Good evening and a very warm welcome to you all and thank you again for your support.

Tonight, we welcome Ashford Town in the FA Cup replay following Saturday's 2-2 draw. We hope you all enjoy your stay with us and wish you a safe journey home.

The pre-season saw us strengthen the squad following last season's mid-table finish whilst retaining many players who proved to be an integral part of the second half success of last season.

Finding the right players to bring both potential or experience can take time.

But we believe we have assembled a good squad capable of more than holding its own at this level.

They work hard in training and approach every game with the intention of it being the best they have ever played in.

No one enters the game wanting to do badly.

They care about the club and the fans, as we all do.

Whilst the pre-season games were very much experimental in allowing the 'new and old' to evolve together, everyone very quickly bought into our 'one team' philosophy ensuring a good togetherness as the season started.

Going into the first game in the FA Cup much earlier than expected it was pleasing to see us progress with a good home victory, something which we were all too aware was not the case too often in the past season.

A marker for what we would like to achieve going forward is to become a much harder team to play against here at home and give our supporters a few more positive results.

With the league season opening a week later with our home game against a lively Tooting and Mitcham team, it was interesting to see how these players have merged and despite them levelling the score, we showed great character when new boy Ronan Hutchins 'rose' to head what proved to be the winner.

We could have extended our lead even more, but in in-

jury time despite some good defensive performances over the ninety minutes, our goalkeeper Andrew McCorkell had to be at his very best to tip a goal bound shot around the post to ensure the victory.

Our first away league game at last season's play-off contenders Bedfont Sports would surely be an indicator of how much we have progressed and the slender 1-0 away win, thanks to an own goal, set a marker for what we hope to come.

On Saturday both teams had to settle for a draw resulting in tonight's replay.

In an extremely poor first-half we found ourselves very disjointed and a goal down, so half-time was an opportunity to try to rectify this and hopefully to ensure a good reaction from the players to show an improvement.

Thankfully, an equaliser three minutes into the period boosted us as Sydney laid the ball off to Josh to finish sharply.

Both teams continued to probe and we took the lead when a long throw was headed back across goal by James Budden for Sydney to drill home.

But Ashford came back at us and ensured the replay with a late equaliser.

Our squad is certainly bright, ambitious and will continue to improve.

Are we looking to strengthen? Only when needed! But if we do it must be the right player and one we would certainly need. Bringing players in for a short-term fix as has happened at so many clubs, can often turn into a 'revolving door policy' which then spells disaster and is something we cannot do.

Once again, I would like to close by saying thank you to each and every one of you, your support is outstanding.

The club will continue to grow again, thanks to everyone's hard work both on the pitch and behind the scenes.

WOODS OUTLOOK

Back to it in the Emirates FA Cup

Following Tuesday night's hard-fought 2-2 draw, we make a swift return to FA Cup action tonight at the Skyline Roofing Stadium for the replay of our Preliminary Round fixture against Ashford Town (Middlesex) FC. After going behind to an early goal from Lewis Flatman, our opponents may feel that they could have taken the game away from the Woods in the first-half but it remained 1-0 at the break and early in the second-half the Woods levelled through a Josh Helmore strike. The Woods dominated much of the second period and when Sydney Ibie stabbed home a second with ten minutes to play it seemed likely that Northwood would be through to the next round. However, the home side showed great spirit to threaten again in the closing stages and forced a replay with an excellent strike from David Pitt.

The draw of the First Qualifying Round was due to be made yesterday afternoon but after our print deadline for this programme so we will know who the victors will be due to play in ten days' time by the time you are reading this.

Prior to Saturday's game, Ashford had been beaten 0-1 at home by Binfield in their opening League fixture but then picked up a point with a 1-1 draw against near-neighbours Hanworth Villa. However, they had also notched a high-scoring 8-0 success away at Saltdean United in the Extra Preliminary Round of the FA Cup so they are capable of scoring plenty of goals it seems.

Both of the two League meetings between the two sides are yet to be staged of course. We travel back to Ashford Town on October 1st and then they return here next February. We hope everyone connected with our visitors will enjoy their stay with us tonight.

Tonight, marks the Woods 77th FA Cup game since our first foray into the competition back in 1989. It is our 14th replayed fixture. Of the other 13 replayed games we have won seven of them and lost six.

