

IAN'S INSIGHT

WOODS CHAIRMAN, IAN BARRY, WELCOMES YOU ALL TO THE SKYLINE ROOFING STADIUM.

Good evening and welcome to the Skyline Roofing Stadium and our C & G Scaffolding Ltd sponsored clubhouse for today's Pitching In Southern League fixture. We extend our welcome to our visitors from Hadley FC and trust they enjoy their short stay here.

Starting with the football of course; very disappointing to be out of the FA Cup at the first hurdle following our narrow defeat here against Egham Town. A close, well-fought game saw our visitors come away with the win and progress in the competition that hasn't been kind to us for many years. Defensive mistakes led to the only goal of the game and we certainly had our chances on the day, but we live and wait for another year, I guess.

On to our Southern League opener on Saturday away at AFC Dunstable and yet another couple of errors at the back in the first-half, when we had enjoyed the better of the game prior to this, saw us come in at the interval two goals down. We returned to the action looking a lot better in the second-half and had to wait right until the 95th minute for a deserved equaliser. We showed good character on the day and if that continues, it will stand us in good stead going forward.

Away from the pitch, you will see that our new perimeter fence has now been completed and it certainly enhances the ground and hopefully does the trick in eradicating the mindless vandalism we have had to endure for years. Sadly, at the same time, we have had yet more burglaries in the clubhouse from the same repeat offender – something that has been going on for over a month now and we have had to continually reinforce the building as well as having more CCTV cameras added in different areas. This has been extremely frustrating to deal with and we can only hope this ends soon.

We continue to look to improve things around the stadium with other projects planned for the coming year including renewals of the team shelters/dugouts which, due to the increasing number of substitutes and coaches over the years, makes ours on the small side for sure. An increase to eleven or twelve seating spaces

would be the aim but they don't come cheap and we would also have to increase the concrete bases for them to be sited on too

Enjoy the game tonight and let's hope for a first win of the season. Please make a note in your diary to get along to the Skyline over the Bank Holiday weekend when we face two home matches in the space of three days in the FA Trophy against Hanworth Villa and then a League game against neighbours Rayners Lane. It would be great to have a couple of big crowds for those matches.

WELCOME TO THE BRICKS

A warm welcome to the Skyline Roofing Stadium for tonight's first home game in our Pitching In Southern League campaign and we extend that welcome to everyone connected with Hadley Football Club who enjoyed an excellent campaign in 2024-25, finishing in fifth place and qualifying for the end of season play-offs.

The fact that the Bricks visit us today means that they did lose in that knockout competition but they can be proud of their performances throughout the year which included winning the Hertfordshire Charity, beating Welwyn Garden City in the final. Those performances also included a League "double" over the Woods, winning 2-0 here at the Skyline in late August, with Luke Alfano scoring both goals, the first from the penalty-spot and then 4-0 back at Brickfield Lane. These games are covered in more details elsewhere in tonight's matchday programme.

We will certainly need to play better tonight to get something from the game and Hadley warmed-up for their season with a series of impressive wins in their pre-season friendlies which included a solid 3-0 defeat of Step 3 side Wingate & Finchley who have induced Hadley's top scorer Isaac Stones to join them this season. On Saturday, they began their season proper with a tough home game against relegated Hitchin Town who are back at Step 4 for the first time in fifteen years and amongst the favourites for a title challenge. The game produced Hadley's best-ever League attendance of 278 with plenty of Canaries in attendance and it was the visitors who grabbed all three points with two second-half goals. The Bricks will be looking to bounce back from that tonight for sure.

There are two players in the Hadley side who have previously played some football here at Northwood. Cameron Ferguson joined us in the summer of 2018 having been Player of the Year with the Bricks but he was injured after playing the first six matches of that season and then returned to Hadley where he has remained ever since. And their skipper Luke Alfano joined us at the same time from Wingate & Finchley, playing four times and scoring with a 30-yard strike

at Bracknell Town but his availability restricted his appearances and he also eventually returned to a former club in Hadley.

No Match Sponsor for tonight's game but we are delighted to say that Dennis Goulding has kindly sponsored the Match Ball. We thank him for his generous gesture and invite others to help the club in this way at other home games that follow. Please see the grid elsewhere in today's programme to see what's available and when.

