

Welcome to the Blues

A warm welcome back to the Skyline Roofing Stadium tonight as welcome familiar opponents to kick-off our Velocity Isthmian League Cup campaign with Marlow as our visitors. The Blues enjoyed an excellent 4-0 victory away at Thatcham Town to reach this stage while the Woods enjoyed a 'bye' in the first round. Due to the lack of time to get this programme to the printer, it is a bit reduced in size tonight so apologies for this. The full programme will be back on Saturday for our FA Cup tie. Marlow have made a much better start to this campaign as they did last season. They did suffer a shock O-1 home defeat against Thatcham Town in a league game on the opening day but since then they have won all six games played, are still in the FA Cup after two wins over Step 5 sides and will play Isthmian Premier club Horsham away at the weekend. We wish them well. On Saturday they progressed in the FA Trophy with a narrow 1-0 victory at current league leaders Ravnes Park Vale.

It is over 20 years since the Woods actually won the Isthmian League Cup. In 2001/02, victories over Harlow Town, Harrow Borough, Levton Pennant, Canvey Island and Tooting & Mitcham United got us through to a final played at St. Albans FC against Hampton & Richmond Borough, Two goals from Andy Cook and one from Lawrence Yaku earned us a 3-2 victory. We had lost in the

semi-final to Hevbridge Swifts a year earlier and have since reached the semi-final of the Southern League Cup (2015/16), losing to Merthyr Town.

If level after 90 minutes tonight, a penalty shoot-out would decide the winners.

Cup News

Following our hard-fought FA Cup replay 1-0 victory over Binfield last Tuesday night, we will now face Isthmian South-East side Cray Valley Paper Mills here at the Skyline Roofing Stadium this coming Saturday in the Second Qualifying Round. The opposition are new to us as we've never met before but they have enjoyed an excellent start to the campaign and are currently unbeaten after seven matches played. In the FA Cup they needed a replay to beat Lordswood 4-1 but they enjoyed a comfortable 3-0 victory at Uxbridge (played at Slough) in the last round. On Saturday in the FA Trophy, they won 2-0 at fellow South-East Division side Broadbridge Heath and they have also (like ourselves) won both of their League games played to date. Both of those have been away from home, 3-2 at Sittingbourne and 7-2 at Phoenix Sports. It will clearly be a tough game as we look to reach the third qualifying round for the first time since 2012/13.

On Saturday, our long trip to Ramsgate who, like Cray Valley, are amongst the favourites for the South-East Division title, proved a difficult one and we exited the Isuzu FA

Trophy at the first stage as we were beaten 3-0 by the Kent coast side. On a sweltering day, the home side were quickly on the front foot in front of a big crowd on their 3G pitch. They had already threatened before Luke Tingey was forced off with an early iniury and the Rams turned the screw with a goal just two minutes later. Andrew McCorkell was in good form again, keeping out several efforts on goal while the crossbar and Teddy Stacev also came to our rescue but two quick goals just before the halftime interval killed any hopes of a second-half comeback.

Plaver News

We are hoping that Godlove Oppong will be ready to get some minutes under his belt tonight for the first time this season while Curtis Brown is also getting nearer to a return. At the time of writing, we still await news on Luke Tingey's injury but it was good to see Romario Jonas involved for the first time on Saturday and he will be valuable to the defence as his match fitness levels improve.

If involved tonight, Teddy Stacev is in line for his 50th club appearance while Riccardo Alexander-Greenaway is currently on 48 games so could make it to the same milestone on Saturday if he plays in both matches.

The Club's Annual Community Day is back this season with our home game against Westfield on Saturday 7th October being chosen for a day which is designated "Pay what you











Can" and will see all the players and parents of Northwood Youth being invited down to the club.

MATCH ACTION Stewart 90+2' Binfield

EMIRATES FA CUP FIRST QUALIFYING ROUND REPLAY TUESDAY 5 SEPTEMBER 2023











orthwood left it late with a stoppage time winner as they finally overcame Binfield to progress to the second qualifying round of the FA Cup after a closely fought replay on a balmy Skyline evening.

Woods began with the same team which finished Saturday's game with Luke Brophy making his first start at left-back as Deago Dunbar-Bonnie continued in a more advanced role while Osaretin Otote started on the right flank.

There was a good tempo to the game from the off as Binfield's Trov Murray headed narrowly wide from Zeid Hannachi's deep cross before the confident Murray tried his luck with a shot from the edge of the box which was safely gathered by Northwood goalkeeper Andrew McCorkell. At the other end. Otote got round the back of the Moles' defence before delivering a teasing cross which evaded a red shirt before Dan Williams tested visiting 'keeper Harvey Rackley-Barnes with a sharp near-post shot after being played in by strike partner Kofi Anokye-Boadi.