Isthmian News

The Woods started their Pitching In Isthmian League campaign, coming from behind to defeat Tooting & Mitcham United 3-2 on the opening day here at the Skyline Roofing Stadium thanks to two goals from Sydney Ibie and one from Ronan Hutchins who scored the winner for the second week in succession.

We followed that with another narrow 1-0 success away at Bedfont Sports who have had a bit of a rebuilding job to do having lost most of the squad that got them to the play-offs last season. They are still likely to prove difficult to beat on their own 3G surface though and even though it was only an unfortunate own-goal that earned us all three points, it may prove to be a useful victory.

It means we have maximum points from our opening two fixtures for the first time since 2018 (when we defeated Tooting (again) and FC Romania) and lie second in the table behind surprise leaders Westfield who have enjoyed two brilliant 4-0 victories over Basingstoke Town and at Leatherhead, both of them predicted to be challenging for honours this season.

We do of course now go to Westfield on Saturday which should be an interesting encounter up against former Woods Manager Simon Lane who is in charge of the Surrey side.

Other Cup News

The FA Trophy is now sponsored by Izuzu and we start our campaign in that competition in the first qualifying round on Saturday 10th September. We have home advantage in that one but yet again we face another side that share's our own league division in Combined Counties League Champions Hanworth Villa. The Villains won that title unbeaten throughout, they have strengthened well and will be a tough team to beat when they arrive next month. The winners of that tie will be rewarded with home advantage in the next round against either last season's Vase Finalists Littlehampton Town or Ramsgate who finished just outside the Isthmian South Division play-offs. Trophy games this season will again go straight to a penalty shoot-out if the scores are level after 90 minutes.

The draws for the Velocity League Cup, which we will

be back in again this season, and the two Middlesex Cup competitions, are yet to be drawn.

Northwood had to settle for a replay after coming from a goal behind only to concede a late goal in a closely fought affair at the Robert Parker Stadium.

There were a couple of changes to the starting line-up from the midweek win over Bedfont Sports, Sam Jenkins failing to recover from a dead leg with Luke Tingey moving across to right wing-back and James Budden returning to central defence.

There was also a change to the front line as Josh Helmore replaced Ronan Hutchins, the latter switching to the bench.

Woods goalkeeper Andrew McCorkell was called into action early on as he palmed over a half-volley attempt from Sam Humphreys following a quick break.

But Northwood broke away from the resulting corner with Lindell Stewart threading a pass through to the overlapping Carl Stewart whose shot was pushed over by Tangerines keeper Fred Chapman.

After a fairly even opening period, Ashford began to get the upper-hand and proceeded to enjoy a spell of domination with Northwood struggling to get any sort of foothold in midfield, Ricky Johnson squandering a good opportunity after being set up by Danyaal Iqbal before Wayne Ridgley had a close-range shot blocked by Riccardo Alexander-Greenaway

And the Tangerines deservedly took the lead on 14 minutes as Woods squandered possession to allow Johnson to play in Lewis Flatman who gave McCorkell no chance with a low shot into the far corner.

Northwood would have been hoping for a quick response, but they continued to be second best to an eager Ashford who went close to extending their lead as Iqbal saw his shot skim the crossbar while Humphreys dragged his shot wide after Woods failed to clear Flatman's cross.

Having struggled for cohesion in attack up to that point, Northwood tinkered with the front three with Helmore reverting to his more familiar central position with Ibie and Lindell Stewart either side of him.

And the switch seemed to have the desired effect as Woods began to offer more of a threat – Lindell Stewart getting between defenders but seeing his goal attempt cleared before a slick move involving Helmore, Lindell Stewart and Lomas ended with Ibie shooting over from a good position.

Woods were finding increasing space down their left flank and another cross from Lomas found the head of Lindell Stewart whose skimmed header flew the wrong side of the upright.

But Woods were given a scare on the stroke of half-time as they failed to clear their lines, Johnson wasting a wonderful opportunity to increase Ashford's lead as his shot failed to test McCorkell.

Northwood needed to up their game in the second period and they showed their intentions from the off as Ibie cut in from the left and saw his shot blocked by the home defence.

