




On the field seems less important today, but I'm fully aware of our recent form and I trust that everyone behind the scenes is doing everything they can to turn our form around.

A tough pill to swallow at the minute...

'd just like to start by asking you, our fans and family to continue to stick with us both home and awav.

There's no hiding the fact that 7 defeats in a row is nothing short of utterly unacceptable and we as a group need to take ownership for that and put things in place to make things right.

Following on from Tuesday night's defeat at home to Marlow, discussions and meetings took place before going into Thursday night's training session. A change of shape and some tweaks to our principles led to us going through a structured session in preparation for our upcoming games. Of course, working on a change of shape and also adding those tweaks isn't going to be something that works perfectly overnight. But we are more than aware that changes need to happen at both ends of the pitch with chances conceded and chances created

Hopefully we will have got something from that visit in preparation for these two games in four days here at the Skyline against Chertsey Town and Badshot Lea, where we will for sure need our Woods faithful behind us.



Welcome to the Curfews and the Baggies

A warm welcome back to the Skyline Roofing Stadium for another double-header programme production, this time covering a Pitching In Isthmian League game against Chertsey Town and then a Velocity Isthmian League Cup game versus Badshot Lea, newcomers to the League who we meet for the first-ever time.

We make no apologies for issuing a double-programme. Notwithstanding the short period between the two matches which would make producing a worthwhile edition difficult, we are simply not selling enough of what we think is a professional and hugely readable magazine to make it worth the extra effort from all the contributors to produce two inside four days. Percentage-wise, we have never had such a lowly amount of people attending the game not buying a programme.

The visit of Chertsey Town has been designated as Pete Barry day with the date being exactly seven years since our Chairman's dad passed away suddenly. He is fondly remembered by all of us here at Northwood FC.

Chertsey Town arrive here at the Skyline Roofing Stadium having made several squad changes to their established squad in the summer and they will be pretty pleased that the new side has settled well. At the time of writing, they sit in second place in the table, just one point behind the surprise leaders Ravnes Park Vale and their Surrey rivals are the only side that they have been beaten by so far in this campaign - losing 3-2 at Prince George's Playing Fields back in mid-September. Hayes & Yeading ended their FA Cup hopes and they lost to Hythe Town in the FA Trophy but they have a 100% home record in the league having defeated the Middlesex trio of Hanworth Villa, Southall and Uxbridge plus Hartley Wintney. They've also won twice recently on their travels, at Ashford Town (Middx) and Leatherhead though they have also been held to draws at Westfield and Binfield.

Last season, the Woods completed a "double" over our play-off rivals, winning 3-1 here at the Skyline and then 1-0 at Alwyns Lane. Josh Helmore and Sydney Ibie 2 (one penalty) netted here with Lee Lewis scoring for the Curfews while Shane Cojocarel bagged the only goal in the return.

Badshot Lea were promoted last season from the Combined Counties Premier South Division as runners-up to Raynes Park Vale and they took a little while to adjust to the higher level, losing at home to South Park and Ascot United as well as an away game at Southall in the opening weeks. But they are now unbeaten in the League since the beginning of September and that form has seen them rise up the table to a position just outside the play-off places. It's been away from home that they have recorded their best results with four away wins already at the time of writing.

In the Velocity Cup, they beat Ascot United 1-0 in the Second Round having had a bye in the first stage – the same as the Woods who defeated Marlow 2-1 in that last round.

League News

The form of the Woods has remained elusive with another three defeats in the League since our last programme notes (though that is before Tuesday night's trip to Leatherhead which was played after these notes were written).

Our two home games, against Chipstead and Marlow gave us the opportunity to return to our early season performance levels but, having enjoyed the better of the first-half, we fell behind just before the break. The second-half failed to bring about the required response and the Surrey side went home with all three points through a narrow 1-0 success.







The Marlow game was more difficult and our visitors dominated the firsthalf, establishing a 2-0 lead at half-time with two goals inside four minutes as the half was entering the final third. The Woods were gifted a goal early in the second-half through a defensive mix-up that led to Dan Williams scoring and there were hopes of an equaliser. Sadly, that never came and the Blues bagged a third late on to inflict our third successive home defeat.

Last Saturday we travelled to league leaders Raynes Park Vale and the home side played their sloping pitch really well to keep us under pressure for much of the first-half. They only scored once but it was enough to lead at the break. The Woods were more in the game after the break but had to rely on Andrew McCorkell to keep us in the game while the frame of the goal also came to our rescue. Yet, in the seventh minute of stoppage-time, a great chance to steal a point was wasted as Dan Williams poked a shot wide of an empty goal following good work by Curtis Brown.

