

Good afternoon and a very warm welcome to you all and thank you again for your support. Today we get back to League action after quite a gap and we welcome Chertsey Town. We hope you all enjoy your stay with us and wish you a safe journey home.

Tributes have poured in worldwide following the death of England's longest reigning monarch, Queen Elizabeth II, aged 96 last week.

Last Thursday following her passing there were moving tributes from various clubs playing in European Football that evening including the image in Zurich of the Queen smiling and portrayed on the big screen while both sets of players at the game gathered around the centre circle for a minutes' silence.

For most of us, all we have ever known was Queen Elizabeth II and images of her 70-year reign can long be remembered going all the way back to 1966 when The Queen presented the Jules Rimet trophy to the winning captain, Bobby Moore, after England's 4-2 win over West Germany in 1966.

She, like the rest of England, understood the importance of football to the nation she stood at the head of for over 70 years.

Two years ago, she sent a message to England manager Gareth Southgate before the Euro 2020 final against Italy last year saying: "Fifty-five years ago, I was fortunate to present the World Cup to Bobby Moore and saw what it meant to the players, management and support staff to reach and win the final of a major international football

tournament."

Indeed, two years following the 1966 success she travelled to Brazil and footballing legend Pele said on Twitter: "I have been a great admirer of Queen Elizabeth II since the first time I saw her in person, in 1968, when she came to Brazil to witness our love for football and experienced the magic of a packed Maracanã. Her deeds have marked generations. This legacy will last forever."

We all join millions of people who want to celebrate her life and mourn her passing – may she rest in peace.

In the league, our start to the season has been impressive and with four wins from four matches, it demonstrates the resilience of this squad.

However, the long campaign has only just started. We have a long way to go and although setbacks will occur there's no better motivation 'than winning' games so let's hope that our form can continue and we can continue to be a competitive side throughout this season and as I have said before and set a marker for what we would like to achieve going forward.

Once again, I would like to close by saying thank you to every one of you, your support is outstanding.

The club will hopefully continue to grow, thanks to everyone's hard work both on the pitch and behind the scenes.

WOODS OUTLOOK

Back to the Grind

After the excitement of our midweek FA Trophy game, it's a warm welcome back to the Skyline Roofing Stadium this afternoon as we get back to the serious stuff of the Pitching In Isthmian League with a home game against Chertsey Town FC.

The Curfews enjoyed a brilliant campaign in 2021/22, finishing second to runaway Champions Bracknell Town and they were incredibly close to winning the play-offs before a late slip against 10-men Hanwell Town in the closing stages of the final saw the Middlesex club seal promotion.

In the aftermath of that, manager Ian Selley stepped down from his role at Chertsey and the Curfews then managed to prise apart the partnership of joint managers at Hanwell, luring Wayne Carter into his first club in sole charge while leaving Chris Moore in a similar position with the Geordies at the heady heights of Step 3 football. Both men are well known to us here at Northwood and Wayne will receive a warm welcome from Woods fans as he played over 200 games for the club back in the early years of this Century and his name actually appears on our current Northwood "legends" shirt!

We wish Wayne well in his latest managerial role, but obviously only after this afternoon is over.

Despite needing to make changes to the squad, his side have started the season well enough with just one defeat in their opening six fixtures; though that loss at Hanworth Villa in the FA Cup will have hurt a bit. They remain unbeaten in the League though and have notched two emphatic wins – 4-0 against South Park on the opening day of the season and then 5-0 away at Sutton Common Rovers three weeks ago. Their other three games have ended in draws – away at another unbeaten team in Binfield (1-1) but they have also been held in home games against Hanworth Villa (1-1) and Southall (2-2). They arrive here as the division's current top scorers. However, on Tuesday night they, like ourselves, crashed out of the FA Trophy, losing 1-3 at home to Uxbridge.

Last season saw both sides win their respective away games. The Woods travelled to Alwyns Lane in early December and ended a long unbeaten run by pulling off a shock 4-2 victory which won the club the "Performance of the Month" Award from the Isthmian League. The Woods

opened up a 2-0 lead with goals from Micah Jackson and Ryan Young. Then, after the Curfews pulled back level through Manolis Gogonas and Jake Baxter, two goals from Sydney Ibie secured all three points.

