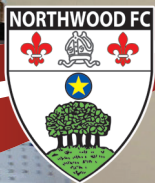
Every year, at this time of the season, we set out on the Emirates FA Cup Road to Wembley, though sadly we have generally stumbled very early along that path. In fact, the 3-1 victory against Longlevens in the Preliminary Round was Northwood's first in the competition since 2015. At times, other clubs at our level have enjoyed exciting cup runs, but our last – indeed, so far only – sojourn to the draw for the First Round Proper came as long ago as 2000, when the winner of the Grays Athletic v Northwood replay was drawn away to Reading. Sadly, the winner wasn't Northwood...

It will be far from easy for us this afternoon to maybe seek to emulate that cup run of eighteen years ago, as we take on one of the local success stories in Kings Langley. Club Matters

Emirates FA Cup

To get to this afternoon's home tie against Kings Langley, our new squad managed to end a miserable run of Preliminary Round results in the Emirates FA Cup two weeks ago with a fairly bloodless 3-1 success over Hellenic League side Longlevens. We put to the back of our minds the previous three results in the competition which started with a home defeat against Didcot Town in the Second Qualifying round back in 2015 which had been our reward for successes away at Aylesbury United and near-neighbours Harrow Borough in the first two rounds. The Woods led Didcot 1-0 after

just three minutes but crashed out 1-2 in a disappointing defeat. The following year was much worse when we were soundly beaten 2-0 at Spartan South Midlands League side Sun Sports; easily our worst performance in all of our 68 FA Cup matches that we have competed in to date. Then, last season we played really well at Swindon Supermarine

but still went down 1-0 to a stoppage-time goal that flew in from distance. So well done to Dean and the squad for getting through to the First Qualifying round. It was the first time that we had managed to score three goals in an FA Cup game since a 3-1 replay success at today's visitors Kings Langley in 2014 and you have to go back to 2011 for the last time we managed to score three goals in an FA Cup tie here at Northwood Park; another 3-1 replay win over Wingate & Finchley. If the scores are level after 90 minutes this afternoon, as they were when we met in the competition four years ago, we will play again in a replay on Tuesday night. There is the small matter of £6,000 in sponsorship to the winners of the match this



afternoon!

- **Other Cup Competitions**

- The Buildbase FA Trophy doesn't start for the Woods until October but when we do get underway in that competition we will be away to Dunstable Town who were relegated back from the Southern Premier last season and will play the new season in Division One East of the Southern League. The date for the game has now been fixed as Saturday 13th October after Town won the toss with their neighbours last week so AFC Dunstable will have to play their own FA Trophy match either on the Friday night or the Sunday.

- In the Velocity Alan Turvey Trophy (Isthmian League Cup) we start our campaign with a home game against North Division side Bury Town in just over a weeks' time, on Tuesday 18th September. The Suffolk side started their season with a 3-1 defeat at newly-promoted Felixstowe & Walton United. We last met Bury Town back in 2007/08 in Division One North with our home game ending in a 4-3 victory, though we did lose 3-0 in the away fixture.

- Both Middlesex Cup competitions have been drawn in the last couple of weeks and we will be away in the opening round of both. As last year, we will be away to AFC Hayes in the Middlesex Senior Cup on Tuesday 16th October 2018 while our first appearance in the Middlesex Charity Cup for several years will see us travel to play at Wingate & Finchley, with our manager Dean Barker making a swift return to his former club! That game should be played in mid-September so watch out for a date when it is arranged.

- **Fergus Moore – And Sometimes the Dog Was Busy!**

- Fergus Moore is well-known for his long playing career on the local non-League scene which included a spell here at Northwood Park between 2004 and 2006 when he made 78 appearances and scored four goals from a defensive position in our Southern Premier League era. He is currently at Edgware Town in a player-manager role at the ripe old age of 46.



Well Fergus, with the assistance of Roger Slater (who previously helped Gordon Bartlett to pen his non-League story), has compiled his own football memories which will be published in his own forthcoming biography, *And sometimes, the dog was busy!* The book is a meander through his

career and the things he has seen in twenty-eight years in the non-league game including that two-year period at Northwood. It should be an interesting read.

