played five League games prior to this Saturday game so there is still plenty of advantage (14 more to come) in getting a Season Ticket now and receive it in time for our next home game. There is an on-line link to pay from the website or, by all means pay cash to me this afternoon! They Season Ticket also get you access to all the Under-18s home games in the Isthmian Youth League. They don't count however, for any Cup fixtures!

Under-18s

Ryan Young's side notched their first three Isthmian League points a couple of weeks ago with an emphatic 6-1 win over Hampton & Richmond Borough here at the Skyline Roofing Stadium. There were goals from Oscar John, Fabjan Toci, Londin Latifi 2, Calvin Wyatt and Ben Crowder. The side were due to be back in action on Wednesday night against Uxbridge in the League Cup but these notes had to be prepared prior to that result being known. Their next home game is at home to Beaconsfield Town on Wednesday 2nd November.

Our tenants - Spartans Youth FC

Spartans were unlucky last Saturday against Berks County as they made a stirring second-half comeback having been 4-1 down at half-time but still finished point-less as they lost 3-4. They were at home again against Deportivo Galicia in a Divisional League Cup game on Tuesday night but again that result is not known at the time of writing.

There is no midweek game for the Woods this week and we are back here at the Skyline Roofing Stadium next Saturday for a Pitching In Isthmian League home game against Chipstead.

We created loads of chances and on another day could have had two more goals with both James Gurteen and Jake Tabor hitting the woodwork.

A great week, three wins, two clean sheets and five goals scored.

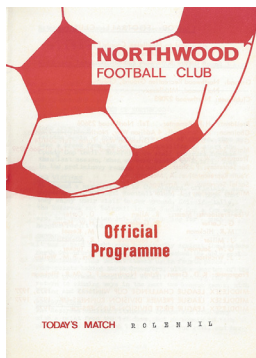

In his first senior outing in his two years at Northwood, Bob Taylor snatched a dramatic last minute in extra time winner in this exciting County Cup tie. The match was an exciting affair, with the Woods' high-riding London-Spartan League opponents Rolenmil providing stiff opposition. Indeed, the visitors, riding high this season, came to Northwood Park fully expecting a comfortable passage into the next round.

However, Northwood produced some fine football, the ball being pushed around with assurance and it was the midfield for the home side who controlled proceedings. Unfortunately, the Woods' fine approach



work was marred around the box, but this was by way of bad luck and good goalkeeping rather than any short comings with the Woods' strikers.

Martin Ellis had two fine, thrust-

ful runs, which saw two fine efforts saved, and one shot that thumped against a post and flew along the line to safety.

But it took a miraculous save from Dave Russell to keep the Woods level in the 80th minute when he scooped out a point-blank header. So to extra time, and in the final minute of a goal-less but exciting tie, Taylor struck. Robin Tidd crossed from the left and the diminutive Taylor raced in on the blind side to glance his header into the corner of the net.

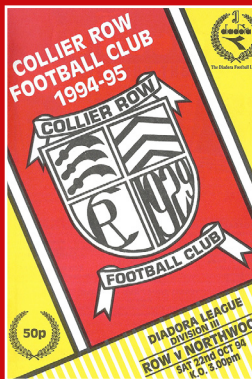
1994 Collier Row 4 Woods 1

Kevin Dobson and midfielder Tony Ponnou both shone for Woods but Beckles had to save well from Milton before he had little chance when Warner made it 2-0 for the home side after 25 minutes.

Evans made it 3-0 against a static



defence and, just before half time, Munday scored from 30 yards to make it 4-0.

Dobson continued to make some

penetrating runs after the break but home keeper Allen McKnight was seldom tested. Northwood, with the rain at their backs, restored some pride to their game and the home attack was stemmed to a degree, though John Walsh did have to head off the line.

Then, with 15 minutes left, the home defence failed to cut out a Chris Gell cross and Daren Morris stabbed the ball home.