Chertsey visited us here at Northwood in early April when they were still looking to secure second place and home ties in the play-offs. They dominated the first-half and led 2-1 at the break. Jake Baxter put the Curfews ahead and after Carl Stewart had levelled, Manolis Gogonas netted with a piledriver. Baxter notched a second after the break to make it fairly safe and then Gary Abisogun netted a late fourth to wrap up the victory.

Isuzu FA Trophy

Sadly, our own run in the FA Trophy proved less than impressive on Tuesday night as we crashed out at the first hurdle, in a home game against an impressive Hanworth Villa side who go into the next round on the back of a 3-0 success. All the goals came in the second-half and two of them in the final five minutes of a match which saw the Woods never playing at their best. Our thanks to those who ventured out on a wet night and with the traffic problems caused by local road closures. It was still a disappointing attendance though and hopefully we can get back to the numbers we need this afternoon as we defend our current 100% league record.

August Manager of the Month Award

We were delighted to hear that the Woods run of League success in August has resulted in Steve Ringrose and Ben Bukowski being rewarded with the Vita Risk Solutions Manager of the Month award. It's the first time that the club have received such an accolade for quite some time (even I can't remember the last time)! Congratulations to them both, their coaching team and the whole squad on the achievement and let's hope we can build on that in the months to come too. The award should be officially presented to the one of the duo at a game in the near future.

Other Cup News

Other Cup draws took place a few weeks ago. In the Velocity Isthmian League Cup, the Woods, with a bye in the First Round, have been drawn away to Walton & Hershham in the second round with the deadline to play

the game being mid-October – no date has been set for that as yet but the 18th looks favourite.

In the Middlesex Senior Cup, we will play now familiar opponents in Ashford Town (Middlesex) here at the Skyline Roofing Stadium and that date is fixed as Tuesday 11th October 2022. Like most teams in the competition, we have been given a bye to the Second Round of the Middlesex Charity Cup but the draw for that round hasn't been made as yet.

Player News

Nebay Haile's second spell with the Woods didn't last too long. Having scored twice in a pre-season game he also picked up a hamstring injury and was only fit to return to the squad a couple of weeks ago. He made one 7-minute appearance as a sub against Westfield but then decided to join our divisional rivals Sutton Common Rovers following a seven-day approach from the Surrey side. He joins former Woods Matt Surmon and Daniel Purdue at Rovers and we wish him well at his new club.

Woods rallied towards the end but it was, all too little too late, and they went out of the competition at the first hurdle.



A half-time roasting from manager John Walsh was the tonic Northwood needed to keep up their great start to the Diadora League season. They rarely showed in the first half of this Division Three encounter at Horsham but turned it around after the break to make it four wins and a draw from five matches.

Horsham gave the Northwood defence plenty of problems during a torrid opening 45 minutes, and Rod Romain and Steve Payton had to be on top of their game to keep Woods in it.

Goalkeeper Kevin Beckles was in tremendous form as well, catching and saving everything fired his way.



The second half was a different story as Woods clicked with the words of their boss still ringing in their ears. It became only a matter of time before they scored, and when

Daren Morris netted from Darren Rowe's cross, Northwood were on their way home.

When Rowe found Lawrence Holmes 20 yards from goal, Holmes could have tried a shot himself, but he shielded the ball from a defender and squared it to the unmarked substitute Simon Walsh to land the killer blow.

"For 45 minutes I was far from happy. I made it crystal clear at half time and that seemed to do the trick," said Walsh after the match.


2019 Woods 3 Staines Town 1

Northwood achieved their first league win of the season at the sixth attempt with a deserved win over fellow strugglers Staines Town. Woods were looking to overcome their worst start to a season since they lost their opening five Southern Premier games back in 2005.

