WELCOME TO THE BECKS

A warm welcome to the Skyline Roofing Stadium for another Isuzu FA Trophy fixture where we play hosts to Isthmian League Division One South East side Beckenham Town for the first-ever time. The closest we have ever been to being opponents in the past was back in the 1980s as Beckenham were members of the London Spartan League until transferring to the Kent League in 1982. The Woods were then playing in the Hellenic League, transferring over to the London Spartan League in 1984 so missing out being adversaries by two years.

The Woods first entered the FA Trophy competition in the year 2000, following our promotion from the then Division Two of the Isthmian League and into Division One. We actually won our first two matches in the competition – away at Dartford and at home to Purfleet – before losing at Canvey Island. It's not been a cup competition where we have thrived for sure, 2009-10 being the only season where we have managed to get through three rounds. Two weeks ago, our 3-1 win over Hanworth Villa was the first time we had progressed through the initial round, other than winning a couple of penalty shoot-outs (we have won two/lost two), since a shock 6-3 victory away at Dorking Wanderers back in 2016-17. But win we did and now we look to progress a bit further!

The Becks, like most clubs at Step 4, received a "bye" in the Preliminary Round so start their Trophy campaign today. It's their fourth season playing in the tournament following their own Step 5 promotion back in 2022 and they are currently still looking for their first-ever victory in the competition having lost opening round games against Heybridge Swifts (on penalties), Three Bridges and Raynes Park Vale over the previous three years.

Having finished in sixth place in the table last season, just missing out on the play-offs, manager Del Oldfield chose to retire and the Becks have given a first managerial role to Danny Waldren, a vastly-experienced midfield player and a former player at Beckenham Town. With a very experienced side, our opponents have made a disappointing start to

their League campaign and were going into a tough home match against Sittingbourne on Tuesday night without a win from their first four matches and sitting fourth from bottom, the same position as ourselves in our own division. Having squeezed out a 1-0 win away at Hassocks in the preliminary round of the FA Cup, it was our own FA Cup conquerors Egham Town who ended their interest in the competition last Saturday when the Sarnies came from behind to win 3-2 at Eden Park Avenue, a great win for the Isthmian South-Central newcomers. Our visitors will certainly be looking to bounce back from that today.

Today's cup-tie does need to be played to a result today and there is no extra-time so if the scores are level after 90 minutes, a penalty shoot-out will decide the winners. The draw for the next round would be on Monday at 1pm.

We are ever-grateful to our sponsors and this week our Match Sponsor is Shamira Hamirani. In addition to this, Graham Mann has kindly sponsored the Match-Ball for our Trophy match so our thanks to both of them. LEAGUE NEWS

The Woods are still searching for our first League win of the season after a disastrous 2-4 home defeat against Rayners Lane back on Bank Holiday Monday. Our opponents arrived bottom of the table without a point and when we went 1-0 up through Devonte Totesaut in the first couple of minutes, it provided a golden opportunity. But, after conceding a goal on the break soon after, we then had a mad few minutes to let in two more in three minutes and suddenly we had a mountain to climb. Jack Empson then headed his first goal for the club to reduce the arrears before half-time and give us some hope. Sadly, we were unable to make dominance count in the second-half and it was the Lane who secured their first-ever Southern League points.

We have of course only played three games so far and there's plenty of time to climb the table and we need

to start that process next weekend when we travel to play Aylesbury United who have notched one win in four matches so far. There has been a change in the fixture this week though. The Ducks do of course groundshare at The Meadow, home of Chesham United FC and their landlords were drawn at home in the second qualifying round of the FA Cup when it was made on Monday afternoon (to Kings Lynn Town). This now takes precedence of the Saturday afternoon which means our game will switch to the Sunday, 14th September instead. We are then away at in-form Hertford Town the following weekend. Hertford have won both of their league matches so far and are also still in the FA Cup following a 2-1 away win at Isthmian North side Bowers & Pitsea last Saturday. They play away at National League South side Chelmsford City next Saturday in the second qualifying round.

CUP NEWS

The draw for the first round of the Middlesex Senior Cup has been made and the Woods were one of the ten clubs who missed out on a "bye" to round two (II others made it). The Woods will play away to Step 5 strugglers Edgware & Kingsbury in that opening round and this will be played on Tuesday 23rd September at 7.45pm. The club play at Silver Jubilee

Park which they share along with Hendon FC. The other first round matches are: Broadfields United v Harrow Borough; QPR U2Is v Harefield United; North Greenford United v Ashford Town (Middx) and British Airways v Brentford B.

