






IAN'S INSIGHT



Welcome to the Reds

A warm welcome back to the Skyline Roofing Stadium for this afternoon's Middlesex derby fixture against our old rivals from Uxbridge Football Club. We hope everyone connected with our visitors enjoys their afternoon with us and we wish you a safe journey back home this evening.

Uxbridge have made giant strides as a club this season with the refurbishment of their Honevcroft stadium which has included a new stand and most importantly, a new artificial pitch being laid which, with its quaranteed income streams. should enhance the club's ambitions to progress to new levels in the future.

That progress may have to wait for at least another season though as their challenge for play-off places has stalled in recent weeks with a run of seven matches, mainly against sides in the top six, without a win. It has left them 13 points off the play-off places with sixteen matches to play.

Our away fixtures this season was played just before their new pitch was ready so we travelled to Arbour Park, home of Slough Town, for the match. It was an entertaining match with Uxbridge taking a 2-0 half-time lead with goals from Brad Pagliaroli and Bernard Mensah. The Woods hit back through Dan Williams but an Ezra Ndukuba kept the Reds in control. Sam Jenkins gave us hope at 3-2 and then a Jack Smith penalty could have levelled it but that was saved and Uxbridge wrapped it up with a Dean Morgan strike two minutes from time.

The corresponding fixture last season ended in a 1-0 win for the Woods thanks to a sublime 25-yard volley from Harry Gallagher. Uxbridge



had won their home game by the same scoreline

Today's match has been kindly sponsored by Thomas Vosper with son Ellis leading the side out for the match as mascot. We hope they enjoy their afternoon with us. Also, Paul Byrne (pictured above in his playing days) is celebrating 64 years since making his Woods first-team debut and has kindly offered to buy all the players a drink at the end of the game today so "thank you" to our club stalwart.

League News

Our last home game was a close one but ultimately saw us fall to a narrow 1-2 defeat against play-off chasing Leatherhead who looked a very good side on the day. The Tanners grabbed the lead after 20 minutes but the Woods stayed in the game and competed well. When Leatherhead doubled their lead ten minutes into the second-half, the chances of hitting back against a side that could boast the best defensive record in the division seemed slim and so it proved. But debutant Lucas Sinclair did head in a goal in the final minute of normal time to raise hopes for

the four minutes of stoppage-time, though nothing really came of it.

Our game against Hanworth Villa a few days later was postponed due to a solidly-frozen pitch here at the Skyline and there was yet another postponement last Saturday when the hoped-for thaw didn't arrive quite in time to allow our visit to Westfield go ahead. We've still not met our friends from Woking vet this season after a series of postponements at hoth venues

All of these games have been rearranged for Tuesday night's and we now have midweek fixtures all the way through to mid-March. Historically, our crowds are always way down when we play on Tuesday night's rather than on Saturdays so I would say please make every effort to attend these rearranged matches, especially here at the Skyline as your support does make a massive difference both to the team and to the club financially.

On Tuesday night we have a really tough trip to third-placed Marlow but are then back here at Northwood for two more home games against other top six teams in Raynes Park Vale and Westfield. We then go to leaders Chertsev Town so it's a difficult run of matches.

Cup News

Our hopes of cup glory this season came to an end on Tuesday night when our Middlesex Senior Cup quarter-final at Southern Premier side Hendon ended in a narrow 3-2 defeat. It was a good performance by the Woods side against a home side that fielded a strong line-up having won at former Football League club Oldham Athletic in the FA Trophy just ten days earlier. Dan Williams put the Woods into an early lead to set a good tone but former Woods striker Niko Muir showed his class. firstly to get Hendon back into the









tie before half-time with a goal but then went on to complete a hat-trick. That proved enough to see Hendon into the semi-finals but when Kofi Anokve-Boadi reduced their lead to 3-2 on 75 minutes, it renewed the spirit of the side and the Woods did go close to levelling a couple of times.