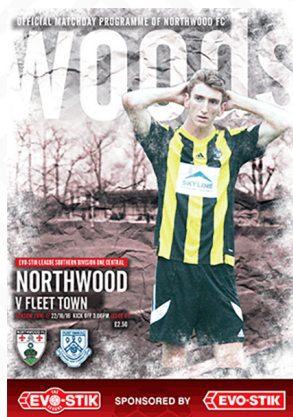

Goalkeeper Montel Joseph was soon in action, getting down low to push away Dan Williamson's deflected cross which was heading for just inside the near post. Then Pat Cox got his head to a Simba Mlambo centre which held up nicely but again Joseph was behind it well.

But on 19 minutes Northwood took the lead as Andy Lomas got forward into space and let fly from 25 yards with a shot that flew into the top corner to give goalkeeper Ryan

His shot was parried by Joseph and then Mark Burgess completed the needed clearance. At the other end, Wright knocked in a corner at the second attempt and when Mark Burgess headed it down, James Burgess volleyed over the bar from ten yards; neither side, could find the net again and the game petered out to a draw.

Northwood made it two wins out of two at Winklesbury as they followed up last season's success with another win over an in-form Basingstoke Town to extend their lead at the top of the table.

Woods welcomed back several players who were rested for the midweek Senior Cup win over Ashford Town, left-back Andy Lomas replacing Brandon Kalu while skipper Luke Tingey returned to central defence in place of the suspended Harry Gallagher. Carl Stewart was restored to the midfield with Ergys Pepaj making way while in attack, Juwon Akintunde and Rahim Jude-Boyd reverted to the bench with Josh Helmore and top scorer Sydney Ibie coming back in.

The hosts were pushed onto the back foot from the off as Jake Tabor had a shot blocked from Tingey's throw into the box before Micah Jackson threaded a ball through to Ibie who shot wide of the near post.

Northwood proceeded to keep the 'Stoke pinned back as they forced a series of corners, James Gurteen seeing his shot rebound off the far post as he latched onto Jackson's delivery before Tabor and Helmore had bites at the cherry as the ball bounced around the home box.

Woods' high pressing was preventing Basingstoke from creating any meaningful passages of play. However, the hosts managed to win a corner in a rare foray into opposition territory which resulted in Billy Upton's shot being charged down by the Northwood defence. And Woods threatened again before half-time as they worked another good position, but Jackson was slightly off balance as his speculative effort flew wide of the target.

Woods came out for the second period in a positive frame of mind and Stewart and Helmore combined to play Tabor into the box, the attacker upended by a lunging Upson with the referee pointing to the penalty spot - Ibie stepping up to send keeper Mark Scott the wrong way for his fifth penalty success in six appearances to give Northwood the lead on fifty minutes.

Woods looked to build on their lead as they continued to ask all the questions, Jackson seeing his low shot kept out by Scott with Ibie's follow up being blocked while Ricardo Alexander-Greenaway saw his strike from distance fly wide of the woodwork.

Basingstoke eventually began to offer more an attacking threat, Ezio Touray flicking the ball over Sam Jenkins before unleashing a low drive which was deflected onto

the inside of the post by the fingertips of Woods keeper Andrew McCorkell and cleared away to safety.

The 'Stoke maintained their attacking tempo with Ashleigh Artwell running at the Northwood defence before releasing a shot which was dealt with by McCorkell.

Woods made a change with twenty minutes left on the clock with Jenkins making way for Kalu who slotted into right-back. And having dealt with a spell of Basingstoke pressure, Northwood began to probe the hosts once again – Alexander-Greenaway's shot being blocked with Jackson's follow-up clearing the bar before a Tabor free-kick was touched onto the crossbar by Scott.

Woods continued the search for another strike which might put the game to bed, Jackson releasing Ibie whose low cross was intercepted by Scott Armsworth as Helmore looked to pounce.

Akitunde was introduced for Helmore on 81 minutes while Basingstoke utilised their full quota of substitutes as they looked to get something out of the contest. But the hosts were growing increasingly frustrated as Upton and Bradley were cautioned in the closing minutes.

