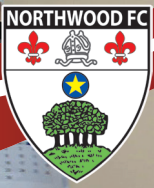

Isthmian League Cup

The Woods have always been fairly successful in League Cup competitions over the years. Since becoming a senior side in the early 1970s, there have been three Middlesex League Cup successes, two London Spartan League Cup victories and on one memorable occasion, we won the trophy that we are competing for tonight, the Isthmian League Cup.

It was way back in 2001/02 that we achieved that feat, starting with away wins at Harlow Town, Harrow Borough and Leyton Pennant before beating Canvey Island at home in the quarter-finals. It earned us a two-legged semi-final against Tooting & Mitcham United – a 4-2 win at home was followed by a 1-1 draw away to get through to the Final. This was all achieved as a side playing in Division One of the Isthmian League and in the Final, played at St Albans City FC, we met Premier Division outfit Hampton & Richmond Borough. Again, the Woods defied their underdogs tag to win the Final 3-2 with two goals from Andy Cook and one from star striker Lawrence Yaku.

We went close to reaching the final of the Southern League Cup in recent years too, losing a home semi-final against Merthyr Town on penalties following a goalless draw, just a few seasons ago, in 2015/16.

So, it's a competition we always seek to do well in and tonight we start our campaign in what is known as the Velocity Trophy – Velocity were the Company who laid the pitch that we played on at Bracknell Town on Saturday – though also named the Alan Turvey Trophy, after the long-serving Chairman of the League who is now President. There has been a bit of grumbling about the fact that the only regionalisation in the draw was on a North/South basis and tonight we have the pleasure of welcoming Suffolk side Bury Town to Northwood Park after a bit of journey for an early stage cup competition.

The winners of the tie already know that they

- will be away to either
- Felixstowe & Walton United or AFC Sudbury in
- the next round so a bit nearer for our opponents
- than it would be for us! We last met Bury Town
- back in 2007/08 in Division One North with our
- home game ending in a 4-3 victory, though we
- did lose 3-0 in the away fixture. Tonight's game
- has to be played to a result but no extra-time
- is required so straight to kicks from the penalty
- mark should the scores be level after 90 minutes.

Other Cup Competitions

- The Buildbase FA Trophy doesn't start for the
- Woods until October but when we do get
- underway in that competition we will be away
- to Dunstable Town who were relegated back
- from the Southern Premier last season and will
- play the new season in Division One East of the
- Southern League. The date for the game has
- now been fixed as Saturday 13th October 2018
- after Town won the toss with their neighbours
- last week so AFC Dunstable will have to play
- their own FA Trophy match either on the Friday
- night or the Sunday.

- Both Middlesex Cup competitions have been
- drawn and we will be away in the opening
- round of both. As last year, we will be away
- to AFC Hayes in the Middlesex Senior Cup
- on Tuesday 16th October 2018 while our first
- appearance in the Middlesex Charity Cup
- for several years will see us travel to play at
- Wingate & Finchley, with our manager Dean
- Barker making a swift return to his former club!
- That game is likely to be arranged for a Tuesday
- in October so watch out for a date when it is
- arranged.

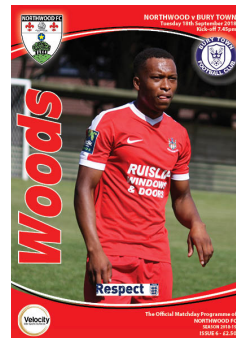
Under 18s Midweek

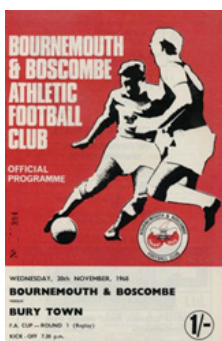
The History

Founded in 1872, Bury Town Football Club is one of the oldest Football Club's in the country and has a proud history dating back over 140 years. The club was one of 11 founder members of the Suffolk County Football Association in 1885 and has won the Suffolk Premier Cup on 13 occasions.

The club played in various local leagues until 1935 when it became a founder member of the Eastern Counties League. The club spent a total of 22 consecutive seasons in the Eastern Counties League, finishing as runners up in 1937-38. The Blues claimed the ECL title in the 1963-64 season as part of an historic treble, as they also captured the ECL Knockout Cup and the Suffolk Premier Cup.