LEAGUE NEWS

Our own Southern League season got underway in Saturday with an away fixture at AFC Dunstable. The OD's had finished fourteenth in the table last season. just two places ahead of ourselves so hopes were high that we could give a good account and start positively. This we did as we had the better of the game for much of the afternoon, played incidentally on an excellent pitch surface now seriously looked after by the Bedfordshire FA who own the ground. Despite this, a five-minute switch-off in the defence towards. the end of the first-half meant we were somehow 2-0 down at the break with lots to do. We continued to edge proceedings after the break and eventually pulled one back with Devonte Totesaut scoring with a neat finish but time was running out until Mack Miskin scored direct from a 30-yard free-kick in the fifth and final minute of stoppage-time. It was a point we certainly deserved and the first time we've started a league season with a draw since 2021 when we were held 1-1 at Thatcham Town in an Isthmian game.

CUP NEWS

As ever, our FA Cup fixture which started the season wasn't the easiest of contests as we faced newly-promoted Egham Town ten days ago and exited the competition at the extra preliminary round for a second successive season with a narrow 0-1 defeat. Chances were few and far between at either end but the visitors deserved their win and now play away at Step 5 side Corinthian at the next stage on Saturday. My own dreams of a Third Round proper tie against West Ham coming true will have to wait for another year.....

We now turn our attention towards the upcoming Isuzu FA Challenge Trophy match where we also enter the competition at the very first stage and we couldn't have been given a much harder game than we have. Though it is again a home draw, we are one of just 32 Step four clubs pulled out of the hat to play in the Preliminary round of the competition and we will face former Isthmian and Middlesex rivals Hanworth Villa on Saturday 23rd August here at the Skyline. It's another difficult fixture against a side we struggled against in previous seasons and they have lost out in the play-offs twice in the last three seasons including the final in May at Uxbridge so got very close to becoming a Step 3 side. The ambitious club are currently installing a new 3G pitch at their headquarters so are clearly looking to continue their progression and they started their Isthmian League season on Saturday with an excellent 4-0 away victory at Metropolitan Police, with all the goals coming in the second-half. It's our next scheduled fixture so please get along to the game and show your support. Please note, for this game only, Under-16s will have to be charged £1 for admission due to the rules of the competition. The winners of this tie would be at home to Beckenham Town who play in the Isthmian South-East Division and finished just outside the play-offs last season. They lost their opening match at Merstham on Saturday.

As usual, the County Cup draws haven't been made as yet and once again the Southern League have

no plans to run a League Cup competition, mainly because of the adverse geographical structure of the league which takes you from Mousehole in Cornwall all the way to Stamford in Lincolnshire.

PLAYER NEWS

We've been a little unlucky with injuries in pre-season. Firstly, star signing Harry McCorkell was ruled out of the warm-up matches awaiting a hernia operation which he has now had and is on the route to recovery. It was good to see him involved in the pre-match warm-up on Saturday. Harry McKenna, just back from his shoulder issues last season, then injured an ankle against Wealdstone and has been missing for a month now. Hopefully he will be able to return soon. Romario Jonas, who had returned to the club looking a lot fitter and raring to go then suffered a knee injury at Bedfont Sports and is still a few weeks away while the promising Kush Lewis-Thomas limped off from our opening FA Cup game with a hamstring strain so is also likely to miss a few weeks. The signing of Hicham Bouchareb has also been held up while we await International Clearance but we hope he may be available tonight. Add to that the fact that youngsters Brian McGovern and Freddie Ford have been on holiday, the management team have done well to keep a well-balanced squad for our opening matches.

After tonight, our next Southern League fixture is on Bank Holiday Monday, 25th August when we play at home to fellow Middlesex club Rayners Lane who are

now our near-neighbours after they followed our route in being moved over from the Isthmian League at the end of last season. It's definitely a game to get down to the Skyline to see; should be a cracker, so bring your family and friends along.

UNDER-18S

Having won their Allied Counties League Division for a second successive season, the Under-18s management team made the choice to return to the Isthmian Youth League for the new 2025-26 season. They have been placed in the West Division, apart from most of our fellow Middlesex clubs and alongside Aldershot Town, Ascot United, Badshot Lea, Bracknell Town, Camberley Town, Farnham Town, Fleet Town, Hampton & RB and Maidenhead United. The League season starts on Wednesday 20th August when they play hosts to Fleet Town.