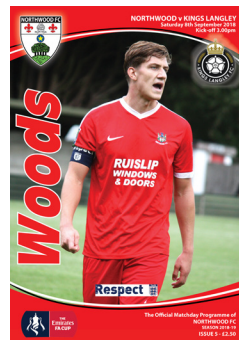
Under-18s Midweek

The History

Kings Langley Football Club was formed in 1886, and is one of the oldest in the county. They were founder members of West Herts League in 1891-2, and in 1911-12 were Division 3 champions, winning Division 2 in 1919-20. The club joined the Herts County League in 1920-21, but two years later returned to West Herts League.

The club folded in February 1930, but reformed four months later and were Division 2 Champions and Webster Cup winners the next season, and following relegation they repeated the feat four years later. 1935-36 saw the club join the Southern Olympian League and were promoted from Division 2 in their first season, Division 1 Champions the following season and then spent two seasons in the Premier until the outbreak of war.

In 1946-47 Kings Langley returned to Herts County League, gaining promotion from Division Two, and were league champions in 1949-50 and in 1951-52. At that time, Kings Langley regularly competed in the F A Amateur Cup and in September 1949 entertained Corinthian Casuals; although losing 1-3, over 500 watched the game. The club spent three seasons from 1952 in the Parthenon League, before in 1955-56 returning to the Herts County League, where they would stay for the next 45 years.

They gained Herts County League titles in 1965-66 and 1966-67, when they also were Herts Charity Shield winners; relegated in 1972-73, the club were Herts County Div. 1 Champions in 1975-76.

After losing their Home Park ground in 1980, a nomadic existence followed, playing at several venues until March 1997, when the club moved into their present ground at Gaywood Park. The reformation of Kings Langley Youth Football Club in 1989 after a 19 year absence played its part, as both junior and senior supporters combined to launch a project of obtaining the land, laying two pitches and building a pavilion.

In 1997-98 the club were Rickmansworth Charity Cup winners, but lost the Herts County

League title on goal difference. They joined the Spartan South Midlands League Division 1 in 2001-02 but were relegated due to ground issues two years later. They won Division 2 in 2007 and 2008 before regaining Division 1 status, and they also twice won the Herts F A Intermediate Cup.

Kings Langley were Spartan South Midlands Division 1 runners-up in 2009 but had promotion denied due to floodlights not being in operation. After going close several times, last season they were Division 1 runners-up to Sun Postal Sports and were promoted to Premier Division, also winning the Division 1 Cup.

In 2014-15 the club were Premier Division champions at first attempt and won promotion to Evo-Stik Southern League, achieving the double by winning the Challenge Trophy. A year later Langley won their third consecutive promotion by finishing as champions of the Southern League Division 1 Central.

A turbulent 2016-17 campaign saw the departure of Paul Hughes and Ritchie Hanlon at the end of October and the return of Paul Hobbs as manager. The season was a battle against relegation from the Southern League Premier in the debut season and back to back wins in the last two games ensured safety.

The reorganisation of Steps 3 and 4 for 2018-19 meant only one team was relegated in 2017-18, and while failing to improve on the previous season's record, Kings were never in danger. Steve Conroy was promoted from coach to manager in December, succeeding Paul Hobbs.

The Youth Section continues to flourish and now boasts twenty two boys youth teams and three girls youth teams, ranging from U6 up to U18. The club has been granted FA Charter status and looks to further improve its facilities as well as to make further progress up the football pyramid.



The Players

CALLUM ADEBIYI

Signed from Hemel Hempstead Town in August 2012 and has been a regular on the left side of defence since then, apart from a half season spell at Hayes & Yeading in 2016-17. Callum has pace and height and his powerhouse surges from defence have become a feature.

CHARLIE BURNS

Experienced keeper who has played in the Football League with MK Dons, during which time he was loaned to Cambridge City, Truro City and Hayes & Yeading. Signed for Hampton & Richmond this season and is on a one month loan at Kings Langley.

JOSH COLDICOTT-STEVENS

Young midfielder who spent four seasons with Borehamwood and captained the Under 18s and Under 21s. On loan to Kings Langley from February 2017, and signed for 2017-18 season and established himself as a midfield regular.

LOUIE COLLIER

Highly promising Kings Langley Under 18 midfielder who was registered with the First Team in March 2018, making an immediate debut as a substitute at Frome Town. Such was his impact that he started the next game and held his place for the final eight matches of the season.