This success saw the club move to the Metropolitan League and they kicked off their first ever Metropolitan game against Charlton Athletic 'A' at Kings Road in front of 1,150 spectators, Bury running out 1-0 winners. The club finished 4th in their first season and also retained the Suffolk Premier Cup.

Season 1965-66 was another successful season and another treble haul of trophies as the club stormed to the Metropolitan League title, won the Metropolitan League Cup and the Suffolk Premier Cup again. By this time the club were averaging over 1,000 supporters at their home matches and interest in the club was at an all time high.



In 1968, the Blues reached the First Round Proper of the FA Cup and drew Third Division side Bournemouth & Boscombe at Kings Road. 3,000 spectators assembled and witnessed Bury hold the Football League side to a goalless draw. The replay saw Bournemouth win through by 3 goals to 0 at Dean Court. The season had further success when the Blues

won the Metropolitan League title for a second time.

The clubs success resulted them taking the bold step to join the Southern Football League for the 1971-72 season. The club struggled to adapt to their new surroundings and after five seasons, decided to take the decision to re-join the Eastern Counties League, a decision that proved unpopular with supporters.

Bury Town moved into their current Ram Meadow ground in 1978 and collected the Suffolk Premier Cup as a reward.

The Blues spent a total of 11 seasons back in the ECL and their most successful moment of that time came in their final season when they reached the 4th Qualifying Round of the FA Cup and were drawn away at Football Conference leaders Enfield. The sides drew 0-0 at Southbury Road and returned to Ram Meadow for the replay, however in front 2,500 supporters, the visitors sneaked home 1-0 to reach the First Round Proper.

The 1987-88 season saw ambition return to the club and Bury were promoted to the Southern League. After a few seasons of promising results and large home crowds, the Blues failed to reach the Premier Division, the closest they came was finishing 4th in 1988-89. Years of overspending on players and ground improvements finally caught up and the club drifted into decline as the crowds drifted away. On the 4th May 1996, the Blues were relegated at Redditch United from the Midland Division of the Southern League, back to the Eastern Counties League.

The club spent another 10 years in the ECL, and despite some early seasons of struggles, success coincided with the appointment of former Colchester United captain Richard Wilkins to the manager's seat. The club reached the Quarter Final of the FA Vase in 2005 and then the Semi Final in 2006. Crowds rose back up and after two consecutive runners up spots in the Premier Division of the ECL, the club were promoted to the Isthmian League for the first time in their history.

The stay lasted two seasons and after adjusting to a higher level in 2006-07 with a 17th place finish, the following season saw the Blues finish in 7th position.

The FA re-organisation in 2008 saw Bury moved into the Southern League for a third spell of membership. A successful campaign saw Bury finish in 7th position in the Midland Division table, reach the First Round Proper of the FA Cup, losing 4-2 at Alfreton Town, and reach the Semi Final of the Southern League Cup, however in 2009-10, Bury Town clinched the Southern League Midland Division Championship on the final day of the season with a 3-0 home victory over Marlow in front of 1,550 supporters. The Blues piped Hitchin Town to the title, scoring 115 goals during the campaign and collecting 102 points to gain promotion. Another move across the pyramid saw the Blues re-join the Ryman League for the 2010-11 season, entering the Premier Division. A great season saw Bury finish third, but go out of the play off's to Lowestoft Town. There was however some silverware for the boardroom as Bury defeated Needham Market 2-0 in the final of the Suffolk Premier Cup at Portman Road.

20011-12 saw the club lift the Ryman League Cup with a victory over East Thurrock United and again finished in the play off places, but lost out to AFC Hornchurch in the Semi Final. 2014-15 saw our spell in the Premier Division come to an end after 5 years with relegation to Division One North. In our last two seasons back in Division One North we have finished in 13th and 11th place. 2017-18 saw the Blues finish 9th and reach the final of the Suffolk Premier Cup.

The Players

TANNER CALL

Tanner came through the youth system at West Suffolk College and made some first team appearances, but moved away to play for a number of local sides such as Walsham, Thetford Town and Debenham LC. Returned in the summer of 2018.