Plaver News

There has been quite a bit of player movement over the last couple of weeks as the management team look to strengthen the squad for the task ahead - making sure that we keep clear of the relegation zone. Making his Woods debut against Leatherhead was Lucas Sinclair who has played at Step 3 for both Chesham United and Harrow Borough this season. Chesham is his parent club but joins us on dualregistration for what we hope will be an extended period. He crowned an impressive debut with a goal.

After two goals in seven games for today's opponents Uxbridge, our top scorer Dan Williams has returned to the Woods for a second spell and

he marked that return on Tuesday night with the opening goal taking his tally to thirteen for Northwood this season. Welcome back Dan!

We also signed young striker Archie James from our near-neighbours Oxhey Jets. The 18-year-old has made a great impression with the Jets this season and we welcome him to the Woods. It will be interesting to see how he adapts to the higher level as the season progresses.

Going the other way, Curtis Brown is currently dual-registered at former club Avlesbury Vale while Zeid Hannachi has joined Bedfont Sports and Tyler Robinson is concentrating on plaving at Reading City, Leslie Duru, who came in on dualregistration, has now made a move to ioin Berkhamsted, while Reece Cameron has been recalled by parent club Harrow Borough.

On the injury list still are Riccardo Alexander-Greenaway and Godlove Oppong but we hope they will be available for selection soon. Harry McCorkell should be back in contention for a place today.

Under-18s

The Under-18s ended a sevenweek soiourn due to the weather a couple of weeks ago with an away game at Beaconsfield Town in the Allied Counties League which saw them complete a double over their opponents, winning 2-0. They showed some signs of rustiness in front of goal in the first-half but came good after the break with goals from Tom Reid and Sarin Thapa securing all three points. They remain top of the East Division table but, after one postponement, they were due a difficult cup-tie on Wednesday night when they were scheduled to play at home to Uxbridge in the Middlesex Senior Youth Cup. These notes had to be prepared before the result of that game was known but it would be great to have a semi-final to look forward to. They are away at Rayners Lane on Tuesday night.

Spartans FC

It's been a difficult time with postponements for our tenants who have not played a match in 2024 as yet! Their last match was a 10-0 defeat at runaway leaders Amersham Town – former Woods forward Jake Tabor hit five of them included two in the first five minutes - back on December 30th. They will definitely get back in action this afternoon as they are away to Langley, who groundshare at today's visitors Uxbridge on their artificial pitch. However, at the moment. Spartans are not scheduled to play here at the Skyline until Tuesday 20th February when they entertain Everslev & California with five successive away games before then.

FROM THE TRAINING PITCH

WITH NEW GOALKEEPER COACH NICOLAI COLLINS



ince joining the Woods as goalkeeping coach, I have been made to feel nothing but welcome by everyone at the club.

Joining the Woods was an easy decision to make following a chat with Ben who quaranteed a culture of unity, hard-work, determination and laughter. I have noticed this on and off the pitch at training, match-days and even in a midweek swimming session.

Whilst since my arrival we've had more cancellations than I've had hot dinners I will elaborate on my experiences at training, match-days and swimming.

Training is intense and the squad pushes itself to its limit. The sessions are balanced and have a good blend of vigour, fun and team-building.

Since arriving I have included a couple of Northwood youth goalkeepers in the training sessions and am working on developing the goalkeeping community at the club.

So far, we have worked mostly on footwork and general handling - but I am always keen to expand the group with the purpose of developing, retaining or recruiting talent. The more goalkeepers we have the more match-realistic scenarios we can create in our practices (provided the quality is there).

On match-days the culture is clear. The Woods are the first team in the clubhouse and to any opposition team the camaraderie is clear from the moment they enter the door: whether Harry Gallagher is belting tales of Butlins, Harry McKenna is woofing, or Teddy Stacey is meowing. There's definitely some pretty unusual banter but I'll roll with it! Either way the dressing room atmosphere is quality.

