In particular we welcome our visitors, who compete in the Isthmian League South Central Division. They are the third team from that particular division that we have played in this competition in a row. Previously we defeated Uxbridge 4-1 and Hanworth Villa 5-1, both at Silver Jubilee Park. In the previous rounds, Northwood beat Southall 5-4 in the penalty shoot-out after a 1-1 draw away, whilst prior to that The Woods drew a bye in the first round.

# RTER-FINAL STACE OF ESEX SENIOR CUP

**When The Football Association dropped the** bombshell towards the end of last year that **Barnsley were being** booted out of the FA **Cup for fielding an** ineligible player, it may have made more people realise just what goes into running a football club.

We all turn up on a Saturday or midweek to watch a game but it's unlikely we ever think about the work that goes in away from the match day to make sure everything runs smoothly.

Every season we see a Non-League club fall foul of rules in cup competitions. Whether it's a player not registered properly, someone who is cup tied or even under suspension, there are many pitfalls to dodge.

On The Non-League Show podcast with Tim Fuell we've often talked about the pressures on volunteers of clubs and have come to the conclusion: Who would be a Non-League secretary?!

While having every sympathy for Barnsley fans, the news also brought a feeling that these things don't just happen to Non-League clubs and the full-



time professional outfits can make mistakes too. Ultimately, that's what this is. Barnsley almost certainly weren't trying to gain any advantage over Horsham on the sly, they just made the error of playing a player in their replay who was out on loan when the original tie — a thrilling 3-3 draw — was played.

But the League One side's bad luck was Horsham's gain and they went on to play Sutton United. It's funny how it's worked out for Dom Di Paola's side. The Isthmian Premier club were, understandably, aggrieved when they had to play their first game up at Barnsley on a Friday night under instruction from South Yorkshire Police.

As a result, a number of fans

couldn't make it — even though the Lardy Army did travel in their droves and lapped up every minute of the six-goal thriller. The draw meant back it was to Sussex in front of the live TV cameras with the benefits of a live TV fee and the chance to take on League Two Sutton (which Horsham subsequently lost 3-0 last month).

### **Bizarre VAR**

Anyone else sick of VAR ruining top level games? It's yet another reminder of why we love Non-League football. People getting frustrated with the game at the top will increasingly be drawn to this level of football. And we all know they'll enjoy it when they do. O

This series celebrates some of the greatest cup ties in Hendon's history. The title paraphrases the line from Psalm 23, "The Lord is My Shepherd", and was originally "My cup runneth over" — literally my cup is running over, or, more simply, I am more than satisfied. From the days of Christ Church Hampstead, through Hampstead Town, Hampstead, Golders Green and now Hendon, the club has won more than 50 trophies (including league titles) in its history. Most of the matches will, of course, be victories for the club, but there will also be a few draws and defeats which were almost as memorable.

### Hendon v Northwood • 1st April 2002, Middlesex Senior Cup final • Church Road, Hayes FC • Hendon won 4-2 (after extra time)

Hendon won the Middlesex Senior Cup for the 13th time — including two as Golders Green — with a hard-fought 4—2 victory over Northwood at Hayes' Church Road ground.

Although play swung from end to end for long periods, the game lacked quality.

The hard, bumpy pitch made instant control almost impossible and both teams' eagerness to shut down the other, resulted in a harum-scarum affair. As the game moved into extra time, with both teams tiring, the match improved.

After six minutes, Eugene Ofori showed his pace and sprinted past Alan Hamlet. With only Paul Riordan to beat, the young striker went for a spectacular strike rather than a calculated

finish and the ball sailed high over the bar.

In the 21st minute, a drilled cross from Dale Binns was met by Martin Randall at the near post, but Riordan produced a spectacular save.

After this, Northwood began to get a foothold in the match, but Steve Butler and Mark Cooper dealt with just about everything thrown at them.
The ever-dangerous Lawrence

Yaku was not given much service and he was forced to forage for possession some way from the danger area.

Just before half-time, a shot from Steve Forbes struck the boot of Danny Butler. The extra touch slowed it enough to allow Riordan to make another diving save.

The opening goal arrived 10 minutes after the interval. Ofori took a quick corner to Binns, who crossed first time. Fastest to react was RANDALL, and although his header was parried by Riordan, the goalkeeper could not keep the ball out.