Woods made their final change with a minute left on the clock as the impressive Jackson made way for Ronan Hutchins. And the visitors had another moment to deal with in added time as Touray had a shot blocked before dragging the rebound wide.

But Basingstoke were unable to find a way through an obdurate Northwood defence, which had been superbly marshalled by the imperious Tingey, with Woods securing the points to open up a seven-point gap over second-placed Marlow.

TO BASINGSTOKE & BACK

In the company of Andy Lomas, Sydney Ibie,
Luke Tingey & Teddy (not Stacey) Lomas

Friday night and discussions turn to plans for the weekend. After my better half decides that Basingstoke has nothing exciting to offer her in the way of retail therapy, it's agreed I will travel west on my own. Or will I? A quick WhatsApp message to fellow Leighton Buzzard resident Mr. Lomas and travel arrangements

for the next day's mouthwatering encounter in deepest Hampshire are sorted – I will jump in with our esteemed left-back and a couple more of the Bedfordshire contingent.

Technically speaking, Mr. Tingey – born and bred in our historic market town – can no longer be described

as one of the Bedfordshire contingent having decided to go over to the dark side, crossing the border into Buckinghamshire, and is now a resident of Aylesbury. But we know where his heart lies.

Saturday morning – with excitement mounting – Mr. Lomas confirms a pick-up time of just after 11.00 am. And with the timing to match the execution of one of his tackles, the White Polo appears with Mr. Tingey occupying the passenger seat and calls for me to sit in the back with Teddy. Sorry, was I hearing things? Had our talismanic midfielder, sadly absent with a long-term knee problem, made a miraculous recovery? Alas no, it was the canine Teddy, Andy's delightful Cockapoo whose enthusiastic greeting more than made up for the initial sense of disappointment.

Next stop Dunstable to pick up golden boot hopeful and 12-yard specialist Mr. Ibie – no chance of the senior member of the entourage occupying the front seat today but I was more than happy to afford our leading scorer all the room he required to prepare for the tough task ahead.

After a little diversion via Hemel Hempstead to drop off my new canine friend, we hit the motorway and the chat turns to the task ahead and the season so far. The boys are in agreement that we find ourselves top of the table without firing on all cylinders but have found a way to win games which bodes well for the months ahead. We all concur that nothing other than at least a play-off place would be a disappointment come April.

What about personal targets? Sydney is targeting 25 league goals and the coveted golden boot- he's well on his way. Talk turns to his recent prowess from the penalty spot and which way he might go should the opportunity present itself today. I was keen to know a little more about Sydney's football history.

I started training with Luton Town when I was 14 but then I dropped into Sunday football. I joined Hemel Hempstead and was given a two-year contract when I was 18 but spent time on loan at a few clubs including Barton Rovers and Welwyn Garden City before joining Chalfont St Peter. I then moved onto Potters Bar where I met Andy, Luke and Keags, but Covid got in the way. I jumped at the chance to come to Northwood and from the first training session and

scoring on my debut at Chipstead, I have really enjoyed being at a club where I feel comfortable and part of the team, in a great dressing room. I really value the support of the management and coaching team and trust in them.

I asked Sydney what players he admired as he was growing up.

I loved watching Thierry Henry, especially as I have a soft spot for Arsenal. I'm also a big fan of Cristiano Ronaldo despite him playing for Man United.

Luke followed a similar path to Sydney, starting out with Luton Town before joining the M.K. Dons Academy.

I was with the Dons where I was originally a midfielder. But I was converted into a right-back and then a central defender. There was a strong philosophy about playing from the back and I developed into a ball playing centre-back but sadly there was no professional contract at the end of it and I was training with Hemel Hempstead when I was 18. I moved onto Hendon and spent four good years with them playing a lot of the time as a defensive midfielder. The biggest disappointment was losing the Isthmian Premier play-off final to Dulwich Hamlet in a game we should have won. We had some great players including the likes of Niko Muir and a number of that team went onto play at a higher level. Next stop was Potters Bar under Lee O'Leary & Scott Cousins but when Sammy Moore came in as manager and brought in his own players, I grabbed the chance to join up with some old friends at Northwood and after struggling a little for consistency, a good pre-season has really set me up and I am now feeling strong and good about my game.