The run of six successive league defeats is the worst since the Woods lost nine on the trot before (and slightly after) the dismissal of Ben Murray from his managers role back in 2021. The last time we lost seven on the trot in all competitions was a little before that, at the back end of the curtailed 2019/20 season under Rob Hrsell when there was a run of twelve losses in succession.

Our home game against Guernsey on Saturday 16th December will kick-off at 1pm as a request from our visitors to assist with their travel arrangements.

Plaver News

The Chipstead home fixture brought five changes with four players making their first starts of the season and Andrew McCorkell returning in goal following a three-game suspension. Curtis Brown, who had been injured in pre-season and then been introduced gradually as a substitute, started for the first time and he was joined by three new signings.

Prince Mbenaui was the most experienced of those. The 26-vearold was with Ashford Town (Middx) and Bedfont FC last season but has also turned out for Hendon. Uxbridge and Staines Town. Zeid Hannachi is a promising young midfield player who did well plaving against us for Binfield earlier in the season while defender George Milner-Smith has signed on a month's loan from National League side Aldershot Town. All have been involved in the last three matches. Meanwhile, Luke Brophy is playing a few games for Harefield United (now managed by former Woods midfielder Wayne Carter) to get some minutes under his belt and Jack Smith is in a similar role at Broadfields United. Jaden Newman is also playing for Leverstock Green on dual-registration while Matt Messer has had some. games at Aylesbury Vale and at Holmer Green.

Harry Gallager missed all these games due to an ankle injury picked up at Hanworth Villa but should be available to return to the squad this week. Godlove Oppong has also still been sidelined with an injury having only appeared in a couple of cup matches

so far this season. Hopefully, he will be fit to return shortly, while youth teamer Ben Crowder has also been out since the Cray Valley replay.

Under-18s

The Under-18s made it three from three in the Allied Counties League when defeating Chalfont St Peter 4-1 at the Skyline Roofing Stadium last Wednesday week. All the games came in the first-half and it was the Saints that scored first but the Woods then stormed back and Londin Latifi, making his first start of the season, netted an excellent hat-trick. Sarin Thapa also scored to keep Northwood at the top of the table. These notes had to be written before last Wednesday's game which was a quick return match at Chalfont St. Peter. Their next fixture is this coming Wednesday night, 25th October when we entertain Beaconsfield Town who are expected to be big rivals for a title challenge but suffered a shock 4-0 defeat at Wembley last week. Any support would be much appreciated.

Spartans FC

Our tenants have been leaking goals again in recent weeks, following a 4-1 defeat at Bedfont with a 2-4 home reverse when they took on FC Deportivo Galicia last Saturday. They were due to play at home to leaders Amersham Town on Tuesday night so that would have been a difficult one. They have no game this week but are back here at the Skyline Stadium next Saturday, 28th October when they play Westside at 3pm.



The second goal came when Romaine Walker dribbled into the penalty area. where Eagles brought him down and O'Sullivan slotted home the spot kick.





This was the first time that Northwood had notched more than seven in a League match for over 30 years. Niko Muir's accurate centre was met by a powerful header from Steve Brown to put Woods ahead, then Lee Grant cut in and blasted a shot past debut goalkeeper Garry Aulsbery at the near post, and after 25 minutes, it was 3-0 when Ryan Phillips gave Muir a simple chance to convert from close-range.

Chertsey pulled a goal back on 34 minutes, Andy White setting up John Pomrov to convert at the far post, but the Woods restored their three-goal cushion in the 41st minute when Brown set up Muir to turn and fire a shot into the roof of the net. Two minutes later Dave Lawrence crashed in no. 4.

On 54 minutes Craig White was tripped in the box and Muir completed his hat-trick and make it 6-1. The goal feast continued with Tom O'Regan and Jordan Wain quickly getting two back for the visitors. In the closing stages, Brown notched his second goal with





a firm header at the near post, then on 83 minutes Muir set up George Nicholas, who rounded it off with goal eight for Woods.



Then Helmore turned Quincy Rowe in the area and was brought down, and Sydney Ibie sent home the penalty to make it 2-0.

The Curfews reduced the deficit on 57 minutes when Lee Lewis sent a 20 yard free-kick over the wall and past Andy McCorkell.

It led to a nervous half-hour for the Woods but the closest that Chertsev came to levelling was after 75 minutes



when Trevan Robinson's centre came off a post. The Woods finally clinched after 11 minutes of added time after Jupp had come forward for a lastgasp corner for Chertsey - the ball was cleared and Rahim Jude-Boyd sent Ibie to slot into an empty net.