JAKE CHAMBERS-SHAW

Jake joined Bury in the summer of 2018. The attacking midfielder played for Mildenhall in the Bostik North last season where he made 35 appearances and scored 7 times. Prior to joining Mildenhall Jake was with Cambridge United and Histon. An exciting player who

creates and scores goals.

KYRAN CLEMENTS

Kyran joined Bury Town during the summer of 2016 on a season long loan from AFC Sudbury where he had earned a two year contract after impressing in their youth and reserve teams. He was with Woodbridge Town before joining Sudbury and was signed permanently this summer for an undisclosed fee from Sudbury.

OLLIE FENN

Joined on a month's loan from Needham Market in February 2016 but made the permanent switch last summer. Ollie previously played for Ipswich Town Academy and Irish Premier League side Galway United and at 28 is one of the more experienced members of the squad.

RYAN GIBBS

Striker Ryan joined the Blues in the summer of 2018, spending last season on dual registration with Walsham-Le-Willows in the Thurlow Nunn League and Needham Market in the Bostik Premier.

RYAN HORNE

Midfielder Ryan was with AFC Sudbury last season and started his career with Cambridge United. He has also had spells with Soham Town Rangers and experience of step 3 at St Neots Town in the Southern League. He joined Sudbury from St Neots in December 2017 and made 21 appearances for them in the Bostik North last season.

OLLIE HUGHES

A striker who had great success at Walsham-Le-Willows before joining Leiston and then AFC Sudbury. He signed for the Blues after a year working abroad and was supporter's player of the year for the last three seasons in a row, certainly a fans favourite at his home town club.

RYAN JOLLAND

A young midfielder who started out with the Ipswich Town academy before joining our partnership academy at West Suffolk College. He has now signed a contract with the club and has a big future at Ram Meadow.

JOHN KENNEDY

John signed for the Blues in the summer of 2011 from Cambridge City and is the longest serving player at the club. John started his career at Ipswich Town and was a big part of the successful Histon side and also played a big part in Canvey Island's successful rise up the pyramid. He is First Team coach this season.

JAKE KERINS

Defender Jake joined the club from Mildenhall Town for the 2018-19 season after 1 years' experience in the Bostik League. He was previously on a two year contract at Shrewsbury Town's academy. He is a quick and strong attacking right back.

IAN MILLER

Ian returned to the club where he started his career in the summer. He started out at Ram Meadow in 2004 and joined Ipswich Town in 2006 before going on to play for Boston United, Grimsby Town, Darlington and Cambridge United, where he won the FA Trophy and promotion in the same season at Wembley Stadium.

**TOMMY ROBINSON**

Tommy joined Bury from Cornard United's under 18 side after impressing. He was captain of our Under 18 side last term and also forced his way into the first team. He is a talented midfielder who had caught the eye of other clubs in the area and certainly a bright prospect for the future.

GARETH SIMPSON

Gareth joined from Mildenhall Town in the summer. Gareth won the league and cup double at Mildenhall two years ago and stayed for their first ever season at step 4. He has also represented Norwich, Gillingham, Cambridge City, Sudbury, Needham Market and Wroxham.

LUISTIBBLES

Goalkeeper who joined the club in August 2017. Previously with Wroxham and AFC Sudbury in the Isthmian League and also played for Kirkley & Pakefield in the Eastern Counties League. A great shot stopper and a firm favourite with the fans at Ram Meadow.

RYAN YALLOP

Ryan returned to Ram Meadow in late October after a short spell with Stowmarket Town at the start of the season. He came through the academy ranks to make his first team debut at 17, before leaving to join Stowmarket, however things didn't work out and he re-signed for the Blues.

JOE WHITE

Another player who has progressed through the West Suffolk College academy scheme, a strong central defender who has worked his way into the team over the last couple of seasons and now a regular name on the team sheet.

BEN CHENERY - MANAGER

Ben became manager of the Club in June 2014 after spending 2 years as Assistant Manager. He previously has managerial experience with Chelmsford City and has played professional football for Cambridge and Luton, as well as playing for a host of top flight non-league clubs, and is best remembered for scoring the winning goal for Canvey Island in the 2001 FA Trophy Final at Villa Park.