In the FA Youth Cup, as fate would have it, we have been drawn at home to Tring Athletic, the side that we pipped to the Allied Counties League title back in April! We also met Tring in the Youth Cup two years ago with our opponents winning that game 5-2 so a really tough game once more. That game takes place on Wednesday 3rd September and the winners of this tie would be at home to either Hanwell Town or Hayes & Yeading in the next round.

There is a new management set-up for the team too. Joining Jamie Barry again will be Matt Kaye but now as Assistant Manager while Karl Scott is the new Head Coach. Former player Billy Allen will also have a coaching role while Craig Wright is their Physio.

We have reintroduced the Player Sponsor page for the Under-18s, you can find that elsewhere in tonight's programme and its just £30.00 for the season so if you

NEW GROUNDSHARE

After Hayes & Hillingdon's move to play at Uxbridge, it looked for quite some time that we wouldn't have a club groundsharing here at the Skyline this season but quite late on we reached an agreement with Rising Ballers Kensington FC and they will now play



their home games here for the 2025/26 season. Rising Ballers were reprieved from a relegation spot in the Combined Counties League Division One (Step 6) at the end of last season so will continue in that league which has 23 teams in it so 44 games to be played

They drew 2-2 in their opening game at Spelthorne Sports and then 1-1 in their first match staged here at the Skyline back on Monday 28th July! After that unbeaten though winless start, they have played two tough away games and been well beaten in both – 5-0 at unbeaten Woodley United and then 6-0 at second-placed Holmer Green last Saturday so they clearly have to raise their game to become competitive. They are away to Oxhey Jets tonight before returning to the Skyline on Saturday when they take on Westside at 3pm. As the Woods don't have a game, why not pop down to the club for a drink and take in the match at the same time. In the

FA Vase, RB are away to Aylesbury Vale Dynamos on 23rd August, the same date as we play in the FA Trophy.

GROUNDWORKS

Our new fencing should be pretty much in place by the time you read this with a new gate added at the cemetery end of the ground in the last few days completing some hard work done over the last month or so. It's been a long time coming but we're glad that it is finally in place. We still have some new ball-stop netting to be installed at either end of the pitch in the next few weeks too so look out for that!

In addition to this, the new installation of LED Floodlighting which begun with new bases being installed in mid-June was supposed to be have been followed with the new towers, cabling and lights within a few weeks but there has been supply delays for reasons not really explained to us. Hopefully, we can have this work completed soon.

Northwood opened their season with this difficult FA Cup clash at the Skyline Roofing Stadium against newly-promoted Egham Town and it was the visitors who made it into the next round with a narrowest of victories by the only goal of the game.

The management duo of Jack Smith and Jon-Jo Bates had most of their squad to pick from, though still without the injured duo of Harry's McKenna and McCorkell while Hicham Bouchareb was left awaiting FA clearance.

Five players made their starting Woods debuts with another two from the bench later.

For the Sarnies, there was a noted absence of skipper Reece Yorke, also out injured on a pleasant afternoon with a good crowd in attendance.





There was an early raid forward from Kush Lewis-Thomas who nocked a ball out wide but Egham goalkeeper Tyler Tobin was able to block his attempted cross for a corner.

A few minutes later, Ademide Baruwa tried his luck with a shot from distance but it was straight at the keeper who grabbed it at the second attempt.

At the other end, a free-kick from the right saw Ben Peden react quickest to get a foot on the cross to volley it goalwards and that clipped the crossbar as Egham showed their danger from set-pieces.

Dylan Kearney had one effort which flew well wide but after sixteen minutes he was close to netting an opening goal thanks to a good run from Reece Price-Placid and a great cross which flashed across the six-yard box but the Woods striker couldn't quite get the touch needed.

Unfortunately, Lewis-Thomas, who had already had some treatment earlier, succumbed to a hamstring issue on twenty seven minutes, being replaced by Osaretin Otote.

Four minutes later, the substitute made a good run down the right and found Devonte Totesaut outside the box and his low strike had Tobin beaten but also hit the bottom of the post and off to safety.