Northwood were quickly into their stride, playing with a verve and tempo which had the Swans on the backfoot and the lively Kweku Lucan wasn't far away with a confident strike from distance. And Lucan was central to Northwood taking an 11th minute lead, latching onto a long ball from the back and playing in skipper Alex Witham, who finished with aplomb.

Staines looked to hit back and launched a series of attacks with the dangerous Che Krabbendam creating an opening for Scott Walker whose shot was blocked before the latter saw another effort parried by goalkeeper James Hoskins.

Woods were coping well with the Staines response, Jaiden Irish



working well in midfield and the burgeoning central defensive partnership of Liam McCrohan and Andrew Tirivanhu looking increasingly assured. And Northwood extended their lead when Gerrar could only parry a fierce shot from Patrick Campbell, and Harry Lodovica was on hand to bundle the ball home on 36 minutes.

Woods went in search of further goals before the break, Witham combining well again with Hayford whose shot narrowly cleared the crossbar before Lucan's run and

cross found Pett who saw his shot tipped over by Gerrar. And Northwood created another opening with the last kick of an entertaining first half, Lucan running onto Lodovica's flick-on but dragging his shot wide.

Northwood continued in the same vein after the break with Lucan missing a couple of gilt-edged chances while Lodovica saw his effort deflected for a corner. But having squandered the opportunities to put the game to bed, the inevitable happened as Staines pulled a goal back on 54 minutes as Dara Dada-Anite's speculative strike took a wicked deflection and flew beyond the reach of the back-peddalling Hoskins.

However, after enduring a sustained spell of pressure, Woods restored the two-goal margin on 78 minutes, Hayford's delightful free-kick being headed home at the far post by McCrohan for his first Northwood goal.

Northwood's mood matched that of the weather as they suffered their second home cup exit of the season at a rain-drenched Skyline Roofing Stadium.

Woods were unchanged from the team which last played two weeks previously for the rearranged tie against their league rivals who were making their first visit to Northwood.

Hanworth were on the offensive from the start forcing a succession of corners which were dealt with by the home defence. But the Villains maintained their strong start with Tom Bender inches away from giving his side the lead with sweetly struck free-kick which narrowly cleared the Northwood crossbar.

Having weathered the early storm, Woods began to make an impression with Sam Jenkins trying his luck from distance, Sydney Ibie working himself into a good position but miscuing his shot while a Luke Tingey throw caused a scramble in the visitors' box.

The contest had a nice ebb and flow as chances continued to be created at both ends – Hanworth's Tom Scott seeing his shot deflected into the side-netting before Bender had his header from a corner athletically clawed away by Woods keeper Andrew McCorkell.

At the other end, another jinking run from Ibie caused panic in the Hanworth box but the Northwood attacker dallied on his shot and was crowded out before a Ronan Hutchins corner was headed back by Tingey but wouldn't quite fall right for Ibie who shot over on the bounce.

The first period continued to be an open affair with Northwood surviving a goalmouth scramble as they struggled to clear the ball with Scott finally firing over the woodwork before Bruno Tingle shot wildly over from



a good position.

The hosts' main threat continued to be Ibie as he got to the byline and saw his cross-shot skim the Villains crossbar before Hutchins slid the ball through to Josh Helmore whose heavy touch allowed goalkeeper Terry Buss to smother the danger.

Hanworth came out strongly after the half-time break with debut man Jonathan Hippolyte having an effort blocked before the same player fired over after a quickly taken free-kick. And the Villains got their just reward as they took the lead on 50 minutes, Bender heading home from a corner.

Hanworth went close to adding a second moments later, but Northwood managed to survive a game of ping-pong in their own box. While Woods looked to respond as they won a free-kick in a useful position, but Keagan Cole's effort failed to trouble Buss.

Northwood made their first change on the hour as

Carl Stewart replaced Ergys Pepaj in the midfield as they looked to gain some control in the centre of the park, but the visitors continued to threaten as Duncan Culley tried his luck with a shot on the turn that flew past the far upright.

Woods looked to step up their tempo with Jenkins threading a pass through to Cole whose backheel just failed to find Helmore who was ready to pounce while an lbie/Cole combination caused alarm in the Hanworth box as a succession of shots were charged down by the resolute Villains rearguard.