CHRISTIAN APPLEFORD - ASST. MANAGER

BURY TOWN 1 NORTHWOOD 2

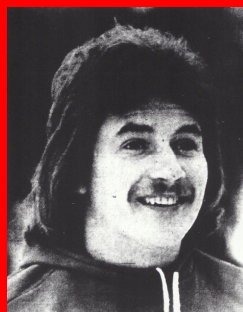
Northwood, then in the Hellenic League Premier Division, exceeded their wildest expectations, by taking their first step down the long road to Wembley with this surprise FA Vase Extra Preliminary Round success over Eastern Counties League Bury. It was the Woods' first-ever FA Vase fixture.

Woods' victory owed much to the notable performances of two players. Manager Paddy Coburn (*pictured top right*), a late replacement for Glyn Owen, led by example with a vigorous display that denied Bury Town both time and space, while John Toogood earned the admiration of his opponents and the adulation of his team-mates with a masterful performance when Northwood had their backs to the wall in the latter stages.

Bury, who paraded a number of former Ipswich Town players, rattled the Woods' crossbar after only five minutes but it was the visitors who drew first blood when Viv James intercepted a midfield pass and skilfully avoided two defenders before driving in a low shot that the keeper could only parry, leaving Mark Nelhams (*middle photo*) the simple task of sliding the ball home.

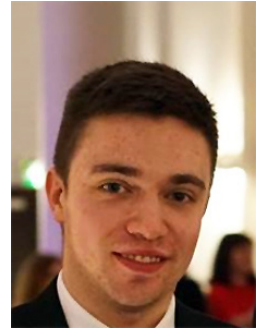
The match seemed over when the strong-running Martin Ellis (*bottom photo*) made it 2-0 fifteen minutes into the second half after being set free by Mick Byron, but Bury hit back to reduce the arrears through Bryant and set up a furious rearguard action by Northwood, the success of which earned them a home tie with Kernpston Rovers in the next round.

Another week, another cup-tie for Northwood

Another week and another foray into a cup competition for Dean Barker and his Northwood side as the Isthmian League Cup takes centre stage tonight for this clash against Bury Town.

Not for close to a decade have the Woods faced Bury, proving that one of the definite perks of being shuffled back to the Isthmian League after an extended period away is reacquainting one's self with old and new opponents alike.

The Woods, albeit in the Southern League Cup equivalent, will look to channel the success they enjoyed in 2015/16 when then boss Mark Burgess' Woods side went all the way to the semi-finals of the competition only to lose cruelly in a penalty shootout to Merthyr Town.

It is always difficult to predict the outcome of knockout football, especially in a competition that for some clubs has acquired an unfortunate reputation for being an unwelcome distraction from the bread and butter of league action.

Teams have often fielded weakened sides in front of reduced gates, but with a shortened league campaign and a noticeable absence of Saturday – Tuesday football you get the feeling that most will be treating these games with the seriousness and professionalism they deserve.

Barker perhaps recognises this more than most. He knows that games like these can be helpful, not detrimental, to a league campaign and

generate positive habits.

Then there is the obvious benefit to progression that comes most obviously in the momentum such results can generate. Let's hope then that today marks the start of a prolonged cup run!

While the draw for the next round has not been kind to Northwood, with a long mid-week trip to Suffolk to face Felixstowe & Walton United or AFC Sudbury to follow, that should not act as a deterrent today.

And while the financial gain from progression in these competitions is severely dwarfed by that of the more glamorous FA Cup and Trophy, there is nothing for Northwood to fear and plenty to be gained – starting tonight.

A quick mention, too, for the Woods' exertions in the two FA Cup games against Kings Langley. Though the replay ended in a disappointing 3-1 defeat at Gaywood Park, as Northwood were undone by a disappointing opening half hour, there are plenty of positives to take moving forward.

The original tie here was not only played out in front of a gate of 229 – nearly double the Woods' average attendances at Northwood Park – but was competitive from the first whistle to the last.