However, Woods had McCorkell to thank after Harry Gallagher's under-hit backpass was intercepted by Ben Stallard who had time to set himself but was denied by the Woods stopper with the goal at his mercy.

The visitors continued to threaten with their sharp, incisive play and it was Stallard who was once again denied by McCorkell as the striker looked to convert after Rechan Esprit had created the opening.

Having stood firm, Woods looked to get back on the offensive with Williams seeing more of the ball in the final third - a lobbed cross dropping wide after Rackley-Hayes had left his goal unguarded before the Northwood number nine sent over a deep cross which was met by the head of Dunbar-Bonnie who headed into the arms of Rackley-Hayes.

Woods maintained their strong finish to an entertaining opening period, and they were denied by an upright as Riccardo

Alexander-Greenaway's back-header from Luke Tingey's flat throw into the box came back of the woodwork before being hastily cleared.

HALF TIME NORTHWOOD BINFIELD

Binfield were the first to show after the break as George Winser broke forward from the back before unleashing a longrange attempt which failed to trouble McCorkell. But following a tactical change with Otote and Dunbar Bonnie swapping flanks, Northwood began to get on top - Dunbar-Bonnie having a shot deflected behind after good work from Anokye-Boadi while the latter saw a shot gathered by Rackley-Hayes after the Moles defence failed to clear a

Woods kept the pressure on the Binfield rearguard with Tingey's throw into the box finding the head of Alexander-Greenaway whose stooping header drifted wide of the far post before Rackley-Hayes produced another fine

save to keep out Williams' low shot with Liam Campbell executing a timely block to keep out Dunbar-Bonnie's follow-up attempt.

Northwood made a change on 79 minutes as Otote made way for Jaden Newman with Dunbar-Bonnie resuming his position on the left and the latter was involved again as he flicked a header wide from another accurately delivered throw from Tingey.

However, Binfield reminded Northwood of their threat as a quick counter-attack saw McCorkell called into action as he dealt with a shot from Finn Harvey.

Woods made another change on 84 minutes as Sam Jenkins replaced Anokye-Boadi in an attacking role and the lively substitute was quickly into the action as he was played into the box by Williams with his shot from an acute angle rebounding off the near upright.

Both sides were doing their utmost to settle the tie before extra-time, Woods scrambling clear after a goalmouth melee with play immediately switching to the other end with Racklev-Haves leaving his area to prevent Williams from breaking through.

However, with a minute of stoppage time played. Woods worked the ball up to Williams once again on the edge of the box and as the advancing Rackley-Hayes looked to smother the danger

the striker checked back to play the ball into the path of Carl Stewart who kept his composure to sweep the ball home to send players and supporters into delirium with Northwood booking a home appointment with Crav Vallev Paper Mills in the next round..



WOODS BOW OUT OF FA TROPHY

orthwood's trip to the Kent coast ended in disappointment as they exited the Trophy at the first hurdle on a sweltering afternoon at the Southwood Stadium.

Following a tortuous journey and a delayed kick-off due to the match officials also being caught up in heavy traffic, Woods took to the 3G pitch with Harry McCorkell reinstated to the midfield as Luke Brophy reverted to the bench, the only change from the team which started Tuesday's F.A. Cup replay success over Binfield.

Woods were on the back foot from the start as Tijan Jadama went close before goalkeeper Andrew McCorkell kept out a close-range attempt from Bodi Anidugbe while experienced striker Joe Taylor crashed a shot against the crossbar.

And things were made considerably more difficult for the visitors as they lost influential skipper Luke Tingey to injury with only ten minutes on the clock with Romario Jonas his replacement.

Northwood barely had time to readjust as the lively Benni Bioletti sent over a cross which was converted by Medy Elito at the far post to give the Rams the lead on 13 minutes. And the hosts threatened

further goals as 'keeper McCorkell produced a couple for fine saves to keep out Alfie Paxman and Taylor.

Northwood gradually found their feet as Kofi Anokve-Boadi cut in from the right flank before shooting narrowly over. And Harry Gallagher went close to adding to his recent goal tally after he was picked out by Teddy Stacey's deep far cross as the Rams failed to clear their lines from a Jonas throw into the box, the defender's shot curling over the far stanchion.

Woods continued to probe as Deago Dunbar-Bonnie released Osaretin Otote whose low cross almost reached the onrushing Anokye-Boadi but was diverted behind by a covering defender.