I ask Luke about his famous long throw and question how effective it has been.

I agree we don't really make the best use of it. I think we need to be smarter and could do with varying it a bit to keep the opposition guessing.

And on a personal level, are we going to see a few more goals from you this season following your bullet header against Southall the other week?

I would like to score more. Think I have scored four in a season before, and I did score from the halfway line once at M.K. Dons. But it's definitely something I would like to

improve on. Shame I can't get on the end of one of my throws!

With the journey continuing down the M3 and on target to meet the official meet time of 1.15 pm, I try and grab a word with our driver Mr. Lomas. I was keen to hear his thoughts on his previous successful stint at Northwood when he cleaned up by winning all three P.O.Y. trophies in his second season.

I loved my time at the Woods. It was great couple of seasons culminating in the Middlesex Senior Cup win. We had a great team spirit – very similar to what we have now- and we loved playing under Mark Burgess who was the sort of manager who you would run through brick walls for. All good things come to an end I guess and a few of us, including Steve Brown and George Nicholas, took the opportunity to make the step up to Harrow Borough before moving onto Potters Bar.

And that's where you scored that famous FA Cup goal in the televised game against Barnet, with no hint of an O.G. of course.

Definitely not! But it was a goal made in Northwood with Budden flicking on the corner and me doing the rest!

And a highlight of your time at the club?

It was a memorable day, although sadly we lost the replay and missed out on the first-round proper. The 3rd qualifying round win at Ware was a special day when we won with a goal in added time. But for me, the best day had to be when we secured promotion to the Isthmian Premier as champions with a last day win over Barking with a Budden header. The pundits had us down for relegation that season – sound familiar?

Another highlight in a career which began at Oxhey Jets of course.

Yes, starting out with the Jets as a 17-year-old with the likes of Steve Brown and Lewis Putnam. What a marksman Lewis was and still is – scoring 81 goals in a season in all competitions – a season where sadly we were denied promotion from the Spartan South Midlands due to ground-grading issues. But Jets, as do all the clubs I

have played for, mean a lot to me and I was happy to help out by scraping a team together and managing them, with the help of Mark Burgess, for that FA Cup tie against Kingstonian and taking them to a replay. Sadly, I had a holiday booked in Spain and couldn't make the replay.

And so, we arrive at our destination. And three and a half hours later we are celebrating a fantastic win over one of the in-form teams who are expected to be up there at the end of the season. As happened on our last visit to Winklebury, the Basingstoke drummer was silenced although this time he didn't pack up his drum and depart on 70 minutes and was generous in defeat – unlike some of his fellow supporters.

I do so enjoy it when 'little' Northwood upset the so-called big boys and their supporters, and occasionally club officials. Took me back to our 2004 trip to Dover Athletic early in our second Isthmian Premier season - Kevin Chakaodza's goal silencing the 500 plus crowd and prompting an urgent meeting between board, management and players while we waited for the customary post-match hospitality. How can we lose to the likes of Northwood! No Complaints btw with the hospitality we received from the 'Stoke.

With players showered and dressed, we made our way to the Winkle pub to enjoy a little post-match libation before saying our goodbyes and hitting the road back to Bedfordshire – setting up with a back three of yours truly as the spare man between Tingey and Bukowski, the Head Coach joining us for the return journey with instructions to make haste with a restaurant reservation for 9.00 p.m.

After an enjoyable, if rather cramped journey, where we reflected on the afternoon's events and looked forward to the challenges ahead, and with Messrs. Ibie & Bukowski safely delivered to their respective destinations we arrived back in LB. As I said goodnight to Messrs. Tingey & Lomas along with Teddy, who had rejoined us for the final leg of the journey, I considered how far we have come as a club in the last 12 months, what a great bunch of lads we have and what an exciting time to be a Woods supporter.

Thank you chaps for the company and a special thank you to our chauffeur Mr. Lomas. Here's to the next trip on the exciting journey ahead.