The Woods have also entered the Middlesex Charity Cup for this season but the draw has not been made at the time of writing.

PLAYER NEWS

Last Saturday the Woods played another friendly fixture against our friends from Hendon FC with both clubs being free after exiting the FA Cup in previous rounds. The match ended 1-1 and the goalscorer in the first-half for the Woods was a familiar face in Dan Williams. Dan has since signed for the Woods for a third spell at the club. Dan originally joined the Woods from Uxbridge in February 2023, left for a brief spell back at Uxbridge before returning the same season to take the Golden Boot with 17 goals in 41 matches. He has since played at Harrow Borough and Bedfont Sports where his goals helped his side win promotion back to Step 4 in April. Welcome back Dan!

Injuries ruled out skipper Manny Folarin for our last game but we are hopeful that he will be fit to return for today's cup-tie. Harry McCorkell was due to hear

The youngsters were successful in their first Isthmian Youth League game of the season with a 4-1 victory over Fleet Town a couple of weeks ago. Henry Atkinson, who went on to make his first-team debut a few days later, notched two goals and there was one each for debutants Caleb Wright and Rowan Daly while goalkeeper Matt Burrows saved a penalty.

Next up was a rematch with Tring Athletic in the FA Youth Cup on Wednesday night but these notes had to go to print before the result of that one was known. Always a top side, a tough match was expected so we will need to have been on top form if we were to be successful and make it through to the next round – which would be at home to Hayes & Yeading on Wednesday 17th September after they won 5-2 at Hanwell Town on Monday night this week.

The side are back in action this week with what is probably a far too early introduction into the Isthmian Youth League Cup competition and another tough fixture away at old foes Bedfont Sports. This is scheduled for Monday night, 8th September at 7.45pm. At present, remarkably there is no home game scheduled until the end of the following month – current leaders Maidenhead United on Wednesday 29th October.




The Woods notched their first win of the new season with this Isuzu FA Trophy success, their first win in the competition for four years while also ending a five straight defeats against their opponents over the last few seasons.

With two home games scheduled inside three days, the management team know they need to make full use of the available squad so changes were made with two teenagers coming in in the full-back positions.

Brian McGovern, star of last season's Under-18s, replaced the holidaying Mack Miskin at left-back while current Under-18s Henry Atkinson made his first-team debut in the right-back position.

There was also a first start of the season for Joint Manager Jon-Jo Bates in midfield with Carl Stewart rested, a debut for Hicham Bouchareb, after a patient





wait for International Clearance, and a first start for another teenager as Jamie Kennedy came in with Devonte Totesaut reverting to the bench.

The visitors had suffered a shock FA Cup defeat a week earlier, going out 3-2 to Step 5 side Soul Tower Hamlets so also chose to similarly make several changes to their own starting line-up but they started brightly enough and got the first effort on goal after 11 minutes when Marco Haigh forced Hafed Al-Droubi to push a shot wide. While the resulting corner was half-cleared, it was recycled and from a deep cross, George Wells headed back across goal and against the crossbar.

13 MINUTES: 1-0 HICHAM BOUCHAREB

But just two minutes later, the Woods grabbed the lead with a great goal on the counter-attack.

It was the two players making their debuts that combined with Atkinson supplying the perfect ball from midfield which allowed Bouchareb to run behind his marker and then finished clinically with a precise left-foot strike.

The Villains should probably have levelled on twenty minutes when a stray ball across midfield was seized upon by Guy Ansah-Palmer who rushed forward, exchanged passes with Sam Merson and his centre picked out Sam Mead but the striker miskicked in front of goal. It was sustained period of pressure from the visitors at this stage. A corner was headed out by Jack Empson and Abdullah Javaid attempted a first-time



volley which flew well over. Then another deep cross to the far post picked out Merson but his header lacked the direction to beat Al-Droubi who gratefully caught his effort

45 + 1 MINUTES: 2-0 JAMIE KENNEDY

After this, the Woods began to enjoy more possession but without threatening in the final third until half-time was approaching. Then, Atkinson started another attack, finding Dylan Kearney centrally. He arrowed a great ball wide for Bouchareb to race down the left and his excellent cross was expertly flicked past goalkeeper Mark Smith by Kennedy for his first goal in Northwood colours.

HALF-TIME: NORTHWOOD 2-0 HANWORTH VILLA

Two goals in front when the second-half got underway, the Woods continued to defend solidly with Empson particularly strong in the air and Villa, who had been forced into one change at the break, made a further double-substitution ten minutes later. It had almost instant results as a corner was headed goalwards by the ever-dangerous Wells but Al-Droubi managed to push it away and Guy Hollis could only stab the loose ball wide of the post.