AIDAN COLLINS

Another promising Under 18 player given first team experience after being called up in October 2017. His pace and confidence on either wing ensured that he remained a valuable squad member for the rest of the season.

GARY CONNOLLY

Signed from Leverstock Green in 2011, classy midfielder who converted effortlessly to defence when the need arose. Injury hit in 2012-13, he captained the promotion winning side the next season. After a gap year in Australia, he returned to lead the 2015-16 title winners and has been an integral part of the team since.

JACOB COOK

Young defensive midfielder signed from Codicote on the March 2018 deadline, and his versatility in being able to fill several positions in defence or midfield made a valuable contribution to the finale of the season.

KAVAN COTTER

Former Luton Town scholar and pro. Loaned to Hitchin Town, where he made 35 appearances in 2017-18. Also on loan at Oxfoed City, he was released by Luton at end of season and signed for Hemel Hempstead Town, and is on a one-month loan to Kings Langley.

**ALAN FLEMING**

Watford born striker who joined Norwich City at start of his Under 14 season after impressing at Luton Town. Starred in City's 2017-18 Under 18 Youth Cup run, but was released at end of season and signed for Kings in the summer.

DEAN HITCHCOCK

Powerful midfielder, equally at home in defence, who began at Luton Town academy before moving to Dunstable Town, Hemel Hempstead Town and AFC Dunstable. Signed for Kings in summer 2013 and has been a regular for the last five seasons, including the three promotion campaigns.

RENE HOWE

Vastly experienced striker who originally joined Kettering Town from Bedford Town in 2006 and during his first season scored 25 goals in 40 games. He joined Peterborough United the following season, being loaned to several Football League clubs, before four seasons with Torquay United, Burton Albion and Newport County. He returned to Kettering in 2015, taking his total to 63 goals in 168 appearances, before signing for Kings in August 2018.

JORELL JOHNSON

Former Watford Academy central defender who signed pro in 2014. On loan for two seasons at Hemel Hempstead Town and St Albans City, he signed for Kings in August 2016 and led the side that successfully preserved its Premier League status. Added the knack of scoring vital goals to his repertoire last season.

ARJUN JUNG

A former Brentford youth midfielder who has completed a four year scholarship in USA, where he captained his college team. On return to England signed for Redditch United late in season 2016-17 and transferred to Kings in November 2017 where his versatility and enthusiasm saw him become a vital part of the squad.

GARRY MALONE

Bedford Town's keeper at an early age in 2014/15, having made one senior Northwood appearance in 2013, Garry has appeared for AFC Dunstable, Wealdstone, Egham, and

Chalfont St Peter since then and played for Dunstable Town, before joining Whitehawk.

DAVIDE POBBE

Italian born striker who numbered Eurotezze, Valdarno and Camisano amongst his home country clubs. Joined Harefield United in 2015, where he spent two seasons before moving to Aylesbury for 2017/18. Signed for Kings in summer 2018.

LEE STOBBS

Right sided midfielder, also comfortable at right back, formerly with Leverstock Green, AFC Dunstable, Tring Athletic and Aylesbury. Signed for Kings in March 2017, contributing to the successful relegation battle. He began last season in fine form, but after just seven games, an injury was to end his season.

EDUARD TOINY-PENDRED

Another member of the Under 18 squad to make the breakthrough last season, after his goals saw him sign with the first team in March 2018.

HARRY TUCKER

Young central defender who signed for Kings in summer 2018. Had two seasons at Beaconsfield before signing for Chesham United for 2017-18, but it was at Uxbridge that he became established as a first choice last term.

STEVE WARD

Former Northwood Under 18 right-back or winger, signed September 2014, his performances in the reserves caught the eye and in March, he made his first team debut. Has established himself as a first team regular since, where his direct style of play has caused consternation to opposing defences.

MITCHELL WEISS

Former Hemel United 18 striker signed September 2013. Prolific in Kings' reserves, he replicated the feat when called into the first team and became the first choice striker and among the League's leading goalscorers for the next two seasons. Signed for Hemel in summer 2016 and returned to Kings for season 2017-18.

THE FIRST MEETING

The Woods faced a midweek replay at Kings Langley after the Spartan South Midlands League side came from behind with a late goal forcing a creditable draw. And Northwood took a fourth minute lead when Dave Lawrence played a neat ball across to Sam Byfield and the winger netted his first goal for the club with a neat finish across the goalkeeper.