Northwood's first contest against Thatcham Town for over twenty years coincided with the arrival of former skipper Mark Burgess as the new first team manager and he replaced Gary Meakin in the dugout.

Thatcham had also seen recent changes at Waterside Park, with the experienced Dave Mudge coming in alongside Scott Tarr as a new management partnership after a poor start to the campaign had led to Neville Roach leaving his post. Several new players had arrived, including former Woods midfielder Miles Jones, and results had subsequently improved so the Kingfishers were looking to continue with that momentum.

The home side started confidently enough with Jacob Mingle firing a shot from distance straight at James Reading and then the Woods keeper pulled off a fine reflex save to keep out a near-post header from Tom Mudge. The Woods started to settle with Osei knocking a Spencer Bellotti cross wide of the target and then Bellotti raced onto a neat Reece Yorke ball and would have been in on goal but for a poor first touch which saw the ball bobble wide.

But with Thatcham's defence looking far from solid, a similar ball, this time from Craig White put Bellotti in again after 14 minutes and this time he controlled well and fired a crisp shot past Jon Beames in goal for the opening goal. Just three minutes later the former Oxhey front-man was making a nuisance of himself again and his chip had Beames beaten but it drifted wide of the post.

Northwood continued to enjoy the majority of possession, with the home side only looking to threaten from

set-pieces and when a corner was only half-cleared out to Hutchinson he took aim and fired a shot which flashed only just over the top corner of the goal. Adamson Ajayi was starting to make inroads down the left and a typical run and good long-range strike was stopped by Beames in an unconventional manner of blocking the ball like a defender but it was effective enough.

The Woods snatched a second goal after 29 minutes when Hutchinson reached a loose ball first on the edge of the box and poked an accurate shot past a couple of defenders and inside the far post, giving Beames no chance. It was almost three after 36 minutes when John Christian threaded a neat ball through and Bellotti again

finished in style but this time a late offside flag pulled the play back with the goal ruled out.

Beames made a good save to deny Osei two minutes later after he latched onto a knock-down from Bellotti but after 41 minutes Osei turned provider with a neat ball to Ajayi who drifted in and drilled a firm shot past the keeper. There was a further chance to increase that lead before the half-time break as Beames handled a tricky a back-pass but the low free-kick from eight yards never looked like breaching the defensive wall, though Beames was only a couple of yards away when he blocked with his legs.

Thattham made a double change to start the second-half with former Wood Charlie Hill one of the players to be subbed and, having been forced into once replacement due to an injury in the first period, it meant that they had their eleven for the second forty-five minutes. It did seem to have the desired effect of creating a more solid unit, though Hutchinson almost added his second as he jinked into the box from a wide position and pulled a shot across the face of goal which flashed just inches wide of the far post.

Chances were fewer for the Woods but all seemed to fall to the teenager with Hutchinson hitting one long-distance shot straight at Beames and then another well over after the defence had cleared a Bellotti cut-back.

The Kingfishers finally managed to make some inroads

Northwood welcomed Merstham for the very first time on Saturday afternoon, in a game which saw league leaders take on the league's lowest.

Top of the table Northwood were in fine form this season, winning six games on the trot but their previous two matches saw them suffer narrow defeats in each. On the other side of the spectrum, Merstham were winless

this season but managed an impressive 0-0 draw last week with ten men, so confidence must've been high with the away side.

Northwood made a few changes after last week's disappointing loss to Ashford. Micah Jackson came in for Ergys Pepaj which saw Jake Tabor play in a more central role. The second change saw Josh Helmore being given a rest as Juwon Akintunde came in up top to make his debut after signing from Uxbridge. Finally, Sam Jenkins had replaced Harry Gallagher due to the red card he received in the previous game.

Despite Merstham having the first chance of the game with Lindell Stewart's wide header, it was Northwood who were the team to take the lead. In the 12th minute,





debutant Akintunde had nicked the ball off Malakai Hyman, a couple of passes were put together and the ball was played out wide to Ibie, which he set back to Lomas who swung a peach of cross in. Merstham had dealt with the situation well for the time being, but it was at the sacrifice of a corner. Jackson stepped up to take and his wand of a left foot whisked up an excellent strike directly from the set piece into the top left of the goal.