But having forced a couple of corners, Woods then had some more defending to do as Taylor thought he had increased his side's lead as he poked the ball beyond McCorkell only to see the covering Stacey hook the ball off the line.

However, having done well to keep themselves in the contest, Northwood's hopes were dashed as they conceded two goals before the half-time break - goalkeeper Tom Hadler's long kick picking out Jadama who got beyond Stacey and delivered an emphatic

finish on 41 minutes before Mike West broke through the middle of the Woods' defence to make it 3-0 in the second minute of added time.

Northwood remained unchanged for the second period and the Rams almost compounded the visitor's misery as possession was squandered in the middle of the park enabling Bioletti to surge forward with his initial shot being kept out by McCorkell before his followup effort rebounded off the upright.

To their credit. Woods refused to throw in the towel, and they proceeded to play with purpose and moving the ball around well as they looked to retrieve something from the game - Dan Williams with a couple of long-range attempts.

Northwood made a change just before the hour as Harry McCorkell made way for Sam Jenkins to freshen up the midfield. But the Rams continued to threaten on the break as McCorkell denied Taylor once again before Jonas cleared a goal-bound effort from Jadama.

Left-back Brophy was added to the fray in place of Otote on 69 minutes with Dunbar-Bonnie pushing on and Woods continued to enjoy plenty of possession without truly threatening - Jenkins' audacious long-range attempt dropping wide after spotting Hadler off his line while Dunbar-Bonnie almost latched onto a searching cross from Brophy who had a shot of his own from distance which found the side-netting.

However, Northwood were unable to find the consolation which their second half performance deserved with Hadler's parrying of a Gallagher free kick with Jenkins almost latching onto the rebound, the closest the visitors came before the curtain closed on Woods' F.A. Trophy hopes for another year.

INTRODUCING **OUR VISITORS...**

MARLOW





reat Marlow Football Club was formed in November 1870 and so began the history of one of the oldest clubs in the country. In the last century the Club was a major force in the game and as one of the original entrants in the first F.A Cup competition in 1871/72 contributed a share of the £25 that bought the first trophy. In the very first year of the competition a certain Cuthbert Ottaway turned out for Marlow and just a year later he was to captain the national side against Scotland in the first ever officially recognised international match.

Marlow have the unique distinction of being the only club to have applied for entry to every competition since its inception although they were unable to compete once in the 1910/11 season. In 1882 they reached the semi-finals where they lost out to eventual winners Old Etonians 0-5 at the Oval. Two Amateur Cup semi-finals and a host of Berks & Bucks Senior Cup wins were among many honours won in this golden era. In 1894 Marlow rejected the opportunity to join the newly-formed Southern League in order to retain their amateur status and allowed Tottenham Hotspur to begin their climb to the top flight by taking their place.

The Club's ground until 1919 was Crown Meadow, now the Rilev Recreational Ground. An enforced move to the Star Meadow (which was unfenced) and the worsening financial situation resulted in the need to play in a more local competition than the Great Western Suburban League and Marlow joined the Reading and District League. This was a dark period for the Club and worse was to come when the Club's long-serving Honorary Secretary Alfred Davis. who had held office at the Club since 1891, died in 1924. It was decided that a fitting memorial to him would

be to provide a permanent home for Marlow F.C. An appeal proved to be very successful and the "Alfred Davis Memorial Ground" saw its first game in 1928. The picturesque grandstand dates from 1930's and followed the establishment of an Association who issued Share Certificates in connection with a Building Fund and was built to celebrate the Club's revival and the Spartan League Division Two championship.

Apart from a war-time break Marlow continued in the Spartan League until 1965 when entry was gained to the Athenian League Division Two. Promotion to Division One was secured in season 1970/71. Here Marlow remained until 1984 when they joined the Isthmian League. Having finished bottom of Division Two in 1985 the appointment of Mike Keen as Manager heralded a rapid rise in status. Promotion to Division One came the very next season and





then after just one season in Division One the championship was won and promotion to the Premier Division.

Here Marlow found things much tougher and Christmas arrived without a win and from a position at the foot of the table, a late season Houdini act saw them escape and secure their new-found status. When Keen left his assistant Dave Russell took over and good times returned. The Berks & Bucks Senior Cup was won for the first time with a victory over local rivals Wycombe Wanderers and the FA Cup First Round was reached, for the first time that century, with an away tie at West Bromwich Albion the reward. Season 1992/93 saw even more FA Cup success with progression this time to the Third Round and a tie with Tottenham Hotspur that was switched to White Hart Lane where almost 27,000 saw the Blues give a very creditable performance. The Diadora (Isthmian) League Cup was won to finish the season on a high note.