The visitors made a couple of substitutions as they looked to shore things up. And as much as Woods tried, their decision making and poor execution in the final third


meant Buss remained untroubled in the Hanworth goal.

Northwood's frustrations increased as they failed again to deal with a Hanworth corner, Bender scoring his second of the evening with five minutes left on the clock.

Rahim Jude-Boyd was introduced for Jenkins for only his second Northwood appearance, but Hanworth's passage to the next round was confirmed as they added a thiridon 89 minutes, substitute Jordan Ellis' volley taking a massive deflection as it flew beyond McCorkell.

Buss was called into action in the closing seconds as the Hanworth keeper collected a Riccardo Alexander-Greenaway back-header from Tingey's throw but it wasn't to be on a disappointing night for the Woods.





IN CONVERSATION WITH HEAD COACH **BEN BUKOWSKI**

In the first of what we hope will be a regular series, our Press Liaison man Robin Piper caught up with Head Coach Ben before the Hanworth Villa Trophy match.

Firstly Ben, congratulations to you and Steve on winning the divisional manager of the month award for August.

Thank you. It was great to pick up our first managerial award, but this is recognition of the work the whole team has put in, coaches Richard and Harry, physios Dan and Elizabeth and of course the players. Four league wins out four is not easy at any level.

And very much a continuation of the good work which began with your arrival last November. Looking

back to last season, what were your thoughts when you arrived at the club?

It was clear during the initial conversations with Ian Barry and Alan Evans that there was as big sense of frustration at where the club found itself after the high turnover of managers and a sense of being let down slightly. The discussions evolved around the need to not only improve things on the pitch but in turn to find the right sort of players to help the atmosphere off the pitch and get the feel-good factor back among supporters and in the clubhouse.

There is no question that that was achieved in a remarkably short space of time with a swift overhaul of the squad.

Yes, it was clear to see the work that was going to be required from the couple of games we watched before our appointment was confirmed. But there was a confidence that between Steve, Andy, Keagan and me that we had the know-how and contacts to get the club pointing in the right direction both on and off the pitch.

And that turnaround involved an amazing run of away wins against some top sides. Do you have a particular favourite from that run?

My favourite has to be the Basingstoke game not only because of the result but how that was achieved. We do a lot of prep on the opposition before games with analysis of video footage where it's available, watching games

where we can or getting reports from others as well sharing information with other managers. We spent a lot of time discussing the shape of the team and we made some adjustments to combat a couple of their dangermen and that was achieved as they were nullified with one of the players being substituted well before the end. It was also good to hear their manager acknowledging our performance in the post-match interview.

One player who made a big impact at the club last season was Teddy Stacey. Sadly, we haven't seen Teddy in action this campaign but can I ask what the latest is with him?

Yes, Teddy has been a big player for us in lots of ways. Unfortunately, he developed a knee problem during pre-season which required complete rest and has prevented him from training. Thankfully he can now commence light training and is working on a rehab plan with Dan and we are hoping to see him back on the pitch before too long.

Looking forward to Teddy's return that will only strengthen our options which are looking good in all departments.

We have real competition for places and options that perhaps we didn't always have last season. I think this was evident in both the Tooting and Southall games, especially the latter when we were able to bring on the experience and ariel strength of James Budden to counter Southall's growing threat and increasingly direct play. Those were the games we would probably have drawn last season.

I agree, and I guess having those options and flexibility has allowed you to tinker with the formation in recent games with a switch to a flat back four.

Yes, it has. You always need to be flexible and have a plan B both between and within games. We didn't always get it right last season when you compare our success on the road, which was very much based on a counter-attacking style, with our results at home. I think we struggled at times to impose ourselves and dictate the

play in the way the home side should do. I think the results so far this season show we might be turning the corner in that respect. And the pitch being narrowed slightly in the summer has helped!

Yes, sorry about that! I've always been an advocate of a wider pitch but hopefully we have got it right now. Talking about the pitch, you must be delighted with the surface, considering the dry summer we've had, which allows you to play your football.