Kevin Perry scored just before the interval to make it 3-0.

Good work between John Powell and Martin Ellis set up the chance for Robin Tidd to crash home a superb drive from 18 yards, as Woods played some delightful touch football.

Northwood soon went 2-0 ahead, Roger Livingstone laying off a perfect ball between two defenders for Ellis to break through and shoot home.

Within two minutes of the restart, Northwood were 3-0 up. A series of one-twos between Livingstone and





Ellis finished with a flighted ball from the latter into the path of Powell, who burst through to chip the ball over the despairing keeper.

The Woods team-work kept them well in command even after a scrambled effort from Allen had made it 3-1. Northwood were soon three ahead again, and the persistence

of Livingstone was rewarded with a second goal for Ellis. The tall striker lost possession, fought back and won a couple of challenges before finding Ellis, who beat one defender and crashed the ball home.

The Woods made another change on seventy five minutes as they bolstered their attacking options with Brown replacing Mbengui.

But the visitors had more defending to do as Gallagher's cross-shot was clawed away by McCorkell at the far post.

The hosts were reduced to ten men on 80 minutes after having used all their substitutes and Lewis having to leave the field after a clash of heads with Williams.

Northwood utilised their full quota of substitutions as Harry McCorkell replaced Milner-Smith with the visitors still hoping to salvage something in stoppage-time.

And the Woods were presented with a alorious opportunity in the seventh extra minute as Brown robbed a defender and broke clear before squaring to Williams, the latter having to break his stride slightly before rolling the ball wide of the unguarded net off his weaker right foot - extinguishing any hopes Woods had of putting an end to their losing run.

rganised football was evident in Chertsey well into the Victorian era, but county affiliation did not take place immediately. The official founding of the club took place in 1890 when matches were played in the West Surrey League.

The first success came in 1897 when the Surrey Junior Cup was secured. A one year gap took place before football resumed in the same competition which eventually became the East and West Surrey League. A further halt in football took place during the Great War but soon after. in 1919, the club joined the Surrev Intermediate League where it stayed, uneventfully, until 1939 and a further break.

An invitation to become founder members of the Surrey Senior League was not taken up in 1923 but membership was later assumed, on attaining senior status in 1946.

The club has played at various locations within the parish (Willow Walk, Free Prae Road Staines Lane and Chilsey Green) before settling down at the present home in 1926. The suffix 'Town' was added to its title some 24 years later. The ground was donated by Sir Edward Stern as a football ground to the 'premier club in the parish'. Next door, a similar trust provides facilities for Chertsev Cricket Club. The main stand was constructed in the mid fifties: the original clubhouse added in 1960 and the first covered enclosure was built some three years later. Cover behind each goal was added in 1994 and 2010 respectively.


Chertsev became members of the Surrey Senior League in 1946, but

success was scant until 1960 when winning the league championship. This was repeated twice in the next three years, The League Cup was also won on three occasions. The club could not progress to the preferred Corinthian League so, in 1963 it controversially turned professional to enter the Metropolitan League. It gave an entertaining three but, the cost was too much. A drop to the Greater London League for one season occurred before a further shift to the Spartan League was made in 1967.

Indifferent results then doaged the club for almost two decades. This situation was briefly relieved in 1974/75 when the club were league and league cup runners up to an up an coming Farnborough Town. Meanwhile, the fabric of the club was being built up behind the scenes and despite lack of prominence on







the park, movement was made via the London Spartan (1975/76) and Athenian leagues through to the Isthmian family with a place in Division Two South in 1984. Instant relegation to the Combined Counties League was suffered but a rejuvenated side won

promotion back to Isthmian ranks within the year whilst winning the League Cup on the way.

The club was rewarded with good league positions but further promotion denied at first. The worst season after returning to the Isthmians came when the two Division Twos were split in 1991 and a place in the new Division Three had to suffice. This position was quickly rectified with a runner's up slot the next season. The club also reached the quarter finals of the F.A. Vase, emulating a similar performance in 1987/88. One year later, 102 points and a runner's up promotion place to Division One was nailed. The League Cup was also secured together with the Carlsberg Trophy in the same campaign along with the League Charity Shield and the Isthmian 'Team of the Season' trophy.

Only one campaign was required in Division One before further promotion, to the Premier Division. The first season at that level was one of consolidation but the second was more difficult. A late rally was experienced, but was insufficient to avoid the drop to Division One. Two subsequent Division One campaigns were comfortable but the third proved too difficult after a very poor first half of the season.