Egham were still equally dangerous going forward with Reece Mitchell causing the most problems for the Northwood defence and giving youngster Nasir Sharifi a torrid time on debut.

He knocked in a series of crosses which defended well or scrambled away desperately. However, on thirty eight minutes Mitchell chipped a ball to the far post where a free header had to be cleared off the line.

HALF-TIME: NORTHWOOD 0-0 EGHAM TOWN

It was still all to play for when the second-half got underway and Egham picked up the first yellow card of the game on fifty minutes when Ibrahim Nagheeb fouled. Jack Empson somehow managed to talk himself into a second yellow in the same incident.

57 MINUTES: 0-1 CONNOR CULLEN

Sharifi was still trying hard to keep shackles on Mitchell but picked up his yellow card on fifty seven minutes and after that resulting free-kick was cleared, the Sarnies were able to recycle the ball and, taking advantage of a defensive error, the ball was lifted over a stranded Hafed Al-Droubi and knocked into the empty net by Connor Cullen.

The Woods had created very little in the second-half at that stage and it could have been game over just five minutes later when Manny Folarin clumsily clattered into Mitchell when chasing him down on the edge of the box and a penalty was awarded.



Mitchell was given the opportunity to double the lead from the spot but he failed to get any power on his shot at all and Al-Droubi gratefully dived to his right to save easily.

Substitutions followed with Rico-Clarke Rowe introduced for his debut in midfield, with Baruwa moving to right-back, while seventeen-year-old Freddie Ford replaced Price-Placid who had drifted out of the game.

Ford lifted the tempo a little but there was still no impact on goal until the eightieth minute when Otote cut in from the left and let fly with a shot which saw Tobin dive to his right and push the ball wide of the post.

Sadly, that was the extent of the Woods resurgence and Egham were able to see out the remainder of the game comfortably to record a deserved success where

The Woods picked up a valuable away point from their opening Southern League fixture with this entertaining fixture played in glorious sunshine on a superb pitch surface but they left it very, very late to secure the 2-2 draw.

There was only one change made to the starting line-up from the side that had lost the opening FA Cup clash against Egham Town with hamstring victim Kush Lewis-Thomas replaced by Osaretin Otote on the left of midfield. The home side fielded a typically young, athletic line-up who had won at Harwich & Parkeston in the FA Cup a week earlier.

It was the Woods who started brightly, looking wellorganised and Otote was first to cause some issues with an excellent cross from the left which had to scrambled off for a corner. That was well delivered by Mack Miskin





but the ball flashed across the six-vard box and Manny Folarin couldn't get a touch on it at the far post.

Otote continued to threaten and when he was tripped on 23 minutes. Northwood were awarded a free-kick fairly centrally outside the box. Miskin got it on target but goalkeeper Matthew Bossa blocked it and just managed to pounce the loose ball before Otote could pounce.

Three minutes later there was a great chance for the Woods to grab the lead as Dylan Kearney found just a glimpse of some space in the area only to see his shot just blocked by a timely defensive boot, the ball flying off for a corner.

33 MINUTES: 1-0 THOMAS BLENNERHASSETT

The home side had hardly had a look-in at the half-hour mark but within four minutes, they stormed into a twogoal lead as the Woods defence simply switched off. The OD's overloaded the left flank, Tali Jallow slipped a neat pass through to Thomas Blennerhassett and he had a simple task to slide the ball into the net.

36 MINUTES: 2-0 TALI JALLOW

It got worse for Northwood just three minutes later in a very similar move, this time Blennerhassett supplying the chip forward from a free-kick and Jallow taking a touch before firing home.



Nasir Sharifi had picked up an early yellow card and he was joined by Folarin when he was adjudged to have fouled Sean Duodu just outside the box. At the other end, Devonte Totesaut worked some space to get a shot at goal but it was well over.

It left the Woods with plenty of work to do after the break but again they started on the frontfoot and Totesaut showed a clever touch in the box to get a shot at goal just two minutes in but Bossa was equal to it. Just a minute later, Northwood should have pulled one

back. Totesaut again saw his good strike well saved by the keeper, Kearney couldn't force the loose ball in but it then bounced to Otote who hit it a goalbound shot from the edge of the box that was cleared off the line.

Ademide Baruwa was getting forward into dangerous areas and his run to the by-line saw the ball cut back to Miskin who had also pushed up but his effort was deflected over the bar.