I have enjoyed working with Roraigh who is a fast-learner and I expect will have a successful football career whether as a professional or in non-league.

We like to get out early for our warm-ups so that we can take our time and instil a well-balanced mix of composure, calmness but also alertness in what we do. The extra time sets the correct mental tone for a match-day which is so important for a position where psychology is so key.

I have been impressed with Roraigh so far. He has demonstrated his capabilities with aerial balls, shotstopping, and for his age being a commanding presence at the back. I am sure there is a lot more to come from Roraigh.

Whilst I have only been involved in two games in January both have

been real team performances. The Met-Police win wasn't the prettiest but sometimes those can be the toughest games to come through with all three points. I was also impressed our performance against Leatherhead in which we were unlucky to not come away with a point.

Anyway. I'll sign off with swimming. Last Thursday we went for a team aquatics session which included floating SpikeBall, Vollevball, a longest-handstand contest, best belly-flop, longest distance under water, most headers in a group and most forward rolls. I am proud to say I was the first to nominate myself for the handstand and with some fine technique won my team a point with a 15-seconder. If you have any questions on performing a handstand in water, feel free to come and find me!

It's a pleasure being one of the Woods and I look forward to helping the club to achieve its goals! But from what I've seen so far this is undoubtedly the best dressing room in the division.

Third Division Northwood began this Diadora League Cup tie against their Division One opponents brightly, and Paul Canoville was the architect of much of the early Woods pressure. Sean Dawson was equal to Greg Phillips' shot from the edge of the area after Simon Elliott had flicked on a Canoville corner on 23 minutes and then a minute later Canoville was also denied by the Uxbridge keeper, when his chip-shot was floating into the top corner until Dawson tipped the ball

The Woods continued to dominate the game and looked to have taken the lead after 36 minutes. Canoville fed Dave Nolan on the right, he centred for Devane whose flicked header was then converted by Rob Holland but the linesman ruled it out with an offside flag. Justice seemed to be done just

before the interval when Grea Phillips floated in a free-kick and Uxbridge defender Gary Downes attempted a clearance which soared past his own goalkeeper to give Northwood the lead.


Both full-backs continued with

their impressive performances into the second half and after 57 minutes a typical run from Nolan ended in a shot which forced Dawson into a fine save. Uxbridge's main chance came on 68 minutes when a free-kick ran loose to Sylvester Williams but the striker shot just wide of the taraet.

Uxbridge rarely looked like grabbing the equaliser and the Woods were left to celebrate their second victory over their Middlesex rivals inside a vear.

A penalty save from Mitch Swain followed by two John Christian strikes earned the Woods three valuable points from this Boxing Day local derby fixture at Honeycroft as Uxbridge's long eleven-match unbeaten league run came to a crashing end.


The game was heading goal-less towards half-time when the Woods put together a good move which saw Romaine Walker and Christian work the ball forward to Oliver Hawkins. whose crisp shot was tipped over the bar by Liam Stone. From the resulting corner, swung deep to the far post by Ronavne Marsh-Brown, Hawkins headed down towards the near post and it went through the legs of Hussein Warsame to give Northwood the lead at the break.

Just two minutes after the restart, Warsame went to ground in the box under a challenge from Reece Yorke and the referee pointed to the spot.









But the division's top scorer Michael Murray was unable to take advantage from the penalty as Swain dived across to keep out his low shot.

After 53 minutes Walker jinked across from the left and he then set up Christian for a strike which swung away from Stone and just inside the post. Just three minutes later, Marsh-Brown's free-kick near the box rehounded off the defensive wall but the ball rolled towards Christian who picked out the top corner with a thirtyyard screamer which gave Stone no chance - game over!

> The visitors then took the lead in the 38th minute, Mahlondo Martin sliding in at the back post to finish off a low driven cross from Bitmead and it looked to be a frustrating second half for Northwood with chances and penalty shouts not going their way.