Instead of going forward and building on this lead, Hendon either sat back or – more likely – were forced into more defensive positions. David Hook was called upon to make saves on two or three occasions and also was quickly off his line to deal with a succession of crosses.

Midway through the second half, Scott Fitzgerald replaced Gavin Hart who had struggled to make an impression. The Woods, who named only four substitutes, made no other changes in the 120 minutes.

Entering the final quarter of an hour, Northwood began to take control, with Yaku increasingly causing problems for the Hendon defence.

With 12 minutes to go, Micky Woolner, cautioned three minutes earlier, committed another foul near the corner flag. There was no second caution, but it did cost Hendon dear.

From a perfectly-worked set move, the kick was taken short, then delivered from a different angle. Chris GELL timed his run perfectly to get to the ball first and he buried his header past Hook.

In the 83rd minute, clearly the last defender, Danny Butler was lucky not to be dismissed or even cautioned – for pushing Ofori to the ground on the edge of the box as the two raced for a through ball. Byron Bubb's free-kick came to nothing and it proved to be his final contribution as Ricci Crace became Hendon's second substitute to enter the action. Jon-Barrie Bates had replaced Steve Forbes minutes earlier.

The break before extra time started afforded the Hendon management team the time to change some tactics and style and it had an immediate effect. The Greens dominated the first period of extra time, but Riordan was in fine form to deny Binns and Randall with two more excellent saves.

In the 103rd minute, however, he was beaten as Hendon got a stroke of luck. A shot from Binns, following a cleared corner, fell to Steve Butler, who passed to RANDALL, and the striker, quick as a flash, turned and fired into the net. Almost immediately, Randall was denied a hat-trick when his shot smacked a post.

However, seconds before the end of the first period of extra time, Hendon scored the goal of the game. CRACE ran onto the ball just outside the Northwood penalty area and went on a mazy run past three defenders before shooting low past the advancing Riordan.

The game wasn't over, however. With five minutes remaining, YAKU conjured a goal with a superb chip over Hook. Suddenly Woods felt they were back in the game, although time was against them.

In the last minute, with Northwood over-committed to attack, Hendon raided down the right wing. Randall passed across to BINNS, in acres of space, and he rolled the ball into the corner of the net.

### This is a 'Claremont Chatter' with a difference. An example of what you can do to fill time when you are bored rigid!

Through boredom I managed to gather some statistics about Claremont Road which you might find interesting. On my Hendon programme I scribbled various facts and figures about the ground at the time of watching the game.

The match itself – played a few days after Christmas on a heavy pitch with a bitter wind swirling around – was so tediously boring but I wasn't in a position to go home because I was with my father. He was an avid Hendon supporter and cheered the team on whatever the conditions, circumstances or scoreline. On the other hand, I was less interested at the time, although in the last ten years or so I have attended loads of Hendon games both home and away. Perhaps his passion finally rubbed off on me!

But back to 2007 and that dull goalless draw against Harrow Borough. So to pass the time I just looked around the ground and noted various things about it and scribbled my findings down on my match programme.

Of course it has meant nothing to me other than having something to do at the time. But when I visited Silver Jubilee Park last season, read the programme and saw that you were looking for articles for *Claremont Chatter*, I remembered the time when I was bored at this particular game, dug out the programme and here we are!

I suppose it is good to know that after all these years I have finally put these statistics to good use! I didn't have a mobile phone with me that day in late December 2007 so I had nothing else to do but look around the ground, amusing

myself collating irrelevant facts! So let's get on to what I wrote on that match programme back in 2007.

On the side of the main stand, seven green vertical supports held up the stand roof. There were sloping wooden panels, painted green, with 11 poles supporting the side of the roof panels. (I know, I know, sad isn't it?!)


There were 18 red seats in the 'home' directors' box next to the tunnel in the main stand. And 14 on the 'away' side! (Big deal, I hear you say!)

Five vertical supports, painted green, held up the smallish sloping stand roof on the other side of the ground, which used to extend the whole length of the touchline as I have been reliably informed by my father. Each support had a Y shaped bracket. He told me that he used to stand towards the back of that stand on the steps under cover in the days when there were several hundreds of fans filling the ground, with attendances often passing the 1,000 mark.

