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WELCOME AND MATCH PREVIEW

Thank you for attending tonight's CCL Premier Division North fixture. We warmly welcome you all to Berkeley Fields and thank you for your support.

We welcome this evening's visitors Northwood FC, the Woods' manager Manny Williams, his management team and players, along with the club's committee members and supporters. We also welcome our match officials – referee Oliver Keil and his assistants Michael Heavey and Luke Partington – and match sponsor Andrew Swanzy. We wish you all a safe journey home after the game.

Ever since winning the Spartan League Premier Division title to earn promotion to the Isthmian League in 1992, Northwood became a firmly established Step Four club moving between the Isthmian and Southern Leagues, which included a spell in the Step 3 Isthmian Premier League between 2003 and 2007. *(See club history on pages 5 & 6).*

In 2010 the Woods were moved to the newly formed Southern League Division One Central where, that same year, we had also been placed after winning the CCL Premier Division title.

We managed to survive at the higher level for 6 seasons until being returned to the CCL in 2016, and during that period played the Woods 14 times, one of those being in an FA Cup First Qualifying Round tie, and the other an MFA Senior Challenge Cup tie, both of which we won.

We didn't do as well in the league games, however, with just one win against the Woods eight, although we managed a share of the spoils in three.

Our only other game against the Woods since then came during season 2024/25 when, on a cold December evening, goals from Harvey Killeen, Archie Morris and Remel Larwood set up a comfortable 3-1 win for us in the MFA Senior Challenge Cup.

Northwood will no doubt be coming here full of confidence following their impressive win on Saturday in the Vase. Touching on Vase performances, another year has seen us exit at the First Round. It's disappointing, and I understand the fans who travelled will be disappointed too.

THIS EVENING'S VISITORS

NORTHWOOD F.C.

A club in the Northwood area was established in 1899, though the current club were not formed until 1926 following others that had carried the town's name in earlier years. The club joined the Harrow & Wembley League in 1928 and were Champions for six seasons in a row just prior to World War Two. In 1969 they joined the Middlesex Senior League and, after winning the title in 1978, were able to step up to the Hellenic League Division One, which they won in their debut season. This led to promotion to the Premier Division where they spent five seasons. In 1984 they moved across to the Spartan League, winning the Premier Division title in 1992 and earning promotion to the Step 4 Isthmian League.

The Woods enjoyed their best spell during this period with strikers Lawrence Yaku, Steve Hale and Scott Fitzgerald offering plenty of firepower. Yaku's tally of 54 goals in 1999/2000 remains the best by any Woods player in a single season. Club legends Chris Gell – who made a record 489 appearances – and Dave Nolan, who also played more than 400 games, were also mainstays throughout this period. The club gradually climbed through the divisions of the Isthmian League under Tony Choules, reaching the Step 3 Premier Division in 2003.

In 2005 Northwood were switched to the Southern League, where they remained until their relegation to the Isthmian Division One North in 2007, the only bright point during that disappointing season being a 4-2 penalty win against Hayes to lift the Middlesex Senior Challenge Cup. From that point the club saw several managers come and go. Dave Anderson was the most successful as he twice helped the club to top half of the table finishes as well as reach the FA Trophy First Round Proper for the first time, before departing in March 2010.

The club were then moved to the Southern League Division One Central in 2010 where they remained until 2018. Anderson was replaced by his assistant Mark Barnham who resigned in November of the same year after a poor league run. This led to the appointment of Woods favourite Steve Hale who, after a poor run of results, was himself dismissed in March 2011.

Chairman Ian Barry then acted quickly, replacing Hale with 27-year-old Gary Meakin who arrived from Hillingdon Borough and helped guide the team to safety with 3 games remaining. With the aim of improving the club's fortunes in the 2011/12 season, Meakin assembled a strong squad. Progress was made in the Southern League and Middlesex cups with top scorer and Supporters Player-of-the-Year, Oliver Hawkins, proving the major catalyst in their assault up the table.

However, in November 2012, after a solid start to the season, Meakin resigned to take the reins at Isthmian Premier Division side Wingate & Finchley. This led to the appointment of Mark Burgess as Player-Manager with the Woods finishing the 2012/13 campaign in 13th place. In Burgess's first full season in charge, 2013-14, the Woods were in 7th place at Christmas and clearly contenders for the play-offs though eventually having to settle for 9th place.