64 MINUTES: 2-1 DYLAN RANDALL

Another change followed for the visitors as Merson was replaced by Dylan Randall and this one did make an immediate difference as Javaid got down the left and sent over a fierce cross-shot that Al-Droubi could only

parry and it was Randall who pounced to net from close-range on sixty-four minutes.

75 MINUTES: 3-1 DYLAN KEARNEY

With hopes raised for Hanworth, they went in search of an equaliser but Northwood were still dogged in defence and ten minutes later they grabbed an allimportant third goal. Ademide Baruwa won the ball in midfield and found Kennedy who provided another defence-splitting pass which allowed Kearney to burst through the centre and he raced into the box before crashing a shot into the top corner to give Smith no chance.

That was pretty much contest over as a series of substitutions saw the Woods introduce fresh legs which kept the Villa at bay and there were no scares despite the additional seven minutes at the end. Northwood had one late chance with a free-kick just outside the box which Jack Smith, on as a late sub, took responsibility for but it curled just wide of the post.



Northwood got off to the very best of starts and it was their defenders who played the starring role. Just into the third minute. Dean Clark curled in a free-kick which **Brad Hewitt** flicked on and Jazz Rose stole in round the back to plant the perfect header



back across goalkeeper Jamie Riley and into the top corner.

The rest of the half belonged to Northwood as the home side were unable to gain any control. Danny Hart was getting involved with forays down the flank and had already had one attempt at goal before he knocked in a great cross to Abdul Yoki who saw his shot tipped over the bar by Riley. 

Looking to follow up their excellent FA Trophy victory just forty eight hours earlier, a muchchanged Northwood team proved unable to match that performance and their attempt to notch their first Southern League win of the season proved unsuccessful.

Only five of the starters from the Saturday began this match against their Middlesex neighbours, who were also looking for their first win, as back in came Nasir Sharifi, Mack Miskin, Carl Stewart, Osa Otote, Rico Clarke-Rowe and Devonte Totesaut. Ruled out of the squad completely were skipper Manny Folarin, Jon-Jo Bates and Dylan Kearney, all with injury while Brian McGovern and Jordan Ellis were also left out while Reece Price-Placid and Ademide Baruwa were rested to the bench alongside Harry McKenna who was returning after picking up an injury in the opening home friendly.





The visitors have had a summer of rebuilding with a new manager and team so will be looking for gradual improvement and their squad included former Woods Ergys Pepai, Meshach Williams and Jeremy Stewart.

1 MINUTE: 1-0 DEVONTE TOTESAUT

The Woods started well though and the first minute had only just passed when Osa Otote got the better of his marker out wide on the right and his cross was brought down by Devonte Totesaut's right-foot who then swivelled and lashed home with his left.

14 MINUTES: 1-1 OASIM KHAN

Northwood continued to press and Jamie Kennedy tested visiting goalkeeper Charlie Patmore with a good strike after ten minutes but the Lane were beginning to make inroads themselves and they found an early equaliser just three minutes later as a cross from the left was half-blocked by Jack Empson but only looped up to allow Oasim Khan able to steer a header over the stranded Hafed Al-Droubi.

Pepai put a header wide for the visitors just a couple of minutes later and although Miskin went close for the Woods with a free-kick from just outside the box which flashed just over soon after, the Lane were certainly causing some problems.

A change was made on the half-hour to adjust the defence which wasn't looking solid. Chama Torsiello came into the centre as substitute with Miskin reverting to his more customary left-back role: Sharifi being withdrawn. But it didn't have the desired effect and Rayners Lane suddenly transformed the match with two goals in three minutes.



36 MINUTES: 1-2 FRANKIE BIRCHAM

Firstly, a corner saw several players hit the deck as the ball was headed down at the back post. Williams hooked it goalwards and with two Lane players almost on the goal-line it was headed in by Frankie Bircham. Valid claims for offside were waved away by the assistant referee.

40 MINUTES: 1-3 MESHACH WILLIAMS

The third proved easy as Kean Grover's ball into the box flew over the head of Torsiello and Williams stole in ahead of Atkinson to hit a clean strike across goal and inside the far post.

44 MINUTES: 2-3 JACK EMPSON

Just four minutes later, Northwood got a goal that they needed before the break to give them hopes of a second-half comeback. A free-kick was well-flighted by Henry Atkinson and Jack Empson rose highest with a well-directed header that gave Patmore no chance in goal. It was his first goal for the club in his forty-first appearance. Just before the break, Clarke-Rowe had a good effort pushed over by Patmore as the Woods looked to level.