On the red-painted railings with white boards in front of that stand, there were 30 advertising panels between the white concrete posts. And behind the goals there were 24 panels between the white posts. (Zzzzzzzzzz! Wakey wakey!)

On the pitch-wide concrete terracing at the car park end, there were 13 steps. There were eight lamps at the top of three of the floodlight pylons; the other had seven. (Look up to heaven!)

There were other figures scribbled down which I could not decipher. Pretty useless information, I know, but they were some details – and memories – of an old ground which was closed a year later. If all this trivia has evoked memories for some of our supporters, then my daft notes on that match programme back in late December 2007 did not go to waste!



### **RORAIGH BROWNE**

Goalkeeper. South-African born goalkeeper who signed for the Woods on work experience terms from Watford. Roraigh had a short loan spell with Chertsey Town during season 2022-23. Age: 18.

### **MATT MESSER**

Goalkeeper. Keeper Matt was signed in the summer 2023, having played over 25 games for Holmer Green during season 2022-23. Age: 22.

### **DEAGO DUNBAR BONNIE**

Defender. Full-back Deago signed for Northwood in July 2023, having spent the previous season at Kings Langley, also spending time on loan at Oxhey Jets. Age: 20.

### **HARRY GALLAGHER**

Defender. Starting his non-League career in February 2022, Harry has impressed in a defensive role at Broadfields United. He trained with the Woods during the latter stages of last season and, has continued to impress. Age: 24.

### **SAM JENKINS**

Defender. Sam originally joined the club in July 2018 having previously been at Harpenden Town. He won the Manager's Player of the Year award at the end of that season but then joined Chesham United. Sam had a couple of dual-registered spells back at the Woods, but rejoined on a permanent basis in July 2022.

### **ROMARIO JONAS**

Defender. Romario joined the Woods on dual-registration with Hanwell Town in July 2022. He made his name with some impressive performances at Ashford Town (Middlesex) and earned a move to Step 3 side Hendon, where he made almost 50 appearances over two seasons. Previously with Bracknell Town and Chalfont St Peter before playing for the successful Hanwell side that won promotion through the play-offs in May 2022. Age: 26.

### **TEDDY STACEY**

Defender/midfielder. Teddy joined Northwood from Hadley. He was at Tottenham as a youth and then went to the US where he represented, ironically, Northwood College in Michigan as well as playing for Greater Lowell Rough Diamonds. He's a versatile player who can play in defence or midfield and enjoyed a fine first season at the higher level. Age: 26.

### **LUKE TINGEY**

Defender. Luke is a very experienced defender who joined the Woods in February 2022 from Potters Bar Town. He started off at the MK Dons Youth Academy and then went on to play almost 200 games at Step 3 for Hendon, also having a short spell with St Albans City. Luke was awarded the Managers' Player of the Year last season. Age: 26.

### RICCARDO ALEXANDER-GREENWAY

Midfielder. Riccardo first joined the Woods on a dual-registration basis from Hendon in March 2022 but only played one game. He had previously played at Chalfont St Peter for two seasons, being named Player of the Year in 2019-20. However, he signed on permanently in July 2022. Age: 22.

### **KOFI ANOKYE-BOADI**

Midfielder. Kofi is a dynamic midfielder and was with Crystal Palace and Barnet as a youngster. He had spells with Chipstead and Bedfont Sports in 2022-23, and joined Woods in summer 2023. Age: 23.

### **ZEID HANNACHI**

Midfielder. Zeid joined the Woods in October 2023 from Binfield. The attacking midfielder previously had spells with Guildford City, Knaphill, Thatcham Town and Wokingham & Emmbrook. Age: 20.

### **PRINCE MBENGUI**

Midfielder. Experienced, competitive midfielder who joined the Woods in October 2023. He was with Ashford Town (Middlesex) and Bedfont FC in 2022-23, having had previous spells with Hendon, Uxbridge, Guildford City and Staines Town. Prince started out as a youth with Hayes & Yeading. Age: 26.

### → HARRY MCCORKELL

Midfielder. Harry joined the Woods in July 2023 from North Greenford United, having previously spent six years at Harefield United. Age: 23.

### HARRY MCKENNA

Midfielder. A young academy prospect at National League side Aldershot Town, Harry joined the Woods in October 2023 with a view to impressing in his midfield role. Age: 19.