And Woods were immediately back on the offensive, Keagan Cole's short throw to Ibie being chested into the path of Helmore who sent a looping shot over Chapman to bring Woods back onto the tie on 48 minutes.

Woods went in search of further goals as Lindell Stewart powered beyond the Ashford back line but his near post shot flew narrowly wide while Carl Stewart created an opening for Ibie who had his shot was blocked by the covering Abraham Henao-Enomorado.

Northwood were firmly in the ascendancy as they

kept the Tangerines pinned in their own half, Chapman keeping out another Ibie effort before the latter's jinking run ended with his pull-back going behind both Helmore and Lindell Stewart who were waiting to apply the finish.

The hosts had a brief respite as they made some progress into Northwood territory with Dale Burnham heading wide from a Wayne Ridgley free-kick.

But with all their substitutes used, Ashford had some more defending to do as Tingey's cross-volley drew a smart save from Chapman.

However, Chapman was unable to prevent Northwood from putting themselves in front on 80 minutes as Buden's head back from Cole's deep corner was helped on by Helmore to James Gurteen whose shot was blocked on the line, Ibie lashing home the loose ball.

Northwood made their first substitution as Alexander-Greenaway succumbed to a hamstring problem, David Taylor his replacement for his first appearance since his return to the club.

But Woods' joy at turning around the tie was short-lived as they afforded the Tangerines too much space on the edge of the box with substitute David Pitt taking advantage with his side's first shot on target in the second half which took a deflection and curled beyond McCorkell to draw the hosts level on 84 minutes.

Both sides went looking for a winning strike – Tingey latching onto Lomas' deep cross, but Chapman clawed the ball away at his near post while at the other end Ridgley's free-kick into the danger area was headed behind by Gurteen.

With the contest deep into stoppage time, Ibie looked to break clear but was cynically dragged back by Henao-Enomorado who earned himself a caution; the fifth of the day for the home side.

And Woods had one last opportunity as they were awarded a free-kick on the angle, Tingey's header from Cole's delivery being safely gathered by Chapman to earn his side a replay.

Northwood built on their positive start to theseason as they registered a second win in five days by overcoming last season's play-off contenders at the Bedfont Recreation Ground.

The Woods were forced to make a late change at the back as James Budden was delayed enroute to the ground, Luke Tingey resuming his role in central defence with Sam Jenkins returning to the right wing-back berth.

There was also a return for Andy Lomas at left wing-back with Brandon Kalu reverting to the bench.

Having dealt with an initial burst from the hosts as goalkeeper Andrew McCorkell was called into action to deal with a dangerous cross from former Wood Tayshan Hayden-Smith, the visitors were soon on the offensive; Sydney Ibie forcing a corner after linking well with Lomas before Lindell Stewart saw his shot deflected wide after Riccardo Alexander-Greenaway had combined with Jenkins to create the opening.

Northwood's bright start continued with Tingey's searching ball picking out Lomas in an advanced position, the latter taking the ball beyond keeper Gary Ross, who had advanced outside his box, before pulling it back for Lindell Stewart whose blocked shot ran loose to Ronan Hutchins, but he was denied by some last-ditch defensive work.

Woods maintained their high tempo on the slick 4G surface with Alexander-Greenaway the next to threaten as he dragged his shot wide of the target.

But the visitors were finally rewarded for their dominance on 21 minutes as Ross failed to gather Lindell Stewart's low cross which was turned into his own net by Joseph Morrison under pressure from Ibie.

Northwood's intensive pressing was preventing the Eagles from getting into any sort of rhythm, the Woods' midfield partnership of Carl Stewart and Alexander-Greenaway controlling matters in the middle of the park.

And the visitors continued to threaten as Lomas found space once again down Northwood's left flank with his cross picking out Lindell Stewart, but the latter's header lacked the power to trouble Ross.

Bedfont briefly threatened as Hayden-Smith's driven free-kick flew across the face of the Northwood goal before Lucas Kennedy-Sinclair was denied by a timely block from Tingey.

However, Woods remained a constant threat to the Eagles, Hutchins being denied once again by some good defending with the referee waving away Northwood appeals for a penalty.

Woods continued to push for a second goal before the break, Carl Stewart's defence-splitting ball sending Ibie on a jinking run into the box, but his shot was blocked before another run at the Eagles backline ended with a shot flying past the far upright.