64 MINUTES: 2-1 DEVONTE TOTESAUT

But the Woods opening goal finally came on 64 minutes as Otote played an excellent ball through for Totesaut to latch onto, beating off a defender, touching it past the 'keeper and slotting home.

Having got back into the game, both sides made plenty of substitutions which perhaps upset the flow of the game a little as there were few chances created around the respective boxes and the home side rarely threatened the final third.







However, they did go close to wrapping up three points after 81 minutes when a series of raids into the penalty-area saw some solid block defending by the Woods until it ran loose to George Joyce and his shot had to be acrobatically tipped over the top by Hafed Al-Droubi.

90+5 MINUTES: 2-2 MACK MISKIN

From then it was the Woods who started to press again but time was certainly running out, entering the final minute of the five added on for stoppage-time. Otote made another foraging run towards goal and was bundled over. The free-kick was some thirty yards out and Miskin took aim with his trusty left foot, able to fire it over the wall and into the far corner with the keeper unable to get across.

There was hardly any time for the action to restart with the final whistle signalling the 2-2 draw and a point apiece to start the new season. Northwood now return to the Skyline Roofing Stadium for the visit of Hadley for

a Tuesday night under the lights. Their opponents were beaten 2-0 at home by Hitchin Town in their first fixture so will be looking to bounce back.

A third goal came when Horsford was fouled and Pete Millward scored from the penalty spot and a fourth followed after Steve Pearce, who was having a great game, sent Pat Roche away

to beat two men and shoot home.

Northwood might have added two more before Harrow pulled a goal back in the dying minutes.

Their goals came from Gifton Knowle-Williams, Nick Wright, who had joined the


club from Carlisle in the close season, and Icelandic international Johann Gudmundsson.

Local boy Oliver Squires, a former Northwood Youth team player, also played against his old colours after signing professional forms with Watford the previous year.









Hadley Football Club were founded in the 1882/83 season.

A notable achievement during the early years was a 1-0 defeat of Tottenham Hotspur, although Tottenham then was not of the calibre that it is now. The 1880's and 1890's were glamour times for Hadley when the club used to attract crowds of several hundred to Hadley common. With regret however, the progressive Barnet FC etc. drew players away from Hadley. This was at about the turn of the century. Club activities became low key around 1912 with Barnet FC becoming more prominent. Between these years and 1922 the club was up and down like a yo yo.

Club fortunes again changed close to World War II and thereafter, with the emergence from the Hadley ranks of the famous Lester Finch who went on to play for Barnet FC and become a full amateur international. Records show an upturn in Hadley FC activities after World War II. The club became a member of the Barnet and District League and, from about 1947, played at Wrotham Park at the Barnet end of Kitts End Road, Hadley played

there until about 1955 when it then moved to Barnet Playing Fields in order to "have some better facilities". The club played in the North Suburban Intermediate League at this time.

Still playing at Barnet Playing Fields, the club then joined the Mid Herts League and with Peter Grav as 1st team manager, we were Premier Division Winners in 1975/76 and 1976/77. We also won the Mid Herts Premier Division Shield in 1976/77. Having won the Mid Herts Premier Division twice, the club wanted to progress to the Herts Senior County League so therefore moved to a pitch with better facilities in St. Albans Road, Barnet (current home of The Shire London Golf Club). We had one season at this pitch before being told that it was no longer available to hire. We won the Herts Senior County League Division Three at our first attempt during this season. However, we had to find a new home and played at a sports ground in Chandos Avenue, Whetstone (a training base for the England National team at the time), until 1985. The club left the Herts Senior County League to join the

Southern Olympian League and moved grounds again to play at the Woodside Park Club, Southover, Totteridae.

In 1992 the club moved to a ground in Brickfield Lane, Arkley, Barnet and re-joined the Herts Senior County League in the 1999/00 season. Under the management of Ian Grav. the 1st team won the Division One championship in 2001/02 to move up to the Premier Division in 2002/03, where we finished mid-table. Mick Hore was appointed manager in 2003/04 and we enjoyed a very successful season with the 1st team winning the Herts Senior County League Premier Division and the Herts Senior Centenary Trophy, 2004/05 was also very successful with the 1st team retaining the Premier Division title. Success continued into 2005/06 with the 1st team winning the prestigious Aubrey Cup.