But in the 83rd minute Ryan Haugh was deemed to have handled in the box. and Charlie Hayford calmly buried his penalty into the roof of the net. The



turnaround was completed with one minute left, Tyrone Pink floating the ball into Holness, who controlled with his chest and finished into the bottom left corner, cementing an outstanding comeback win for Northwood.

I decided to bring on Chris Boothe late on to add some steel, and it certainly worked when he grabbed the winner!"

The game began with Northwood in command hut it was Hanwell who took the lead from a Gurling second half free-kick.

Pacquette then latched onto a through ball to

equalise, but Boothe popped in the 86th minute to snatch a winner after a great ball from Ian Lancaster.

Northwood's losing run was extended to four league games after they succumbed at home to their West Country visitors, despite putting in a spirited second half display. Woods' finished the half strongly and were unlucky not to go into the halftime break on level terms when Peter Dean latched onto Bradley Hewitt's knockdown from Elloitt Buchanan's far-post cross, but he scooped the ball over with the goal at his mercy.

The second half was only three minutes old when Woods' task became even harder as they conceded another soft goal. Jimmy Cox managed to get beyond the defence before squaring

Kempston's dominated early on and Woods succumbed to the early pressure when they went behind on nine minutes with a goal straight out of the route-one manual. Jake Newman latching onto a knockdown from 'keeper Martin Conway's free-kick into the box to shoot past Xavi Comas.,

But Northwood gradually found their feet, with Harry Newman twice going close, before Evans Kouassi shot high and wide from a good position. But the Woods were still only one goal behind at the break despite not creating much in front of goal and hopes were high that they could still turn things around.




GOAL ALERT 0-2 Alpha Diallo (54 mins)





n the late 19th century the game of "football" was growing in popularity and on the 3rd February 1871 a group of eminent local businessmen held the inaugural meeting of Uxbridge Football Club.

Friendly games against local opposition were played in the early vears, until the FA Cup was entered in 1873. A First Round Victory over Gitanos set-up a Second-Round tie against eventual finalists Royal Engineers, which the Engineers narrowly won 2-1. It was at this time that Uxbridge could boast amongst its ranks a Full England International. Hubert Heron played for England on two occasions whilst an Uxbridge player before he moved to Wanderers FC where he gained further international honours. His brother Francis, formerly of Uxbridge, also played for England after joining him at Wanderers FC.

The club changed its colours to Oxford


Blue and Cambridge Blue shirts in 1874 but they were in financial difficulties and folded later that year. The main problem for Uxbridge was the lack of a permanent home ground fa problem that was to plaque them until the middle of the next century). the committee searched the town for a suitable base but were thwarted at every turn and they led a nomadic existence, moving ground every few vears.

The enthusiasm for a team in Uxbridge was still prevalent and the Club was reformed in 1879. In 1886 Uxbridae FC amalgamated with another local club, Uxbridge Crescents, and played under this name in season 1886/87, before reverting to plain old Uxbridge the following season. It was at this time that the Red Shirts, which are still worn today, were adopted and the nickname "The Reds" was born.

Their first trophy was won in 1889 when they lifted the West Middlesex

Cup. The end of the 19th century was a particularly successful period for The Reds as they won the West Middlesex Cup on three further occasions and also won the prestigious Middlesex Senior Cup twice. In 1894, the outstanding achievement was in reaching the final of the F.A. Amateur Cup in 1898. This was the clubs first season in the competition and they had to win eight ties before meeting Middlesbrough in the final at Crystal Palace, losing 2-0.

During this successful period for the club they became founder members of Division Two of the Southern League in 1894, finishing fourth in their first four seasons. However, in season 1898/99 they finished next to bottom and the dwindling crowds meant that financially the club was once again in trouble. A decision was therefore taken to withdraw from the Southern League and join the local Middlesex League to try and stabilise



the club. However, a majority of the more talented players joined other clubs and they struggled in their new surroundings, finishing bottom with only one point from their 14 games. At the end of the season the club once again folded.