However, Northwood had some defending to do as the opening period drew to a close - McCorkell tipping over Hayden-Smith's long-range free-kick before having to deal with the resulting corner.

Woods were immediately on the offensive after the



break, James Gurteen miscuing when picked out by Hutchins' free-kick into the Bedfont box before Lindell Stewart's dangerous cross just evaded the on-rushing Ibie.

Having resisted Northwood's attempts to increase their lead, Bedfont were beginning to get more of a foothold and Hayden-Smith went close as he shot into the side-netting.

However, despite enjoying an increasing amount of possession, Bedfont were struggling to make any real impression on an organised Northwood who were content to sit deep and look to counter – Tingey heading over from a Hutchins cross on one such foray.

Jenkins made way for Kalu on 77 minutes as the former looked to be feeling the effects of a recent thigh problem, the versatile substitute proceeding to look at ease at the right wing-back role.

Northwood continued to look comfortable with another speculative attempt from Hayden-Smith flying wide before a cross from Marco Figueiredo was well out of the reach of any Bedfont attackers.

Josh Helmore was introduced for Hutchins with four minutes left on the clock.

And Woods went close to scoring that elusive second goal as Ibie latched onto a Keagan Cole through-ball, but the shot deflected for a corner.

But one goal was to prove enough as Northwood safely negotiated the five minutes of added time with McCorkell gathering a shot from Sam Evans to make sure of the points and maintain the 100% start to the fledgling season.

Northwood made the perfect start to their league campaign with a well-deserved win in a topsy-turvy encounter at the Skyline Roofing Stadium.

The Woods had to make some last-minute adjustments as central defender Romario Jonas pulled up in the pre-match warm up - skipper Keagan Cole returning to the sweeper role in between James Gurteen and James Budden with Luke Tingey replacing Sam Jenkins in the right wing-back berth while Brandon Kalu was given his debut on the opposite flank in the absence of the unavailable Andy Lomas.

There was also an enforced change up front as Josh Helmore was still feeling the effects of a kick to the lower back suffered the previous week, Lindell Stewart taking on the central striker's role supported by Sydney Ibie and Ronan Hutchins.

Northwood were immediately on the front foot as Ibie made a foray into the visitor's box with his shot being gathered by goalkeeper James Shaw.

But Woods were rocked as the Terrors took the lead with just three minutes on the clock, Enoch Ako-Adjei breaking free before firing a rasping shot into the far corner of the net.

The Woods had a wonderful opportunity to post an immediate response as Tingey's strong run and cross picked out Ibie in the six-yard box but unfortunately the ball fell to the latter's weaker left foot as he lifted his effort over the Tooting crossbar.

Following the lively start, the game slipped into a spell with neither side creating any clear openings as

the players took the first of several water breaks as they contended with the extreme heat.

The Terrors were the first to show after the break as Mbango latched onto the loose ball following a penalty appeal for handball, but he dragged his shot wide of the target.

However, Northwood were made to pay for their sluggish start to the second period as some sloppy play at the back allowed Ajani Domingo-Carrington to play in Ayman Dahdouh who gave Woods keeper Andrew McCorkell no chance with a clinical finish to draw Tooting level on 51 minutes.

But Tooting's joy at getting back into the contest was short-lived as Kalu's deep cross found the on-rushing Hutchins who steered his header inside the post to put Northwood back in front with 53 minutes on the clock.

Northwood went close to extending their lead as Ibie combined with Hutchins to create an opening for Lindell Stewart whose shot was dealt with by keeper Shaw.

And Woods had another opportunity to consolidate


their lead as Stewart played in Ibie but Shaw was up to the challenge once again.







ASHFORD TOWN (MIDDX)

A BRIEF HISTORY

For many years, it was assumed that Ashford Town Football Club was formed in 1964.

However, subsequent research indicated the club was formed in 1958 as Ashford Albion and first competed in the Hounslow & District League.

The Club was elected to the Surrey Intermediate League (Western) in 1967 and promoted at the end of their first season.

The Ash Trees were League Cup finalists in 1970-71 and League runners-up in 1972-73. In 1974-75, Ashford enjoyed their best season under the managership of ex-Fulham player Frank Reid, winning the League by three points from perennial contenders Merrow.