Rarely do goalless draws entertain and generate quite so many opportunities without either goalkeeper being forced into too many

saves.

Games like those, in which both sides emerged from the original tie feeling like they could have won the game and equally like they could have lost it, are few and far between.

Unfortunately, once it went to a replay the odds were heavily against the Woods. The physical toll combined with the difficulty of overcoming a step three side on their own patch always had Barker's young side as underdogs.

But from everything I've heard, once the shock of falling 3-0 down had passed Northwood grew into the game and made a fist of it in the second half. Too little too late in the end, but plenty of good lessons to take forward.

Bury will present a different kind of challenge. Both sides will have little to go other than the standard form guide and league standings which makes a tie like this even more enthralling a prospect.

The Woods boss may use the occasion to rest and rotate, to try out a different system or even to work on some of the things he and his coaching staff have identified in training.

These games are never secondary in importance and should never be viewed as such. Every game presents an opportunity for progression, both in terms of the competition and for the group in general.

More minutes together on the pitch will be beneficial for all concerned and will allow Barker to learn even more about his squad at what remains an early juncture of the season – despite the fact we find ourselves in mid-September.

I'm writing these notes before Northwood's tough assignment at one of the early season pacesetters in Bracknell Town, who had won four from a possible four to top the South Central table heading into Saturday. Fingers crossed for a positive result there!

Playing on 3G will have presented another unique challenge, even if Barker's side had a taste of that when they played Hoddesdon Town at Wodson Park in pre-season.

Tonight be another good examination of their credentials. But everything I know about Barker, and all the conversations I've had with him, suggest he won't take less than 100 per cent from his players and will be desperate to progress.

Those beliefs will resonate with everyone of a Woods persuasion, so let's do our bit and get behind the lads in the first of two home games this week.

Up the Woods!!

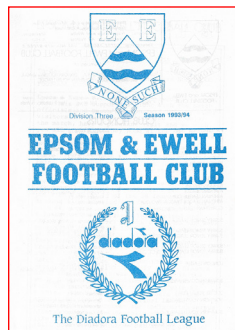

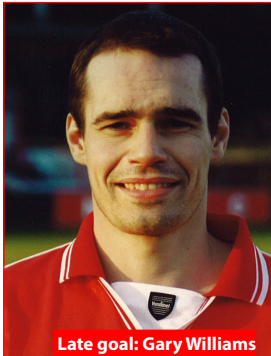

MATCH REPORT

Northwood exited the F.A. Cup in disappointing fashion as they conceded three first-half goals at a rainswept Gaywood Park. Woods started brightly enough but the mood was dampened as early as the fifth minute following the awarding of a hotly disputed free-kick, Mitchell Weiss latching, unopposed, onto Dean Hitchcock's whipped delivery to dispatch a flicked header and give Kings Langley the lead. Woods were buoyed by the goal and they were making growing inroads down the left hand side with Matt Cooper enjoying an increasingly effective game at left-back and combining well with Lopes de Matos. They went close to further reducing the arrears as the impressive Lopes de Matos slid the ball through to Ewington for his first clear chance of the evening, his shot being diverted on to the stanchion by covering defender Jorell Johnson.

However, Woods were reminded of the threat offered by Kings' experienced strike force as Rene Howe barrelled his way into the Northwood box and saw his shot deflect for a corner.

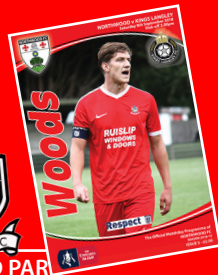
The hosts were content to soak up the Northwood pressure and protect their lead while launching the occasional counter-attack, and moved into the next round at the end of the 90 minutes.

MATCH REPORT

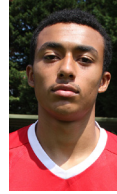

This is our seventeenth season of Isthmian League Cup competition - albeit after a break of nine years. And it is seventeen seasons since the Woods won the Isthmian League Cup as a First Division side by beating Premier Division Hampton & Richmond Borough in the 2002 final at St. Albans City FC.