The reformed Uxbridge FC joined the West Middlesex League for the 1902/03 season. In 1904 the Great Western Suburban League was entered and here they stayed until the outbreak of the First World War. Their best finish during this period was as Runners-up to Brentford Reserves in 1910/11. They also won the Middlesex Charity Cup on two occasions in 1908 and 1913, as they looked to reestablish themselves as a force in the football world

Following the end of hostilities Uxbridge joined the Athenian League and added "Town" to their name. An unsuccessful first Athenian League campaign saw them relegated back to the Great Western Suburban League in 1920. A successful four seasons saw them back in the Athenian League in 1924 where they remained until 1937. Two poor seasons saw them finish bottom of the Athenian League in 1936 and 1937 and the club failed to be re-elected. They joined the Spartan League for the 1937/38 season, dropping "Town" from their name at the end of the campaign stood proudly at the summit.

Championship celebrations however were cut short when it was discovered that The Reds had played an ineligible player and were deduced six points, placing them in third position behind. Following the debacle of their one and only season in the Spartan League they resigned and joined the London League prior to the Second World War.

During the war years they continued to play and joined the newly formed Great Western Combination League before re-joining the London League in 1945. Uxbridge were founder members of the Corinthian League in 1946 and remained in this league for the next seventeen years.

Finally, in 1948, after over three quarters of a century of searching, a ground of their own was purchased the ground was named after a large house that stood on the land and "Honeycroft" was the new home of Uxbridge Football Club.

This was a successful period in the club's history as they finished in the top five of the Corinthian League on no less than eight occasions. A reorganisation of Non-League football saw the end of the Corinthian League in 1963 and club found itself once again in Division One of the Athenian League.

This was a lean time for The Reds. they were relegated to Division Two in 1967 and financial problems once against beset them. They gained national publicity in 1976 when England were looking for a side to play as part of their warm-up for the forthcoming World Cup campaign. Uxbridge took on a full-strength England at Wembley, losing 8-0.

The ground problems that had blighted Uxbridge throughout their history surfaced once again and the club had to find a new home. In 1978 they moved to their current headquarters in Horton Road, Yiewsley. The club won the Middlesex Charity Cup for the fourth time in 1982, their first silverware for 31 years,

and moved to the Isthmian League in the same year, winning promotion to Division One in 1985.

In 2004 the club were moved across the pyramid to the Southern League and have reached the Play-Offs on three occasions.

In 2018 Uxbridge were moved back across the pyramid, re-joining the Isthmian League in the South Central Division.


They have won the Middlesex Charity Cup on three more occasions in the last eight years.

In 2019 Uxbridge appointed only their sixth manager over the past 51 years. Ron Clack was in charge for 18-years from 1970, followed by Peter Marshall for one season, Michael Harvey for three, before George Talbot took the reins for fourteen seasons in 1992. In 2006 Tony Choules became the man in charge, being replaced by our current manager Danny Edwards in 2019.

The Middlesex Chairty Cup was won for the 8th time in 2022, with a 2-0 victory over Hanwell Town, Last season the club had a fantastic run in the FA Trophy, reaching the 3rd Round where they lost to National League side Dagenham & Redbridge.



Joined the club in October 2023 from Beaconsfield Town. Strong central defender who has previously played for Slough Town, Binfield and Bedfont Sports.


SHAUN PREDDIE

ISTHMIAN LEAGUE ROUND-UP





SOUTH CENTRAL

Southall have now notched seven successive wins in our own division to really mount a challenge for the South-Central Division title but they are doing it the hard way as their last five victories have all come by just one goal, including their late success here at the Skyline Roofing Stadium. However, it is Chertsey Town who still lead the way with their long-unbeaten run being extended by some very high-scoring winning form - 22 goals scored in their last four matches including last week's brilliant 6-0 defeat of Uxbridge at Honeycroft. The Reds are now seven games without a win as their play-off hopes have dropped away prior to their visit to the Skyline this afternoon.