The goal had injected energy into the game and chances started to come thick and fast. Aziz Sankho skied one over Andrew McCorkell's net, with Ibie and Jackson each emulating him on the other side of the pitch a few minutes later.

Merstham soon saw their efforts rewarded in the twenty third minute when they managed to breakaway swiftly on the counter-attack after a Northwood throw was hooked away. Lorenzo Lewis ran through and played a neat ball towards Charles Greenwood and with the help of a slight deflection, the ball travelled past an unfortunate McCorkell to make the game level.

A match which had been very stop start saw two penalty shouts not given in quick succession.

In the twenty seventh minute, Tabor had probed into the box and received a nice pass which he greeted with a lovely turn. The moment was soon shut down after Tabor dropped to the floor due to what appeared to be a push, but referee Jack Shepherd waved play on. Merstham then had a turn for a claim after Bryan Zepo cleverly let

the ball run through to goalscorer Greenwood which led to a strong challenge on him by a Northwood defender. Screams were pelted by the away fans, but Shepherd was unfazed and once again let play continue.

Merstham were growing in confidence. Their defence looked compact and composed and the team just seemed to be clicking. This was evident in the fortieth minute as captain Michael Kamara played a long ball out wide to Lewis, who expertly flicked the ball on with the outside of his boot. The number 10 continued to stride forward towards the keeper, where he emphatically finished into the far corner to make it 2-1. Merstham had taken the lead for only the second time of their season and Northwood seemed shellshocked.

As the referee blew for half time, the home side knew something needed to change. And change it did. Northwood started the second-half with high intensity and a lot of hunger. Shots were being let off, tackles were being committed and spirits were being lifted. Merstham wouldn't go down without a fight though and decided to fight fire with fire, putting a couple tackles in themselves. The referee had to call a lot of fouls as well as a few verbal warnings as he tried to play peacemaker between the sides.

Unfortunately for Lindell Stewart and his team, it appeared he bit off more than he could chew whilst trying to defend against Ibie in his own box.

In the fifty eighth minute, the former Wood made a

mark on his return to The Skyline Roofing Stadium by being drawn into a diving tackle and giving away a penalty after Ibie shimmied past him. The latter then stepped up and slotted it into the right corner to score his fourth spot-kick in five games but more importantly, Northwood were back on level terms.

This home side were buzzing and almost instantaneously they got another chance. Ibie got down the left-hand side again, this time playing a looping ball towards the back post where Tabor was waiting patiently to head the ball in off the bar for his first goal in a Northwood shirt. 3-2 to the home side!

The game was now open and had started to become end-to-end. Helmore, who had recently come on for Akintunde, saw his shot saved by Otuyo and the resulting rebound fell kindly to Jackson, but the central midfielder could only drag his shot off target. After Lewis had curled a free kick just wide, plenty of brilliant last-ditch tackles were made by each side, showing just how much this

game meant to them. Northwood missed chances to put the game to bed with Otuyo spectacularly saving Tabor's low shot with a strong hand and another direct corner hitting the crossbar.

The game from the seventieth minute saw many breaks in play, and it appeared Northwood's best defender on the day was the linesman and his offside flag - much to the frustration of the Merstham players.

The fans remained in full voice and created an amazing atmosphere which certainly contributed to Northwood's willingness to keep hold of the lead. That stubbornness was nearly broken during stoppage time, however, as Sankoh raced down the left wing and zipped a good ball into the box and directly onto the head of sub Charlie Alexiou but it wasn't meant to be as he smacked the bar from close range. After another scare from a cross into the box it appeared as if Northwoods hard work had paid off. They had survived.

THATCHAM TOWN FOOTBALL CLUB

CLUB HISTORY

Thatcham Town Football Club was founded in 1894. The club were originally known as Thatcham, with Town being added to its name in 1974. In the early years Thatcham played at The Marsh on Dunston Green, Brownsfield (home of the Cricket Club) and Station Road, before moving to Lancaster Close in 1949.