HALF-TIME: NORTHWOOD 2-3 RAYNERS LANE

Better things were needed in the second-half for the Woods and there were two further changes. Hicham Bouchareb had picked up a knock on his ankle so was replaced by Price-Placid while Baruwa replaced Kennedy.



And the Woods could have been level just two minutes in as Totesaut and Baruwa combined to set up Otote for a shot which fell straight to Clarke-Rowe but his effort from six yards was poor and blocked by Patmore.

Then followed a succession of corners which were mostly well-delivered and threatening from both sides of the pitch but without ever looking likely to get the touch necessary to divert the ball over the line.

Price-Placid had the next real chance to level on seventy two minutes as the ball was well-worked across the pitch and into his path but it needed a first-time strike, he took a touch and his effort was blocked as the visitors continued to work hard to limit opportunities.

The introduction of McKenna as a substitute was welcome following his injury woes but Rayners Lane were able to utilise more subs in the final twenty minutes and it refreshed things for them at the right time.

81 MINUTES: 2-4 BRADLEY WALSH

The killer fourth goal came ten minutes from time when a ball was played wide to one of those substitutes, Bradley Walsh who showed great pace to get past and across McKenna, did the same to Torsiello and fired past Al-Droubi for a excellent solo effort.

There was no comeback from that goal and the game petered out into a second successive home defeat for the Woods to start the league season.

With a long break before the Woods next competitive game, the FA Trophy fixture against Isthmian South-East side Beckenham Town, on Saturday 6th September at the Skyline, the management team are hoping to arrange a friendly or two to keep the games flowing.








The original Beckenham Town were established in the late 19th century, affiliating to the Kent County Football Association in 1887. In 1923, the club joined Division One of the London League. They won Division One in 1927-28, and were promoted to the Premier Division. However, after finishing second-frombottom in their first season in the Premier Division, they ended the 1929-30 season in last place, and were relegated back to Division One.

The following season saw them finish second in Division One, earning promotion back to the

Premier Division. Despite finishing bottom of the Premier Division in 1931-32 they remained in the division, but after repeating the feat in 1932-33, they Division relegated back to Division One. After finishing bottom of Division One in 1934-35 the club left the league They had also entered a team into the Kent County Amateur League a few seasons before, and continued playing in the Premier Division of the Western Section until rejoining the London League in 1951, where they were placed in the Premier Division.

They remained in the London League's Premier Division until joining the Aetolian League in 1961. This merged with the London League in 1964 to form the Greater London League, with Beckenham placed in Section B. A fifth-place finish in the league's inaugural season saw them win a place in the Premier Division for the 1965–66 season. However, after finishing second-from-bottom of the division that season, they were relegated to Division One. The club then folded in 1969

In 1971, the club was reformed based on the Stanhope Rovers junior team. After playing in the South-East London Amateur League, they joined Division Two of the new London Spartan League in 1975. After being runners-up in the Senior League in 1977–78, they were promoted to the Premier Division where they played for four seasons with a highest-place of sixth. In 1982 they transferred across to Division One of the Kent League, which subsequently became the Premier Division in 1998. They finished as runners-up in 2005–06 and were third two years later.

The league was subsequently renamed the Southern Counties East League in 2013. The club won both the Kent Senior Trophy and the League Cup in 2013–14, and went on to win the Roy Vinter Shield at the start of the 2014–15 season. In 2019–20 the club were top of the league when the season was abandoned due to the COVID-19 pandemic; this could have been the club's highest finish since reforming in 1971.

At the end of the 2020–21 season they were again transferred, this time to the Premier Division South of the Combined Counties League. During their very first season, Beckenham were crowned Premier Division South champions, earning promotion to Step 4 and the Isthmian League. In that first season in the Isthmian League the club finished fourth, qualifying for the promotion play-offs but went on to lose narrowly, 1–0 to Whitehawk in the semi-finals. That excellent

first season at Step 4 also saw the club record their best ever FA Cup run, reaching the Fourth Qualifying Round with wins over Horsham YMCA, K Sports, East Grinstead Town, Dartford and Binfield before losing 7-0 at home to Dagenham & Redbridge.

The 2023-24 saw the club finish in the relegation zone of the South East Division, but they were reprieved from relegation and they returned to form last season, heading the table during the first-

half of the campaign but ultimately missing out on the play-offs with a sixth-placed finish.

Manager Del Oldfield retired from his role in the summer of 2025 and the Becks have given a first managerial appointment to vastly-experienced midfielder Danny Waldren who has previously played for the club and he will be looking to build the club up for another stab at promotion.