In 2006-07 the 1st team finished Runners Up in the Herts Senior County League Premier Division. An application to join the Spartan South Midlands league was blocked by the Herts County League, so the following season (2007-08) the club



played all of its football in the West Herts Saturday League. During this season, all Hadley teams (3 teams) won their respective leagues for the first time in the clubs history. This included the 1st team winning the Premier Division of the West Herts League with Guy Slee in charge, having taken over from Mick Hore at the start of the season. We again applied to join the Spartan South Midlands League and our place in Division Two was accepted for the start of the 2008-09 season.

The move to the Spartan South Midlands League saw the 1st team begin groundsharing at Potters Bar Town FC, and the reserves and 3rd team continued to use the ground in Brickfield Lane. Ian Gray replaced Guy Slee as manager at the start of the season, with Guy having stepped up into the role of Chairman, joined on the committee with the arrival of Bob Henderson as Secretary. Our first season in the Spartan South Midlands League turned out to be a very successful one with the 1st team gaining promotion to Division One at the first attempt after finishing one point behind The 61 FC (Luton). We also won the Division Two Cup after beating Totternhoe in the final.

Our second season in the Spartan South Midlands League (2009-10) surpassed everyone's expectations when we achieved another promotion after finishing in second place behind Holmer Green. We also won two matches in our first attempt at the FA Vase, beating Harpenden Town and then Leverstock Green, eventually being

knocked out in a tight 1-0 defeat at Stanway Royers. The 2010-11 season saw us again playing at the highest level in the club's long history (Step 5 of the National League System), and we also enjoyed our first ever outing in the FA Cup, drawing 0-0 with Barking before losing 1-0 in the replay. Another highlight of the season was playing against Barnet in the 2nd round of the Herts Senior Cup, drawing 1-1 after 90 minutes before losing 4-1 in Extra Time. In January 2012, long-serving manager Ian Grav stepped down from the role of 1st team manager after 3½ successful vears in charge, having guided the team from Division Two to the Premier Division of the Spartan South Midlands League with back-to-back promotions. A new management team was appointed who were previously with St Albans City reserves. An influx of new players and the guidance of player-manager Alexis Nicholas saw us achieve our pre-season aim

of staying in the Premier Division,

out of 22 teams. The start of the

2012-13 season saw Franco Sidoli

join as 1st team manager having

also left St Albans City during the

summer. Franco was supported by

a coaching team of Alexis Nicholas.

Lewis Dommett and Hector Varela

having taken the lead twice in the match.

At the end of the 2012-13 season. Franco Sidoli stepped down as 1st team manager due to a change in work circumstances for 3 out of 4 people in the management team, including himself, which would not have allowed them to give 100% commitment to the job during the forthcoming season. The club appointed Geoff O'Vell as the new 1st team manager, who had previously been 1st team manager at Colney Heath, Hoddesdon Town and Broxbourne Borough. Geoff was joined by Assistant Manager Paul Surridge and coach Mark Mezen. A highlight during this season was drawing Watford FC in the 1st Round of the Herts Senior Cup. We lost 2-0 with goals from Luke O'Nien and Bernard Mensah securing the win for Gianfranco Zola's Championship side. We had mixed fortunes during the 2013-14 league campaign and although an improved end to the season saw us make a late climb up the league table to finish just below mid table, the club decided that a restructuring of the team management was required at the end of the season. This saw Geoff O'Vell and his management team leave the club.

At the start of the next season (2014-15) Micky Hazard was appointed as the new 1st team manager. As a player, Micky was a member of the Tottenham team that won the 1982 FA Cup and UEFA Cup in 1984. He also went on to play for Chelsea, Portsmouth Swindon Town and then Tottenham for a second spell. Since the end of his playing career, Hazard was Youth Academy Coach at Crystal Palace and was also involved on the management team of Sevenoaks Town and Hoddesdon Town. Micky was joined by the return of Franco Sidoli, Lewis Dommett and Hector Varela who were all well-known to the club as, along with Alexis Nicolas, they formed our 1st team management team during a successful 2012-13 season. The first season in charge for our new management team was very successful as we ended in 9th position in the Spartan South Midlands League Premier Division - our highest ever finish.