Floodlights were erected in January 1983 with Fulham FC visiting for a commemorative friendly match. To provide improved facilities, the club moved to Waterside Park in 1992/93, with the ground becoming known as The Stacatruc Stadium from August 2019.

The club joined the Reading Temperance League in 1896, winning Division Two in 1905/06. In 1953 Thatcham became founder members of the Hellenic League and won promotion to the Premier Division as Division 1 champions in 1958/59, 1964/65 & 1972/73. The club then won the Hellenic Premier Division title in 1974/75. Following spells in the Athenian and London Spartan Leagues, the club joined the newly formed Wessex League in 1986 and won the title in 1995/96. After finishing second in 2005/06, ground requirements were met and promotion to step four achieved.

The Kingfishers spent eight seasons in the Southern League Division One – seven in the South & West Division and one (2012/13) in the Central. After sixth-place finishes in 2006/07 and 2008/09, the club achieved its highest ever position in 2010/11. Despite being in the bottom half of the table at Christmas, the club earned 38 points from the final 15 matches to finish in fifth, however Thatcham were beaten at Sholing in the play-off semi-final.

Once safety was assured in 2013/14, the club resigned from the Southern League to cut costs by playing at a lower level. Town finished twelfth in their first campaign back in the Hellenic Premier, then second and fourth in the following seasons. However, in 2017/18 the club embarked on an incredible 40 game unbeaten run which saw them overtake long-time leaders Highworth Town and eventually pip Bracknell Town to the title in a thrilling end to the season, on goal difference.

After a season adjusting to step four football, in 2019/20 Thatcham sat on top of the Southern League D1 South table with eleven games to play. But with the club looking certain to achieve its highest ever finish, and promotion to step three a strong possibility, the Coronavirus pandemic struck, causing the season to be terminated.

After the subsequent departure of the club's management and many senior players, the 2020/21 season was set to be one of rebuilding with greater use of young, local players planned. With that season terminated after only 8 games, 2021/22 will again feel like a new start for the Kingfishers, especially with the club being transferred into the Isthmian League South Central Division.

Thatcham Town FC have enjoyed some memorable success in Cup competitions over the years. In 1989 the club reached the last eight of the FA Vase before losing to local rivals Hungerford Town. In the same competition a record attendance of 1,400 was set when Aldershot Town won 1-0 at Waterside Park in 1993/94.

However, in 2017/18 Thatcham went all the way and lifted the trophy at Wembley Stadium on a brilliant day

for the club. Victory over Bromsgrove Sporting brought realisation the club could be on the verge of something special, then over 2,200 attended the quarter-final win at Melksham Town as cup fever swept the town. Thatcham beat 1874 Northwich 1-0 and 3-2 in the two-legged semi-final, and took over 5,000 fans to Wembley as Stockton Town were defeated 1-0 in the final.

While the club are yet to progress beyond the Second Round Qualifying of the FA Trophy, 1996/97 saw Thatcham's best FA Cup run as they reached the Fourth Round Qualifying stage. In September 2019 the First Round Qualifying tie at home to Salisbury was streamed live by the BBC which gave the club further national exposure,

but unfortunately the visitors ran out narrow 3-2 winners.

Thatcham completed the Hellenic League and Cup double, by lifting the Hellenic First Division Cup in 1972/73 and the Premier Division Cup in 1974/75. During 2017/18 the club reached both League Cup finals, losing to Bracknell in the Challenge Cup and Binfield in the Floodlit Cup. Meanwhile during the 1990s Thatcham won the Wessex League Cup on four occasions, completing the double in 1995/96. In 1974/75 the club were beaten in the final of the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup but were awarded the trophy following a dispute between the victors, Wycombe Wanderers, and the Berks & Bucks FA.

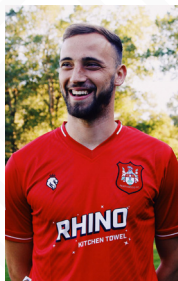