Alex Campana registered two efforts on goal as the visitors tried to rally but both failed to hit the target and Northwood went closer when Jordan Lawal squared to Lawrence who fired just over the bar.

Though the Woods continued to enjoy plenty of possession, their final ball was lacking, and it wasn't until the 40th minute that Byfield was slipped through on goal again but this time he rather telegraphed his shot and keeper Anthony Ladyman managed to make a strong save that pushed the ball well away from goal. Just before the break, Kings managed their first good effort on goal as Campana again struck from distance and this time Berkley Laurencin had to dive across to his left to push the ball wide of goal.

Northwood had another great chance to double their lead six minutes after the break as Lawrence was put through. He steadied himself as Ladyman narrowed the angle but the keeper still managed to get his hand to his shot and push the ball wide. From the resulting corner the ball dropped for Michael Murray but he fired over.

Still the Woods looked for another breakthrough. Lawrence's jinking run led to a shot which was taken high but comfortably by Ladyman and then Joakim Ehui fired well over. Rob Hastings was introduced for the out-of-sorts Murray after 72 minutes, and within a minute a good ball from Lawrence found the substitute in a good position but his finish lacked power and the keeper saved once again.

Finally, Kings Langley began to look to threaten themselves with their own substitutes combining as Adam Hallisey set up Mitchell Weiss but he dragged his shot wide of the post.

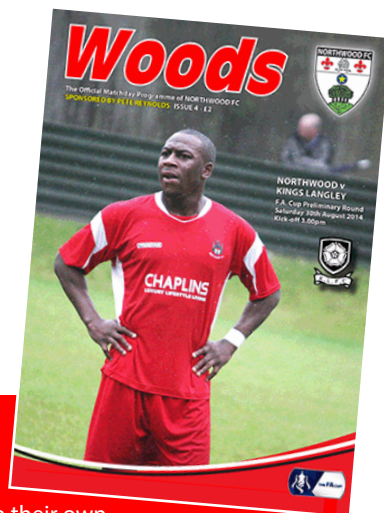
George Nicholas shot well over and then Lawrence's strike on the turn was saved again after good work from Hastings and Byfield and the Woods were made to pay for not putting the game to bed on 75 minutes. The visitors forced a corner and when the ball was only half-cleared, Ollie Cox saw a gap through a ruck of players and he drove the ball in off the far post for an equaliser.

Northwood tried to battle straight back but were chancing their luck with shots from distance and both Ehui and Andy Lomas were denied by a keeper growing in confidence. Probably their best chance came after 85 minutes when Nicholas raced onto a through-ball, but again Ladyman made a fine stop and Lawrence shot over from the rebound.

Then, in the final minute of normal time, James Duncan got forward and his cross found Hastings lurking at the back post but he could only poke a weak shot straight at the keeper when he looked favourite to score. Nick Turner also headed a half-chance just wide of the post during this late surge but the goal just wasn't coming for the Woods.

An exciting local FA Cup tie for Woods and Langley

The excitement of an FA Cup tie at home is unrivalled and hosting a side in Kings Langley who ply their trade at the level above adds an extra layer of intrigue to proceedings at Chestnut Avenue this afternoon.

Not only is it a local game being played for the right to claim no less than £6,000 in prize money, sums indispensable to both sides, it is an opportunity to renew acquaintances with a team who the Woods have no short of previous with in recent seasons.

Incidentally Northwood knocked out Kings in this very competition in 2014, but that of course will have no bearing on the outcome of today – not least because today's visitors were then playing in the Spartan South Midlands Premier Division.

A whirlwind three promotions in three years that took them from Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League, via Northwood in the Southern League Division One Central, to the Southern League Premier South where they currently play, deserves no shortage of plaudits.

I had the good fortune of speaking with Kings chairman Jeremy Wilkins over the off-season and I couldn't have come away more impressed by his passion and vision for the club.

He spoke glowingly about providing a pathway for younger players – an ethos shared by the Woods who have two players on loan from the Hertfordshire side, including Sam Tring – and continuing their incremental progress despite the difficulty of two successive relegation

battles taking their toll.

As a village club they will still be heavily favoured to be in the reckoning for relegation but don't be surprised in the slightest if they defy the odds again. It's the only way they know how so today's game will undeniably be a great spectacle, and hopefully it will be played in the right competitive spirit.