Absolutely. The pitch is superb so credit to the chairman and the groundsman for that. But as we know, we don't always get to play on such pitches especially in the winter months and that brings us back to what we talked about before – experience and flexibility to adapt to the conditions in order to get the desired result.

Can we talk about your football history and your coaching career prior to coming to Northwood? I understand you have previously worked closely with Hampton & Richmond Borough manager Gary McCann.

I have been lucky enough to work with Gary at both Hendon and Hampton. I never hit the heights as a player so focused on coaching from an early age and managed to get a couple of coaching badges under my belt when I was 16. I was involved with junior club Whetstone Wanderers and we basically took a team, including Keagan, across to Hendon which became their under 18s. I was then invited to the first team coaching sessions and my involvement grew from there, learning so much from Gary, along with Scott Cousins and Freddie Hyatt.

And Hendon had quite a useful team under Gary as I remember?

We did, with players like Northwood old boy Niko Muir alongside Luke Tingey and Keags of course. We had a great season when we just missed out on promotion from the Isthmian Premier losing to Dulwich Hamlet in the play-off final. Then Gary moved onto Hampton and I was fortunate to be asked to join his coaching team which was a great experience, a highlight being the televised FA Cup 1st Round tie when we pushed Oldham Athletic all the way. Unfortunately work pressure and the amount of travelling involved meant I had to make a tough decision to call it a day with the club.

You mentioned working with Under 18s. I recently had the pleasure of watching Ryan Young's team beat Uxbridge in the FA Youth Cup and there was certainly

some talent on show. Last season there were a number of youngsters in the 1st team squad so there is clearly a pathway for these players.

Yes, we will always give youth a chance. Will Robinson and Lewis Batten were regularly involved last season. Unfortunately, Will's broken ankle hampered his pre-season preparation and he is now working his way back to fitness and looking to get regular game time at step 5 Leverstock Green. Likewise, Lewis missed much of pre-season and is currently training and looking to get some games at Broadfields alongside Kristian Belousas, who has been amongst the goals already this season. We are keeping close tabs on the development of these players while holding a registration for them.

Away from the football, how do you spend your time?

The football is almost a full-time job, as my girlfriend Becky will tell you. Luckily Becky is into her football and recently accompanied me as I ran the rule over Hanworth Villa at a recent match. My day job is in marketing – we have a little band of marketeers at the club with Andy Lomas and Josh Helmore also being in the business. When I'm not in the Northwood dugout I try and get to watch my team West Ham with my other love being local team Barnet who I have followed since I was a kid watching them at Underhill. I've recently been getting into F1 while the dog walking keeps me fit.

Finally Ben, what are your footballing ambitions as you get into your second season as Head Coach?

I'm keen to keep developing as a coach and progressing as a manager. I'm learning a lot by working closely with Steve and seeing how he interacts with players and deals with the man-management side of things. I am ambitious and would like to manage at the highest level possible of course – my fantasy would be the West Ham job but I am realistic! However, you look at the Cowley brothers who progressed from the lower levels of non-league to the professional game and anything is possible.

Thank you for your time, Ben and we look forward to an exciting season as you continue to lead the Woods revival.



lor's header as it looped beyond Purdue, the Northwood right-back scrambling back to hook the ball clear from under the crossbar.







CHERTSEY TOWN

A BRIEF HISTORY

Organised football was evident in Chertsey well into the Victorian era, but county affiliation did not take place immediately.

The official founding of the club took place in 1890 when matches were played in the West Surrey League. The first success came in 1897 when the Surrey Junior Cup was secured. A one year gap took place before football resumed in the same competition which eventually became the East and West Surrey League. A further halt in football took place during the Great War but soon after, in 1919, the club joined the Surrey Intermediate League where it stayed, uneventfully, until 1939 and a further break. An invitation to become founder members of the Surrey Senior League was not taken up in 1923 but membership was later assumed, on attaining senior status in 1946.