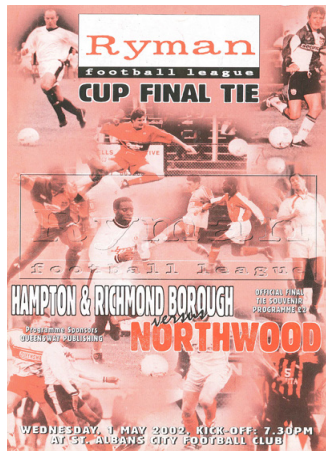
That had followed reaching the semi-final the previous year, losing out to Heybridge Swifts over two legs, the Swifts going on to defeat Croydon in the Final. Prior to those two successful seasons, the Woods' performances in the League Cup had been somewhat underwhelming in the eight seasons since being promoted to the league in 1992, never winning more than two matches in any one season. It's been the same since then too, so we will take a look back to those two successful seasons at the start of the decade.

The 2000/2001 started with a 4-2 victory away at Chalfont St. Peter with the top strikers of the time, Steve Hale and Lawrence Yaku, both bagging two goals apiece. In the next round we travelled away to Premier Division strugglers Grays Athletic and showed what kind of form the Woods were in by notching a facile 4-0 win, with Hale netting a sublime hat-trick. Grays were, of course, to gain revenge a few weeks later when they beat the Woods in the fourth and final qualifying round of the FA Cup. A long trip to Worthing followed and on an icy night the Woods came back from the south coast with a 2-0 success which finally earned them a home game against Premier side Billericay Town in the next round. In a pulsating game, Mark Hook popped up to score a late winner in a 4-3 victory.

In the quarter-final the Woods were drawn at home to another Premier Division side in Purfleet but the visitors pressed the self-destruct button and scored two own-goals as Northwood romped into the semi-final by 4-1. The two-legged tie gave the Woods an away trip to Heybridge Swifts and it went out of their reach really on a disappointing night which saw the Swifts win 4-1. The second leg was marred by a serious ankle break for Swifts star Adam Gillespie after just nine minutes. There was a 45 minute delay while he was taken by ambulance to Watford General. When play

restarted, there was no real desire from either side but the visitors eventually went 2-1 for a 5-3 aggregate success.

Having been so close then, the Woods were keen to go one better the following year, but they had a tight contest at old rivals Harlow Town in the opening round, needing extra-time and a penalty to win 2-1. The next round was away at Premier neighbours Harrow Borough, but we had no such problems after Steve Hale helped himself to another League Cup hat-trick as the Woods triumphed 4-1. A tricky away tie at Leyton Pennant followed and the side was indebted to a rare single goal from Danny Butler for a place in the quarter-finals. Champions-elect Canvey Island were the visitors to Chestnut Avenue at that stage but a really fine Northwood performance produced a 3-1 victory. This time the semi-final paired the Woods with fellow Division One side Tooting & Mitcham United and the home leg came first. Could they take the tie away from the Terrors? Almost, as Kieran Knight netted twice along with one each from Ryan Ashe and Lawrence Yaku as Northwood took a 4-2 advantage into the second leg at Sandy Lane. It was a real battle in the second-leg but a goal from Ryan Ashe midway through the first-half eased any real worries and although Tooting did come back to draw 1-1, it was the joyful Woods who moved into the final.



Hampton & Richmond Borough had only just avoided relegation from the Premier Division but

had managed to squeeze past third-placed Aldershot Town in the other semi-final, 3-2 on aggregate. It was our opponents' last game under the management of Steve Cordery, who had announced he was to leave the club afterwards, and subsequently joined Staines Town.

Andy Cook headed the Woods in front when he beat Hampton keeper Stuart MacKenzie to a long ball but Hampton were level inside a few minutes as Neil Gough slotted in a Sam Sloma cross. After 73 minutes, Cook latched onto a loose ball and Northwood were in front again, only for Richard O'Connor to drive home another equaliser. Extra-time was the order of the night and Lawrence Yaku pounced to make it 3-2 just two minutes onto the first extra period and our Middlesex rivals were unable to come back a third time.

UNDER 18's

The Woods Under 18s are again this season playing in the West Division of the Isthmian Youth League, now known as the Save The Children Youth League, guided by Mark Fox and Richard Elderfield (pictured).