In 1982-83 an invitation was extended by Surrey County FA to become founder members of the Surrey County Premier League.

The invitation was readily accepted and Ashford played their first match in the new league on 4 September 1982, drawing 0-0 away to Farleigh Rovers.

The Club acquired its own ground in August 1985, when a long lease was signed with Spelthorne Borough Council, enabling the Club to move to its present home at Short Lane, Stanwell.

Facilities were quickly developed, floodlights were erected in September 1995, whilst the pitch is railed all round and partly walled, with standing covered accommodation, plus a purpose built 150-seater stand, built in 1998.

An additional 100 seats were installed on the opposite side of the ground to this stand in 2006, after the club won promotion to the Isthmian League Premier Division.

Runners-up spot in the Surrey Premier League was secured and with it the opportunity to enter senior football, as members of the Combined Counties League, senior status having been granted in May 1990.

It was at this point that the club changed its name to Ashford Town (Middlesex) FC, to avoid confusion with the Kent club of the same name.

During its ten year membership of the Combined Counties League, the Club never finished below sixth place, and after finishing 3rd and 2nd in seasons 1992-93 and 93-94, it went on to win the League Championship for four successive seasons.

With the ground up to the required standard, Ashford took their place in the Isthmian League for season 2000-01 and by finishing in third place, secured promotion to Division Two at the first attempt.

Further progress was made in 2003-04 as the Club finished 12th in Division 1 South.

The Club embarked upon new adventures in season 2004-05 in the Southern League for the first time.

The Fourth Qualifying Round of the FA Cup was reached for the first time and Mark Butler, renowned goal scorer in his day with Aldershot Town, Staines Town and others was promoted from Assistant Manager to Manager following the resignation of Nathan Wharf in December 2004.

The play-offs were reached but resulted in a narrow defeat at Evesham United after extra time. In 2005-06, Ashford went one better, finishing second in Division One West of the Southern League, to secure promotion to Step 3.

This brought about a return to the Isthmian League

for season 2006-07 and saw Ashford competing at their highest ever level.

The season brought consolidation of the new status with the added bonus of reaching and winning the Westview (League) Cup Final when Ashford triumphed 4-1 over Dover Athletic at Bromley.

The 2008-09 season saw Ashford begin the campaign in electrifying form, winning their opening six matches to top the table. Mark Butler's side followed this up with a fantastic FA Cup run which saw them come agonisingly close to eliminating Forest Green Rovers in the Fourth Qualifying Round at Short Lane.

Rovers won the replay and went on to run Derby County close in the Third Round. Ashford endured a difficult winter, which saw them flirt with relegation, before a late resurgence saw the side safely into mid-table.

The cup competitions added much adventure to the season, as Ashford followed up their exploits in the FA Cup with runs to the semi-finals of both the Middlesex Senior and Isthmian League Cups and end their campaign by defeating Conference Premier outfit Woking 3-2 at Metropolitan Police to win the Surrey Senior Cup.

The 2009-10 season saw Ashford relegated back to Step 4 after a turbulent campaign. In 2011-12, in the Middlesex Charity Cup Final, the Ash Trees were 3-0 down to Northwood after 48 minutes before substitute Kofi

Lockhart-Adams scored four times to put his team ahead.

The game finished 4-4, with Ashford winning the penalty shoot-out 4-2. An awful start to the 2013-14 season saw the Ash Trees cut adrift at the foot of the Southern League Central Division and although they improved relegation back to Step 5 followed on the final day of the season.

The Ash Trees first campaign back in the competition saw Ashford finish third, while their second saw Town claim promotion and return to Step 4 after finishing second to Hartley Wintney whose ground didn't have a sufficient grading.

2018-19 saw Ashford start the season well and were contending for a play-off spot before a poor run of form saw them slip down and finish the season in mid-table.

Another good run in the Middlesex FA Charity Cup saw them reach the final, finishing runners up after a 2-1 defeat to Uxbridge.


A poor season the following year was curtailed due to Covid and the following year was pretty much wiped out by the pandemic too.

Last season, Ashford eventually finished in thirteenth place but only a couple of points above the relegation play-off places having had to cope with Manager Luke Tufts moving on to Leatherhead.

He was replaced by current boss, former goalkeeper Paul McCarthy.