Good luck to Kings Langley for the remainder of the season, but only after today of course! It cannot be bad, after all, for local football in the Hertfordshire and Middlesex areas to have so many clubs playing in the upper echelons of the non-League game, and long may that continue.

There is no doubt though that the Woods will need to be sharper in the final third if they are to cause an upset and progress through to the FA Cup Second Qualifying Round.

Dean Barker's young side battled well, and their effort and application was faultless, in the 2-0 reverse to Waltham Abbey here seven days ago.

However I felt the Woods lacked the little bit of quality required to unlock a side laden with experience at higher levels, with the know-how of how to frustrate, win the midfield battle and then take their chances when they arrived.

For all of Northwood's inability to create too many clear-cut chances against Waltham Abbey last weekend – a game in which the prolific James Ewington was reduced to feeding off scraps – the big moments just didn't fall their way.

Small margins decide games and a gilt-edged

miss from inside the six-yard box in the first half from the unfortunate Luke Alfano was frustratingly complemented by what the Woods felt was a stonewall penalty for handball being waved away in the second.

The hosts sorely missed the presence of Ben Pattie as an old school number nine, dropping deep to hold the ball and bringing in the stable of talented wide players Barker has at his disposal.

Jorome Slew was Northwood's best attacking threat last week but he often acted as a lone ranger as the hosts failed to break down their stubborn visitors.

Where Northwood have been at their best early in the season is dragging centre halves out of position through tireless centre forward play and creating two on one overloads where the full backs add an attacking dimension.

We didn't see enough of this facet of their game last week, not that I'm being overly critical. You will get days where things don't entirely go to plan and Barker is astute enough to recognise that, particularly with a group who are still finding their feet. Northwood fought well and that's all any of the supporters can truly ask of them.

Barker's post-match assertion that, despite the work rate, his fledgling squad probably didn't do enough to win the game was about as honest an assessment as you're likely to hear, however.

The Woods boss recognises that his side remain a work in progress and there are plenty of positives to focus on with players still to return to the fold.

They have done so many things right through the early weeks and they really should not feel too disheartened by back-to-back defeats to two of the pacesetters in the first month of the campaign.

Kings enter this game as favourites and, in many respects, we might expect a similar test today as we did last week, albeit the cliché tells us that all that goes out of the window when it comes to cup football.

We will see but let's hope the Northwood players grab the occasion that doubtlessly they are relishing and give it a good go again, irrespective of the final outcome.

A final word, too, to the much-maligned FA for heeding the advice of so many in the non-League game and upping the FA Cup prize

fund from this season. A mini-cup run through the first couple of rounds could provide clubs with close to £20,000, which, quite frankly, is an incredible sum of money.

It adds an added dimension to what is already an exciting time for all those concerned, and hopefully today lives up to the occasion.

Up the Woods!!

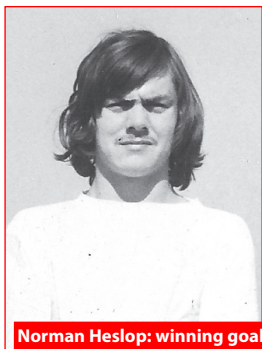

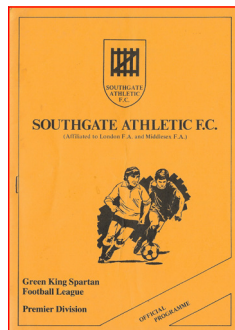

After their setback at Uxbridge on Bank Holiday Monday, the Woods were looking to get back to winning ways as they took on Waltham Abbey who had enjoyed a similar start to their season also with six points from three matches.

Just two minutes later the Abbotts were in front. A long ball came through to Ronnie Winn who was able to race through and chip Luke Sheldrick in goal for a neat finish.

Northwood went closest to levelling the scores after 37 minutes when Ewington played a neat exchange of passes with Dickson and then knocked a deep cross to Slew on the right. He whipped in a cross to the near post and found Alfano who flicked a shot inches wide of the near post.

There was still much to do in the second half but again it was the Abbotts who started quickly. Sheldrick saved low down to keep out a shot from Charlie Stimson and then an effort from distance by the same player was comfortably taken by the Woods' keeper.