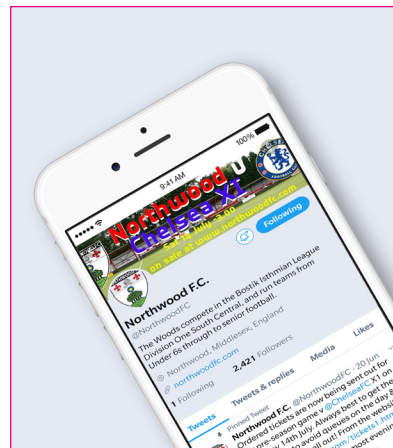

TEN YEARS AFTER

Today we continue with our popular feature where we look back to events here at Northwood Park from exactly a decade ago.

The Woods had ended the 2007/08 season, their first back in the Isthmian League, in a creditable tenth place after a slow start having won their last six home games in succession and with only two defeats in their final twelve matches. At the end of season awards night, held at the Met Police Sports Club in Bushey, it was young central



defender Bradley Hewitt who swept the board to claim all three main awards with goalkeeper Mitch Swain runner-up in the Supporters Player of the Year award. Despite leaving to join Stevenage Borough in January, it was teenager Elliott Buchanan who claimed the Golden Boot with 23 goals while John Christian won Most Promising Player.

Victory against Chatham Town had brought the Woods ten points from their first five league matches with the only set-backs being an FA Cup defeat at home to the Metropolitan Police and a heavy 5-1 thrashing at Ware so confidence was still realistically high when the Woods travelled for a midweek clash at Potters Bar Town on Tuesday 9th September 2008.

The Woods put in a solid performance as Manager Colin Payne put out an unchanged side, though an early knee injury for Joe Cowan saw him replaced by Danny Brown at right-

back almost immediately. The home side were still looking for their first win of the season but started well and a free-kick from Stephen Hafner skidded off the greasy surface to cause goalkeeper Mitch Swain a few problems but Ryan Tackley was there to clear the loose ball. Gradually the Woods found their range with John Christian seeing one effort deflected for a corner while being crowded out by the home defence when put through by Dwain Williams. But neither side had really had a clear-cut chance by half-time and there was a change for the second period as Otis Williams replaced Terry Davies up front. The substitute's pace immediately asked questions of the Bar defence and on the hour mark he created a good opening for Sonner but his shot crashed into the side-netting.

But Northwood were not to be denied and when Danny Murphy was upended in the box by Mustapha Dumbuya, Sonner coolly despatched the resulting spot-kick to give the Woods a 62nd minute lead. This led to a more frantic final half-hour with both sides going close. Brad Hewitt blocked a goalbound Serge Makofu shot while Otis Williams saw an effort hit the post when he latched onto a low Michael Gordon cross. The Woods were unable to find the second goal which their play deserved but they held on comfortably to

produced a flying save to deny Denny Webb, just after Holland missed a free header from Webb's free-kick.

There was an odd opportunity at the other end. Sonner miscued as he attempted to lift a Ryan Tackley ball over the advancing 'keeper Joe Taylor, Ursell had a low shot comfortably

secure their fourth win of the season.



Being out of the FA Cup, the Woods had no game on the following Saturday, nor a midweek fixture so there was a full eleven-day rest before their next action when they played a home game against Waltham Abbey.

Colin Payne introduced a new signing with AFC Wimbledon legend Rob Ursell joining the club to add to the attacking flair at his disposal. Ursell had failed to settle since leaving the New Dons with short spells at Carshalton Athletic, Hendon and Wingate & Finchley. He replaced Terry Davies while young Danny Brown kept his place at right-back.

Sean Sonner was presented with a chance within seconds of the start as he found himself free on the edge of the box but his volley few wide of the Abbott's goal. But generally the Woods looked decidedly under par with Billy Holland close to converting a low cross and then James Elmes was put through by his brother Harry but his shot lacked the needed power to beat Mitch Swain in goal. Swain was much the busier of the two 'keepers as Northwood continued their slow start and he also spared Brown's blushes as he just kept out a possible own-goal from a header. Swain also

- Abbey were not to be denied a half-time lead.