Relatively respectable positions were attained for the next two seasons and then a return to Division One, taking a place in the revised south section in the Isthmian re-organisation. The side was not able to compete at this level and relegation to Division Two was suffered in 2003. With the dissolution of the division, the club was allocated to Combined Counties League in 2006. Promotionally hopeful situations were created regularly over the five terms in that competition.

Finishing as runners up in 2011 was enough to secure promotion to

Division One Central of the Southern League, Unspectacular, but safe. performances were achieved for two seasons but relegation was suffered in 2014, and with it a return to the Combined Counties League where four modest seasons prevailed.

A massive change occurred in the 2018/19 season that resulted in the league championship being secured with 13 points to spare. This led to promotion back to the Isthmian ranks and a place in the South Central Division

However, more memorable, was winning the FA Vase after turning over the score in the final to beat Crav Valley 3-1.

The combination of these two feats made the 2018/19 the most successful season ever for the club. Covid affected the next two campaigns, but then a runners up spot was attained at the end of the 2021/22 season but the side lost

out in extra time of the final of the play offs.

Following a turbulent season as far as managerial appointments was concerned, The current manager, Mark Harper, was appointed at the start of the current season. The chairman's role is held Mark Turner. The club, a Charter Standard member, also has a comprehensive junior section of boys at all ages. Chertsey Town's nickname, the 'Curfews' is derived from a locally famous bell that hangs in nearby St. Peters Church. The bell has rung out the evening curfew, now ceremoniously, for over five hundred years.


Connor Lee

The Woods were back on the search for an equaliser as Firth saved well from Brown when he ran onto Hannachi's through-ball before the same player had a shot blocked in the box with Anokye-Boadi's follow-up header being clawed away by the Chipstead stopper.

While Woods continued to press forward, they were increasingly vulnerable to the counter-attack with McCorkell doing well to keep out an attempt from Alfie Young.

Northwood made a double change on seventy two minutes with Jenkins and Otote replacing Hannachi and Brown with Dunbar-Bonnie moving into an advanced position on the left flank as the hosts switched to a back three. And the change almost reaped benefits as Bonnie sent over a pinpoint cross which was met by Anokve-Boadi, but his header cannoned off the Chipstead crossbar

The Woods made a final change as Tingey replaced a tiring Stacey in

defence, but the hosts were finding it increasingly difficult to make much of an impression at the other end of the pitch against a well-drilled Chipstead defence.

And it was the visitors who looked the more likely to add to their lead as McCorkell produced another save to keep out a shot from substitute Dan Berry before the latter thought he had sealed the points for his team as he converted from close range, only to be denied by an offside flag.

However, the single goal proved to be enough as the Woods were unable to fashion an equaliser with the visitors deservedly taking the points back to Surrey.

recclesham, Surrey based Badshot Lea are managed by the duo of Gavin Smith and Dave Ford, assisted by Daniel Bailey and Lee Dyson.

With a stronger squad and a focus on developing young players, there is renewed optimism for the 2022/23 season as the Baggies look to build on last season's 5th place finish.

Early history suggests that the village football club was formed in 1904 after a meeting at the local village hall.

The team affiliated to the Surrey County Football Association in 1907. The club progressed through the three divisions of the Surrey Intermediate League, promoting to the Surrey Premier League in 1986.

1997 marked the year that the first youth team joined the football club. This marked the beginning of a very successful Youth and Colts section of the club.

The club were given an extra facility to accommodate the growth success of the vouth teams.

Dave Ford took over at the helm as manager with Nathan Fealey in 2004.

In their first season they took the side to a credible 7th place finish in senior football, as members of the Hellenic League.

Lea finished the season around mid table and reached two cup finals. only narrowly losing out to Sandhurst Town in the Aldershot Senior Cup on penalties in 2006.

Badshot Lea secured a ground sharing agreement with nearby club Farnborough a year later.

Under the quise of Dave Ford's management. Badshot finished their first season at step 5 in a respectable 11th position.

The National League Committee sanctioned a move to the Combined

Counties League in 2008. Following this, the Surrey club reached the 2nd qualifying round of the FA Cup and the 3rd round proper of the FA Vase.

A year later Baggy Lea lifted the Aldershot Senior Cup, defeating Fleet Town on penalties.

Manager Dave Ford departed the club and was replaced by Mark Anderson.


Anderson led the team to an excellent league finish, as well as progressing through to the FA Cup Third Qualifying Round


In December 2018 Gav Smith took up the managerial hot seat jointly alongside Dave Ford at Westfield Lane.

Badshot Lea finished the 2021/22 campaign towards the top of the table in 5th place, recording 24 wins from 38 league games; recording only one away defeat all season.