After 55 minutes a good move saw Slew get past his marker and then feed the overlapping Karl Stevenson who burst into the box but then fired straight at Janata when a cross was probably the better option.

Waltham Abbey had the ball in the net again on 67 minutes, a fine header from a free-kick but an offside flag soon dampened those celebrations but the Woods failed to respond and ten minutes later it was all over as Stimson did well with a sharp turn and finish from the edge of the box. Again Northwood showed some spirit. After 83 minutes a free-kick from Wilson Chingoka picked out Andreos, whose header back across goal had Janata scrambling to push the ball just wide of the post. And in stoppage-time, a free-kick on the edge of the box was given for a foul on Andreos and Slew hit a powerful strike which flew just the wrong side of the crossbar.

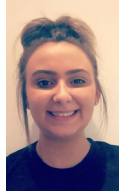

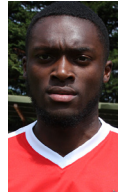

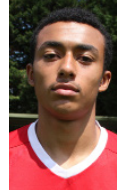

From *THE NON LEAGUE PAPER's*

Since Jamie Vardy completed his fairy tale journey from Non-League obscurity to being a world famous Premier League winner, more media coverage than ever seems to have been dedicated to emphasising how the lower leagues can unearth hidden gems.

This is something that should certainly be celebrated and is testament to the unique footballing culture that we have in this country.

Nevertheless, more significance should be placed on the potential role that non-League clubs can play in nurturing the next generation of young British managers.

In an era where Premier League and Football League clubs appear to be increasingly turning towards foreign coaches, the role the non-League pyramid can play in providing a learning curve for young British managers has become more important than ever.

For this to happen, however, more non-League clubs must make the brave decision to appoint young, unproven coaches.

This is understandably a difficult decision for a club chairman to make but the potential rewards can be great.

One example of a club who have taken such a gamble is Essex Senior League side Leyton Athletic.

The Walthamstow based club, who were formally known as Wadham Lodge, gave 24-year-old Jason Ngandu his big break by appointing the former East Thurrock player as their new first-team manager midway through last season following the departure of former boss Marc Farrell.

Ngandu, whose playing career was cruelly ended by injury, has grasped his opportunity in the dugout with both hands.

After successfully steering the Wad Army away from relegation danger during the last campaign, Ngandu has built a young, hungry squad who are looking to make a real statement of intent in the Essex Senior League this season.

Ngandu featured in a NLP article which focussed on his side's FA Cup victory over Barkingside a couple of weeks ago. What became immediately apparent was his enthusiasm for management and coaching in general.

With each game that passes, the young coach will learn first-hand about the rigours of football management, which will stand him in great stead for the future.

This is all thanks to the brave decision making of the hierarchy at Leyton Athletic and it would be fantastic to see more and more non-League clubs following their example.

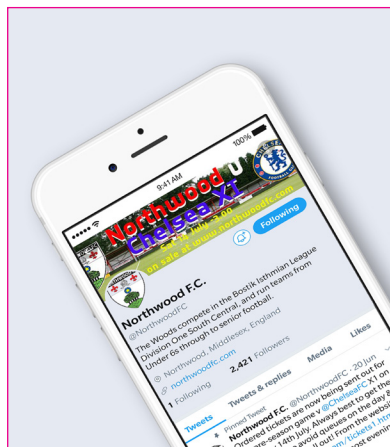

TEN YEARS AFTER

Today we continue with our popular feature where we look back to events here at Northwood Park from exactly a decade ago.

The Woods had ended the 2007/08 season, their first back in the Isthmian League, in a creditable tenth place after a slow start having won their last six home games in succession and with only two defeats in their final twelve matches.

After a successful pre-season campaign the



Woods had hit the ground running and followed a 1-0 away success at Waltham Forest with a 4-0 thrashing of one of the title-favourites Enfield Town in midweek but after a goalless draw against Aveley, the side then suffered a heavy Bank Holiday Monday first defeat at Ware.

That was the background for the first important game of the season – a home FA Cup Preliminary Round tie against the Metropolitan Police who had made an unbeaten start to their season in Division One South of the Ryman League. They had been beaten in play-offs in each of the previous years so were clearly going to be tough to beat.