### **JACK SMITH**

Midfielder. Jack joined the Woods in March 2023 from St Panteleimon, having also been registered with Chesham United. He came through the youth ranks at Wealdstone and is now on dual-registration with Broadfields United.

Age: 26.

### **CARL STEWART**

Midfielder. Former Watford youth midfielder Carl joined Woods in November 2021 on a dual-registration basis from Beaconsfield Town. He was also at Udinese as a youngster and then played in Poland for Zaglebie Sosnowiec. He also had short spells at Oxford

City, Banbury United, Bedfont Sports, Wingate & Finchley and Marlow. Age: 25.

### **CURTIS BROWN**

Forward. Curtis came to notice with goals for Step 6 Winslow United and continued progress with Aylesbury Vale and Risborough Rangers at Step 5 in 2022-23, joining Woods in summer 2023. He is a teenager who shows great promise. Age: 19.

### REECE CAMERON

Forward. Reece is a powerful, experienced forward who joined the Woods in October 2023 on dual-registration from Harrow Borough. He started out at Chesham United before having spells at Leverstock Green, Aylesbury United and Colney Heath. Since then, he has had success at Oxhey Jets, Arlesey Town and Flackwell Heath. Age: 26.

### **BEN CROWDER**

Forward. Ben, a member of the Woods Allied Counties Youth League squad, signed senior forms for the 2023-24 campaign, and picked up an assist on his debut on the opening day. Age: 17.

### JADEN NEWMAN

Forward. Jaden joined the Woods in August 2023 from Combined Counties Premier North side Wembley. The young forward impressed during the latter stages of preseason with some encouraging performances, scoring against Dagenham & Redbridge. Age: 19.

### **GODLOVE OPPONG**

Forward. Teenage striker who shows great potential, having scored plenty of goals for Tring Athletic over the last two seasons, joining the Woods in summer 2023. Age: 19.

### **DAN WILLIAMS**

Forward. Dan is a striker who came through the successful Hendon Under 23 side and then made a huge impact at Chalfont St Peter with plenty of goals. He then moved to Tooting & Mitcham and Bedfont Sports in 2021/22 before joining Uxbridge in the summer of 2022. From there he signed for Woods in February 2023. Age: 26.



### **STEVE RINGROSE**

Director of Football. Steve, vastly experienced, arrived at Northwood in November 2021 as Director of Football. His last role was a similar position at Potters Bar Town following a stint as manager as he eased coach James Duncan into the role. Steve had great success with Hillingdon Borough, winning promotion and reaching the FA Vase Final in 2006 before a good spell at North Greenford United. He has also held roles with Hemel Hempstead, Ware and the Middlesex County FA representative side.

### **BEN BUKOWSKI**

Manager. Ben was appointed as Head Coach at the Woods in November 2021 to work closely alongside Director of Football Steve Ringrose in his first managerial role, becoming manager in summer 2023. Ben is a well-respected coach who has worked for Gary McCann at both Hendon and Hampton & Richmond Borough in recent years.



### **KEAGAN COLE**

Assistant Manager. Keagan arrived at Northwood in a player-coach role in November 2021 having skippered Potters Bar Town at Step 3 and after a short spell with Walthamstow. Prior to that he came up through the youth ranks at Hendon to become the youngest player to make over 100 appearances for that club. He picked up the Supporters Player of the Year award in 2022, and became Assistant Manager in summer 2023. Age: 24.



### **JACOB COOK**

Coach. Former former Hemel Hempstead, Billericay Town and Wealdstone midfielder Jacob joined the Northwood coaching team in the summer 2023.

### **DENNIS QUIGLEY**

Coach. Former Ickenham FC manager Dennis joined the Northwood coaching team in the summer of 2023.

### **ELIZABETH BROOKS**

Sports Therapist. Elizabeth joined the Woods in the summer of 2022 to become the club's Sports Therapist, and continues her role in 2023-24 along with Mitch Elliott-Smith.

### The makers of the **Emirates FA Cup**

With the FA Cup third round held over a recent weekend. we're taking a look at the actual trophy, that wonderful old iconic cup which is highly synonymous with the competition itself.

Thomas Lyte as a company are incredibly proud to be the Official Trophy Supplier to The FA and the exclusive makers of the Emirates FA Cup trophy. one of the most instantly recognisable and prestigious trophies in global sport. Commissioned in 2013, they handcrafted the current trophy in time for the 2014 final, a classic between Arsenal and Hull City.