We surpassed this in the following season (2015-16) as we ended in 6th position in the league and we also won the Herts Charity Shield for the first time following a 3-1 victory over Tring Athletic in the final at the County Headquarters, Letchworth.

The 2016-17 season saw the return of our 1st team to Brickfield Lane in Barnet following over £500,000 worth of facilities improvements and eight years of groundsharing with Potters Bar Town. Ground improvements included the installation of floodlights, a spectator stand, new fencing and pathways, pitch drainage installation, a new car park and the refurbishment of the pavilion clubhouse and changing rooms. This was made possible thanks to grants and donations from the Football Stadia Improvement Fund, Sport England, the Peter Harrison Foundation, the Happy Charitable Trust, Village Healthcare and the Back2Barnet campaign. A highlight of our first season back in Barnet was an outstanding FA Cup run, eventually being knocked out in a Third qualifying round replay against Eastbourne Borough who went on to beat Aldershot Town in the next round.

The 2017-18 season saw a change of first team management with Anthony Clark being appointed in October 2017. As a player, Anthony appeared for Southend United before playing at a high standard of non-league football with teams including Hendon and Wealdstone. A very strong end to the season saw us finish in sixth place, our joint highest ever finish. The 2018-19 league campaign was our most successful in the Spartan South Midlands League Premier Division, finishing in 3rd place, missing out on the Runners Up spot by goal difference.

In the summer of 2019, following correspondence with the Football Association, a lateral movement saw Hadlev FC moved to the Essex Senior League for the 2019-20 season after 10 seasons in the Spartan South Midlands League. This move was part of the Football Association's ongoing restructuring of the National League System and their move towards a "pure pyramid". A highlight of the 2019-20 season was reaching the Third qualifying round of the FA Cup. equalling our best ever run from the 2016-17 season. We eventually lost at Havant & Waterlooville, but getting that far in such a prestigious competition was an excellent achievement by Anthony Clark's team. Unfortunately, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the season then ended early and was declared null and void. Similarly. the 2020-21 Essex Senior League season was also curtailed due to the COVID-19 pandemic but we had a fantastic run in the FA Vase,

reaching the Fifth Round for the first time in the club's history. We were unfortunate to lose on penalties to Binfield who went on to reach the final at Wembley.

In the summer of 2021, the Football Association again carried out some restructuring of the National League System and we were moved from the Essex Senior League back into the Spartan South Midlands League. It was a shame that we could not complete a full season in the Essex Senior League, and we enjoyed our time in that league.


The 2021-22 season turned out to be the most successful in the club's history. An excellent FA Cup run saw us narrowly lose 2-1 at home against Enfield Town in a replay having drawn 1-1 away against the Isthmian League Premier Division side. We then went on to reach the final of the prestigious Herts Senior Cup having beaten higher opposition Royston Town and Ware in the semi final and quarter final. We faced Cheshunt in the final (who went on to gain promotion from the Isthmian League Premier Division into the Vanarama National League South at the end of the season) and two late goals gave our opponents the win. We finished our league campaign in third position and due to Risborough Rangers (who finished second) not meeting the relevant FA ground grading criteria, we were promoted to Step 4 of the National League System for the first time, an outstanding achievement from Anthony Clark, his management team and players. The 2021-22 season was topped off by us winning the Gladwish Challenge Trophy following a 3-1 win against Stotfold in the final.

Our first season in the Southern Football League Division One Central saw us finish in 9th position - another excellent achievement. We went one step better in our second season at Step 4 with an 8th placed finish, again in the Southern League Division One Central. We also recorded our first ever win in the FA Trophy with a 4-1 victory against Ware FC at Brickfield Lane.

The 2024-25 campaign, saw us finish a record high 5th position in Southern Football League Division One Central and reach the play-offs, losing to eventual play-off winners Berkhamsted in the semi-final. A historic run to the 3rd Round proper of the FA Trophy was made. with fantastic victories over Step 3 opponents Carshalton, Hastings United and AFC Telford during the competition and eventually being narrowly being defeated by Step 2 Oxford City. An historic season was completed, by winning the Herts Charity Cup 4-2 against Welwyn Garden City. We look forward to season 2025-26 with great optimism.