1993/94 must rate as the most successful ever with Marlow again reaching the First Round of the FA Cup where a 0-2 home defeat against Plymouth Argyle was televised, while in the league a highest-ever position of third was achieved. The Berks & Bucks Senior Cup was won again to round off a highly memorable season.

At the end of that season Russell left for Slough Town and took several players with him. A new squad and slow start left a lot to do in the league and relegation followed. In the F. Cup things were very different. The First Round saw Division Two table-toppers Oxford United defeated 2-0 at Oak Tree Road. After another home victory over Trophy holder's Woking secured a place in the Third Round at Swindon Town, who had been in the Premier League the season before, where the home side were grateful to progress by a 2-0 scoreline.

Season 1995/96 saw a finish in in eighth spot but the following season resulted in relegation. Graham Pritchard and Derek Sweetman took over for 1998/99 and provided a period of stability which saw finishes in mid-table. League restructuring saw them move from Division Two to the newly-formed Division One North for season 2002/03 where an 11th place finish was achieved. In 2003/04, Marlow were moved yet again to Division One South.

The reorganisation of the nonleague game saw them in different surroundings for the fourth time in four seasons with entry into The Southern League, Western Division for season 2004/05 and a finish in 13th spot. Kevin Stone had moved into the manager's seat towards the end of the season and enjoyed a great run. 2005/06 and in the same league and in more familiar surroundings seemed to suit the side and for most of the season they hovered around the play-off positions and eventually finished in 6th spot. A play-off spot was confirmed on the final day of the season and although a 1-2 defeat at Brackley Town followed the Club were pleased with the progress. Season 2006/07 in the South & West Division saw a successful run of results promise another play-off berth but a last day defeat at Winchester City saw them fall just short whilst season 2007/08 was a little more disappointing with some very good results failing to offset a poor run around February/March with a final finish just outside the play-offs following.

Season 2008/09 saw the Club moved vet again into the Midland Division and another inconsistent season followed finishing with a defeat to Windsor & Eton in the final of the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup at M.K Dons stadium. The following two seasons saw some good results against the top sides but indifferent ones against the lower teams and ended with mid-table finishes even though a bright start in 2010/11 saw them briefly at the top of the table, 2011/12 did not start at all badly but soon developed into one where victories were very hard to come by and following a string of poor results long-standing manager Stone left just after Christmas. Assistant Steve Croxford took over and although performances and results improved

towards the end it was not enough to avoid relegation.

Season 2012/13 found Marlow in in the Uhlsport Hellenic League with a new management team headed by Mark Bartley eager to recapture some of the glories of the past and this they did. winning the league championship by a 16 point margin and scoring 123 goals in 36 games to return to the Southern League where the next two seasons saw them consolidate with finishes in and 17th and 11th positions respectively.

For 2015/16 Marlow were moved once again - to the South & West division - which again meant increased travelling and the loss of some key players and several local derbies. making life much more difficult and a mid-table finish was achieved. A return to the Central Division for 2016/17 aided a finish in 4th place (on goal difference) and achieved a play-off place, with third-placed Barton Rovers running out 2-0 victors at their ground. Season 2017/18 saw a mid-table finish followed by a return to the Isthmian League after a lengthy absence to take a place in the newlyformed South-Central division with a resultant reduction in travelling which is most welcome. Here generally good results saw them maintain a position near the top of the table throughout the season and qualify for the playoffs where they lost out in the semifinal to eventual winners Cheshunt 1-2 on their around.

Back "home" the Blues have settled in and despite the curtailment of the next two seasons retained the core of players and added some quality for 2021/2022 - a season that saw an excellent start and a position at or near the top of the table throughout, but a dismal run of results in the final months, lost the early momentum.

Last season The Blues went mightily close to promotion - losing to a lastgasp goal in their play-off semi-final against Hanworth Villa - but this young, hungry group - who have another year's experience under their belt - are well placed to challenge once again this term.

Now in his twelfth season at the helm having joined Marlow from Reading Town in June 2012, Mark Bartley, xx, played at Haves, Slough Town, Burnham and Thame United before taking over as caretaker-manager at Reading Town in the latter part of season 2010/11 who he guided to safety before leading them to a successful season with a young squad the following campaign.

After joining Marlow, he led them to the Hellenic Premier Division title in his first season at the Alfred Davis Memorial Ground.