The club has played at various locations within the parish (Willow Walk, Free Prae Road Staines Lane and Chilsey Green) before settling down at the present home in 1926. The suffix 'Town' was added to its title some 24 years later. The ground was donated by Sir Edward Stern as a football ground to the 'premier club in the parish'. Next door, a similar trust provides facilities for Chertsey Cricket Club. The main stand was constructed in the mid fifties; the original clubhouse added in 1960 and the first covered enclosure was built some three years later. Cover behind each goal was added in 1994 and 2010 respectively.

Chertsey became members of the Surrey Senior League in 1946, but success was scant until 1960 when winning the league championship. This was repeated twice in the next three years. The League Cup was also won on three occasions. The club could not progress to the preferred Corinthian League so, in 1963 it contro-

versially turned professional to enter the Metropolitan League. It gave an entertaining three but, the cost was too much. A drop to the Greater London League for one season occurred before a further shift to the Spartan League was made in 1967.

Indifferent results then dogged the club for almost two decades. This situation was briefly relieved in 1974/75 when the club were league and league cup runners up to an up and coming Farnborough Town. Meanwhile, the fabric of the club was being built up behind the scenes and despite lack of prominence on the park, movement was made via the London Spartan (1975/76) and Athenian leagues through to the Isthmian family with a place in Division Two South in 1984. Instant relegation to the Combined Counties League was suffered but a rejuvenated side won promotion back to Isthmian ranks within the year whilst winning the League Cup on the way.

The club was rewarded with good league positions but further promotion denied at first. The worst season after returning to the Isthmians came when the two Division Twos were split in 1991 and a place in the new Division Three had to suffice. This position was quickly rectified with a runner's up slot the next season. The club also reached the quarter finals of the F.A. Vase, emulating a similar performance in 1987/88. One year later, 102 points and a runner's up promotion place to Division One was nailed. The League Cup was also secured together with the Carlsberg Trophy in the same campaign along with the League Charity Shield and the Isthmian 'Team of the Season' trophy.

Only one campaign was required in Division One before further promotion, to the Premier Division. The

first season at that level was one of consolidation but the second was more difficult. A late rally was experienced, but was insufficient to avoid the drop to Division One. Two subsequent Division One campaigns were comfortable but the third proved too difficult after a very poor first half of the season.

Relatively respectable positions were attained for the next two seasons and then a return to Division One, taking a place in the revised south section in the Isthmian re-organisation. The side was not able to compete at this level and relegation to Division Two was suffered in 2003. With the dissolution of the division, the club was allocated to Combined Counties League in 2006. Promotionally hopeful situations were created regularly over the five terms in that competition.

Finishing as runners up in 2011 was enough to secure promotion to Division One Central of the Southern League. Unspectacular, but safe, performances were achieved for two seasons but relegation was suffered in 2014, and with it a return to the Combined Counties League where four modest seasons prevailed.

A massive change occurred in the 2018/19 season that resulted in the league championship being secured

with 13 points to spare. This led to promotion back to the Isthmian ranks and a place in the South Central Division. However, more memorable, was winning the FA Vase after turning over the score in the final to beat Cray Valley 3-1. The combination of these two feats made the 2018/19 the most successful season ever for the club. Covid affected the next two campaigns, but then a runners up spot was attained at the end of the 2021/22 season but the side lost out in extra time of the final of the play offs.

Dave Anderson was the team manager who masterminded this success but stood down at the end of the FA Vase campaign. Team captain Kevin Maclaren then took over followed by Ian Selley, and now for the start of the current season, Wayne Carter is in charge. The chairman's role is held Mark Turner. The club, a Charter Standard member, also has a comprehensive junior section of boys at all ages. Chertsey Town's nickname, the 'Curfews' is derived from a locally famous bell that hangs in the nearby St. Peters Church. The bell has rung out the evening curfew, now ceremoniously of course, for over five hundred years.

Central defender who was signed in the 2021 close season from Ashford Town. Has also played for Barton Rovers. Took a short spell at Carshalton Athletic at the start of the 2022/23 season, but quickly returned.