Raynes Park Vale have hit a bad spell with three successive 4-1 defeats to the rival trio of Leatherhead, Chertsey Town and Marlow making it six games without a win, It has strengthened the play-off prospects of all those three clubs while giving the likes of Hartley Wintney, Westfield and South Park (Reigate) renewed hopes of pushing towards the play-off places in the second-half of the season.

At the other end of the table, Binfield, under the new management of Ross Weatherstone, notched their first win of the season last Saturday, recording a 2-1 success at Metropolitan Police. The Moles still have plenty of work to do if they are to climb out of the bottom two but this is a good platform on which to build. Guernsey have lost just one of their last five games to enable them to climb the table and get away from the danger-zone but it's Chipstead and Ashford Town (Middx), as well as ourselves, who need to find some winning form to avoid being dragged into the relegation battle. Corinthian Casuals, despite their management change, haven't been able to change their fortunes as yet, losing their last six matches and not scoring a goal in their last four games.

PREMIER

Hornchurch remain under interim management following the departure of Steve Morison to Sutton United and their lead was cut to six points (with a game in hand) after they held thirdplaced Billericay Town to a creditable 1-1 draw. This allowed Chatham Town to close in on them while Billericay Town followed up with a 5-0 thrashing of Lewes. Enfield Town were held to successive draws - 1-1 at Horsham and then a 3-3 draw at Hashtag United but remain well-placed while Wingate & Finchley stay fifth with their last result being a 5-1 defeat of Whitehawk.

Potters Bar Town had lost 3-0 at Lewes a week earlier so will be looking to get back to the form that had seen them climb out of the danger-zone. Cheshunt remain in that bottom four having lost five games in a row while both Margate and Kingstonian have failed to win in their last ten games and both will need to reverse that form if they are to survive.

Concord Rangers, who lost the Island derby at Canvey Island a couple of weeks ago, are still bottom of the table but a run of postponements at least means that they have up to seven games in hand to the teams above them if they can find some semblance of form that they need to avoid a second successive relegation.

NORTH

Lowestoft Town remain top of the North Division with games in hand to the chasing pack but the battle for the play-off places is building up to be a real battle with as many of nine other clubs all within striking distance at present. I watched two of those sides, Heybridge Swifts and Bowers & Pitsea play out an entertaining 2-2 draw last Saturday and both sides looked strong while Felixstowe & Walton United are in second place at the moment. Brentwood Town, Bury Town and Gorleston are all unbeaten

in their last six matches and for me, it may be Bury who might come through strongly in the second-half of the campaign.

At the bottom, the demise of East Thurrock United - they appear to be reforming at Step 6 or 7 for next season - means there is just one relegation spot and Stowmarket remain hot favourites as they are still without a win this season with 22 of their 36 games played.

SOUTH EAST

The two sides that ended the Woods FA competition campaigns this season look set to have a real battle for the South-East division promotion place with Ramsgate still currently 11 points clear at the top of the table despite losing their first game since the opening day of the season a couple of weeks ago, when they lost 4-2 at Lancing. Cray Valley PM have moved into second place but they remain unbeaten and have three games in hand to the Rams. Ramsgate have won all eleven of their home games played while the Millers have won all eight away games that they have competed in.

Lancing, Herne Bay and Sittingbourne are going best of the chasing pack at present while at the bottom. Beckenham Town and Erith & Belvedere are in the danger zone and also struggling to find any form as well. It's a big drop for Beckenham who were involved in the play-offs last season while Erith were promoted to Step 4 so are finding it tough at their new level. Sadly, there are no Isthmian League sides left in the last 16 of the FA Isuzu Trophy.