Browsing through the programme for the match played on Saturday 30th August 2008, Chairman Ian Barry's column advised everyone that some filming had been taking place in the clubhouse during the week. It is not a fact widely known but the TV film that was

made that week starred several of the UK's top actors, with Olivia Colman spending time in the Northwood clubhouse! The location was chosen as it was felt our clubhouse recreated a 1970's club (despite actually being built in the mid-1980's). Emilia Fox, Daniel Mays and the latest Doctor Who Jodie Whittaker (amongst others) were other stars of the film which was produced to celebrate the centenary of the romance publishing house Mills & Boon. For anyone wanting to check it out and view the Northwood clubhouse as it used to be in all its glory prior to the recent refurbishment – the film was called *Consuming Passion* (2008 TV Movie) and can be watched on YouTube as well as being available on Amazon!

Coincidentally, the FA Cup tie was also filmed – part of an initiative of ITV Local where most of the ties were filmed and highlights made available on their website the next day – the only year that this occurred. Unfortunately for the Woods, it wouldn't have made the best of viewing and the £1,500 worth of sponsorship money available to the winners went the way of the visitors. Northwood had started well and the Mets goalkeeper Mo Maan was tested twice in the opening ten minutes. Firstly Michael Gordon jinked his way past two defenders and set up the returning Sean Sonner for a shot at goal which the 'keeper saved well. Then Danny

the game comfortably and then wrapped up the victory to secure their place in the next round when substitute Jo Arrabeli netted from close-range. The FA Cup dream was over for another year.

Colin Payne's side had a week to rest before returning to League action the following

- Saturday with a home game against Chatham
- Town – the first-ever meeting between the two sides – ten years ago exactly this weekend.
- The Woods needed to get back to winning ways but there was only one change made with Joe Cowan returning at right-back to replace Matt Plaskett. But they made an excellent start to the fixture and had already gone close on a couple of occasions when Michael Gordon knocked in a cross that was dummied by Terry Davies and Sean Sonner ghosted in behind him to fire home.
- It was all-Northwood in the first-half but they missed a series of chances and were made to pay for their profligacy when Mitch Swain had a clearance charged down and Dave Botterill was able to chip into an empty net.

Murphy's cross was met by a flick goalwards from Terry Davies but it was straight at Maan.



But the Police were soon on the front foot. Saheed Sankoh headed over from close range and then Woods' keeper Mitch Swain pulled off a fine save to keep out a Steve Sargent volley. Northwood got stuck in second gear and there was a worrying sign on 29 minutes when a defensive slip allowed Rob George a clear run on goal but Swain was out swiftly to thwart the danger.

It was a repeat of that that gifted the Mets the lead just before half-time. Another defensive error, Sankoh held the ball up awaiting support and that came from George who outpaced Ryan Tackley to plant a shot into the far corner.

The Woods rallied in the second-half as they searched for an equaliser. Davies hit a shot into the side-netting, Dwain Williams drove an effort from distance which only skimmed the crossbar and then Maan made a fine save when tipping over another Davies strike.

The last chance for the Woods came on 74 minutes as Richard Orlu combined with Davies to set up young substitute Aryan Tajbakhsh. The crowd waited for the net to bulge but his effort drifted wide. From there the Police managed



- However, the Woods were still dominating the play and five minutes from time they came up with a winner. Chatham's keeper James Tedder failed to hold onto a Dwain Williams free-kick, under pressure from Bradley Hewitt and the man of the match Gordon capped a fine display by hitting a rasping drive into the roof of the net.

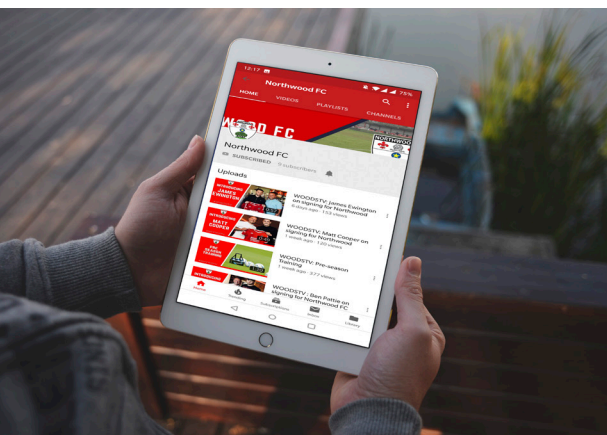
MEDIA MATTERS