In 2014/15 the club again finished in the top half of the table and then made a great start to their league campaign the following season, winning their opening 4 games before that run was ended by Aylesbury Utd. They responded by beating the same opponents 2-1 in the FA Cup Preliminary Round and, in 2016, progressed to the final of the MFA Senior Cup, securing their 2nd MFA Senior Cup title with a 2-0 victory over Enfield Town to win their first silverware since lifting that trophy 9 years earlier. It was Mark Burgess's first success as a manager. *(continued on next page)*



At the start of the 2016/17 campaign Burgess suffered the blow of losing eight key members of his squad to Harrow Borough. Not surprisingly that season proved difficult with the club sucked into a relegation battle and taking the decision to part company with Burgess after four-and-a-half years in the role. Ian Barry's extensive search for a replacement led to the appointment of Simon Lane, coming with a wealth of managerial experience at a higher level. However, Lane didn't stay in the role for long, leaving in January 2018 to move to Egham Town.

After finishing that season in 17th, Northwood returned to the Isthmian League after being placed in the newly created South-Central Division. Ian Barry then confirmed the appointment of Dean Barker, who had presided over a hugely successful Wingate & Finchley U23s side. This though was another short stint with Barker's assistant Scott Dash taking charge between 2018 & 2019, before himself being replaced by Jamie Leacock, followed by ex-Woods midfielder Rob Ursell during the 2 Covid seasons.

Former Ashford Town manager Ben Murray was appointed in May 2021 - yet another short stint - with the club announcing the appointment of former Hendon and Hampton & Richmond coach Ben Bukowski in November. At the same time the vastly experienced Steve Ringrose, former boss of Hillingdon Borough and North Greenford United, was appointed Director of Football. This new management team successfully led the club away from relegation danger in 2021/22 and saw the team reach the semi-finals of both Middlesex Senior Cups.

In the 2022/23 season, after winning their opening six league games, the Woods form dipped. Though they rallied towards the end to earn a play-off place, they were then narrowly beaten 2-1 in the semi-final at Walton & Hersham. In 2023 the club again reached the final of the MFA Charity Cup but unfortunately slipped to a 1-0 defeat to Broadfields United. The club struggled for consistency in the 2023/24 season, finishing 15th, at which point Bukowski left to take the manager's position at neighbours Harrow Borough.

Ahead of the 2024/25 season Northwood were moved back into the Southern League with the club announcing the appointment of former QPR and Wycombe Wanderers midfielder Scott Donnelly. But he only lasted until September with, in late October, the club announcing the re-appointment of Gary Meakin – returning for his second spell in charge. He had most recently led Rayners Lane to promotion to Step 4 as well as winning the Middlesex Senior Cup.

However, Meakin would soon again announce his resignation after a 2-0 home defeat in March to Flackwell Heath which saw the club slip into the relegation places. It was their sixth straight defeat. Two of Northwood's senior players, Jon-Jo Bates and Jack Smith took interim charge and in their 9 matches the club collected 17 points – largely thanks to 4 successive league victories in April – which secured Northwood's Step 4 status for another season.

The strong end to the season saw Bates and Smith confirmed as joint managers in May 2025. However, on 25th January 2026, following a 2-0 defeat at Marlow, a result that saw the Woods drop into the relegation zone, the club decided to dismiss them and appoint Tommy Cooney, previously with Arlesey Town. Sadly, on Easter Monday 2026, Northwood's long stay at Step 4 came to an end after they were relegated following a 4-4 draw at Beaconsfield Town. It was their first relegation since 2007, returning the club to Step 5 for the first time since the 1990s.

Cooney tendered his resignation in May 2026 citing the club's impending placement in the Combined Counties rather than the Spartan South Midlands League, as the reason for his departure. In the same month, the club confirmed the appointment of Manny Williams as the club's new manager. The 44-year-old had enjoyed a long career in non-league football, having most recently served as player-coach of Risborough Rangers.



CHERRY RED RECORDS COMBINED COUNTIES PREMIER DIVISION NORTH

The Premier Division North title was won by **Ashford Town (Middx)** but this went down to the last game as they only beat **Windsor & Eton** into second place by a point. However, the **Royalists** went on to clinch the second promotion place after winning the play-off semi-final against **Burnham** 1-0 followed by a 2-0 victory over **Broadfields United** in the final, the **Fighting Cocks** having won their semi-final tie against **Ardley United** on penalties. Both **Ashford Town** and **Windsor & Eton** will play in the Isthmian League South Central Division this season.

Six clubs join the Premier Division North this season. **Thatcham Town** has made a lateral move from the CCL Premier Division South, while **Bedfont** and **Penn & Tylers Green** have earned promotion from Division One. **Easington Sports** has been moved laterally from the United Counties Premier Division South. **Northwood** and **Rayners Lane** have been relegated from the Southern League Central Division while **Amersham** has earned a reprieve to hold onto the club's Step 5 status. **Edgware** and **Kingsbury**, on the other hand, have been relegated and will join the CCL Division One.