### Who made the Emirates FA **Cup trophy?**

A Royal Warrant holder as silversmiths and goldsmiths to Her Majesty the Queen, Thomas Lyte are worldrenowned custom trophy designers and makers, and

the Emirates FA Cup trophy exemplifies their meticulous eye for detail and ability to fuse traditional craftsmanship with modern methods.

Making one of sport's greatest pieces of silverware is never an easy task, but the Thomas Lyte team of master craftspeople at their London-based silver workshops utilised all their experience and expertise to produce a trophy that will stand the test of time.

The FA Cup spends much more time outside of the trophy cabinet than the original 1911 trophy, with regular public and media appearances. For modern-day sports trophies wear and tear is unavoidable. so Thomas Lyte re-designed the trophy to be thicker to ensure that it is more robust and easier to repair when the inevitable happens.

"It is a national treasure, an icon of British football, and its



heritage is embedded within the design and craft of the new trophy. It's incredible the way football has entered into everyday life. The trophy is constantly in demand - that is why we have made it in a way that is more equipped for those changes," says Kevin Baker, CEO and founder of Thomas Lyte.

### Making the FA Cup trophy

The 2014 version of the FA Cup, weighing 6.3kg, is based on the design of the first trophy, awarded to Bradford City after their replay win over Newcastle United in 1911. Time moves on but many of the original silversmithing skills incorporated in the trophy's earliest version were still very much in evidence as

the new trophy came to life in our London workshops. The process of hand-spinning, hand-chasing, polishing and hand-engraving, crafting skills that take decades to master. were all utilised during the production of this modern classic. Standing at 61.5cm and hand-spun from single sheet of sterling silver, the iconic grapes and vines, and fluting of the trophy were delicately hammered into the precious metal using a process called "hand-chasing", a traditional skill dating back thousands of years that Thomas Lyte are passionate about preserving and harnessing in our modern day commissions.

The inside of this bespoke sports trophy, locked away under its magnificent lid, is exquisitely gold-plated. Using a chemical reaction called electroplating, Thomas Lyte immersed the trophy into a large tank of a gold plating solution, and given a negative charge which attracts the positively-charged gold ions to sit on the surface of the sterling silver.

Both the full name of the trophy – The Football Association Challenge Cup – and each winning team's name is engraved onto the trophy by hand. The original plinth band on the base was transferred to the new trophy, ensuring that the echoes of cup finals past still form part of the trophy's magical allure.

### Who restores the FA Cup?

Quality control, a cornerstone of Thomas Lyte's brand values, plays an essential part in maintaining this stunning





custom-made trophy. Much like the first time the new trophy left the Thomas Lyte workshops, each time it's returned to the company, the Emirates FA Cup goes through a rigorous set of sign-offs to ensure that when it's ready to be handed over again, it's looking at its absolute best.

### An interesting link between Thomas Lyte and the FA up Final

Thomas Lyte, after whom the company is named, is also inextricably linked with the competition, with Henry Francis Lyte, the composer of *Abide With Me* in 1847, being a direct descendent of the company namesake. The famous hymn has been sung at the FA Cup final since 1927, picked as a favourite of King George V.

### **About the FA Cup**

There were two previous trophies before the current design was introduced in 1911. The first cup was actually stolen from a Birmingham shop window in 1895, costing Aston Villa – the then holders – £25 to ensure a replica could be made in time for the next final.

No club competition can match the magic of the competition. Whether it's a giant-killing involving a non-league club in the third round proper, or unmatched drama in the great finals of days-gone-by, the FA Cup has it all.

To play at Wembley – first home to the twin towers and now the Arch which is firmly established as a London landmark – and have the chance to compete for the Emirates FA Cup trophy is something that every young footballer dreams of. Few will get the chance to actually lift the trophy, but those who do will never forget the experience.

### Other Thomas Lyte trophies and medals commissioned by The FA

In addition to making the Emirates FA Cup, Thomas Lyte also designed and made the Women's FA Cup trophy, and design and supply the winner's and runner-up medals for both competitions. Other FA commissions include the FA Community Shield trophy and medals, the FA Youth Cup trophy and repairing or restoring many of The FA's other pieces, including the Women's Super League trophy.
